In response to the recent increase in criminal activity in this and neighboring counties the County Council with the assistance of local law enforcement must take more aggressive measures to fight the increase in criminal activity in the County. A large portion of criminal activity in the County is perpetrated by individuals under the age of 18. This bill is needed to fight the County's increase in juvenile criminal activity in its commercial zones. The County's authority to enact this bill is derived from its police

powers delegated under Md. Local Government Code Ann. § 10-206.
