WHERE	AS, the Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World	
War I Army Cap	tain Robert L. Queissner of the 5th Ohio Infantry who had two sons serving on	
the front line in E	Europe; and	
WHERE	AS, the Blue Star Service Banner quickly became the unofficial symbol of a	
child in the servi	ce, permitting the nation to know of those who were giving so much for liberty;	
and		
WHEREAS, the Blue Star Service Banner was rekindled to promote the spirit of pride in		
our military men and women, following the horrific terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001; and		
WHEREA	AS, today, the Blue Star Service Banner is a national campaign to recognize the	
sacrifices of Ame	erica's veterans, including the National Guard and Reserves who are serving in	
the war on terrori	ism through Operations Enduring Freedom, Noble Eagle, and Iraqi Freedom;	
and		
WHERE	AS, local, state and federal governments and corporate America have been asked	
to enhance public	e recognition of those serving on active duty; and	
WHERE	AS, House Concurrent Resolution 109 has been offered in the United States	
Congress, to expr	ress the sense of the Congress regarding the Blue Star Service Banner; and	
WHERE	AS, military and civilian personnel assigned to Andrews Air Force Base and	

Fort George G. Meade and their families are primary contributors to the livelihood of Prince George's County and to the preservation of our national security and public safety; and

WHEREAS, Prince George's County is home to more than 75,445 military veterans; and WHEREAS, many employees of Prince George's County and employee-family members have been called to active duty with the National Guard and Reserves.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that a Blue Star Service Flag be flown on or near the principal county administration buildings to honor the residents of Prince George's County called to active duty from National Guard and Reserve components;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the display of the Blue Star Service Flag be an expression of the citizens of Prince George's County of their recognition of the sacrifices of all men and women, serving in harm's way in the armed forces of the United States;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the display of the Blue Star Service Flag be in a manner designed to ensure visibility to the public, and as designated by all protocols used in displaying national flags;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Blue Star Service Flag be flown until such time that hostilities on the war on terrorism and in Iraq and Afghanistan have ceased as determined by the United States Congress.
