This resolution will provide for supplemental appropriation of additional grant funds in the amount of \$2,713,050 for fiscal year 1997 - 1998 which will allow a number of agencies to increase their grant expenditures up to the actual amount awarded.

A. The Police Department will receive an additional \$117,000 from Federal agencies for two new programs and for a previously approved grant. (pp 2)
