### **ZONING BILL**

AN ORDINANCE concerning

#### Vendors

For the purpose of prohibiting vendors from operating on private property without a temporary permit.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

Section 27-261,

The Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland,

being also

SUBTITLE 27. ZONING.

The Prince George's County Code

(1995 Edition, 1996 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 27-261 of the Zoning Ordinance of

Prince George's County, Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County

Code, be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

## Subdivision 3. Temporary Permits.

Sec. 27-261. Specific temporary uses.

(p) Vendors

(1) A temporary permit shall be issued for any vendors, except those defined in

Subtitle 5, Division 12 of this Code in accordance with the following:

(A) The use shall not be operated on private property;

(B) The permit shall be valid for not more than one (1) day per quarter year;

(C) No permit shall be issued for such use after January 1, 1999.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect forty-

five (45) calendar days after its adoption.
