The Health, Human Services, and Public Safety Committee convened on March 18, 2025, to consider CR-018-2025, which was introduced and referred to the committee on March 11, 2025.

CR-018-2025, Sponsored by Council Member Harrison, extends the Holistic & Sustainable Solutions for Senior Citizens Task Force's reporting timeline, which was established by CR-053-2024, and expands the membership by adding representatives from the Department of Public Works & Transportation, Adventist HealthCare, MedStar Southern Maryland Hospital Center, and University of Maryland Capital Region Medical Center.

The Task Force would now be authorized to present a final report and a summary of its findings to the County Council on or before February 28, 2026.

David Noto, Legislative Budget and Policy Analyst provided a Policy Analysis and Fiscal Impact Statement, indicating no direct impact on expenditures and revenues.

Draft two was presented, with Luminis Health added for consideration as a member of the Task Force. Chair Fisher motioned to approve the amendment, which Council Member Watson seconded. The motion passed 3-0.

Sakinda Skinner, Council Liaison, Office of the Acting County Executive, expressed support for CR-018-2025.

The Office of Law finds it in proper legislative form and sees no legal impediment to its adoption.

The Health, Human Services, and Public Safety Committee voted favorable as amended 4-0 on CR-018-2025.
