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### REPORT:

Committee Vote: Favorable 5-0 (In favor: Chair Oriadha, Council Members Blegay, Hawkins, Adams-Stafford, and Watson).

The Education and Workforce Development Committee convened on June 30, 2025, to consider CR-076-2025. The Resolution, sponsored by CMs Hawkins, Watson, Burroughs, Blegay, Olson, Harrison, Dernoga, Ivey, and Adams-Stafford, was introduced and referred to the EWD Committee on June 17, 2025

The Resolution calls on the Prince George's County Board of Education and Prince George's County Public Schools to initiate an audit to ensure school system compliance with State and local mandated overdose-reversing medication requirements in schools. The Resolution recommends that the audit begin at the start of the 2025-2026 school year and end in January 2026.

The Office of Law reviewed the resolution and found it to be in proper legislative form with no impediments to its adoption.

David Noto, the policy analyst who wrote the fiscal impact statement, found that there should be no anticipated direct fiscal impact to county finances as the State has set aside some money for medication and training. The indirect fiscal impact is likely favorable.

On June 30, 2025, the Education and Workforce Development Committee voted favorable 5-0.
