Providing NEW Experiences on Paved Surface Trails (PST)

Installation of dog waste stations (Tanglewood, Watkins, Hillantrae, Henson Creek)

- Creating Innovative trail experiences
 - Acquired (6) new solar powered radar activated warning signs for blind spots and slick spots on trails
 - Acquired new Convex mirrors to aid with blind spots on trails
 - Added 14 bike repair stations (need more details)
- Repaired 26 bridges and boardwalk
- Renovated/resurfaced 27,005 linear feet (5.11 miles) of trail

- Grand Opening for the NEW Marlow Heights Community Center expected Spring 2025
- Construction has begun on the NEW Good Luck Community Center
- Completed 12 playgrounds
- Installed NEW turf field at Sports and Learning
- Completed irrigation systems at Landover Hills and Glenarden Community Centers

Completed Lake Arbor Park Master Plan

- Implemented partnership with Casey Trees to increase tree canopy

 - Partnering on Urban Trees Grant to implement the afforestation plan at Lake Arbor Park
- Adding new amenities

 - Open play and flexible green space areas
 - Parking, comfort station, maintenance facility

- and 873 participated in S.T.E.A.M. related camps
