For the purpose	of recommending the continuous engagement of the citizens of Prince George's	
County to further	r develop a seamless service delivery system for homeless residents of the	
County.		
WHEREAS	S, the success of this effort will result in strengthened communities and a	
subsequent reduc	ction in the occurrence of homelessness; and	
WHEREAS	S, homelessness is a symptom of larger social and economic issues that exist in	
communities aro	und the country; and	
WHEREAS, the County's increased activity around economic development and		
revitalization wil	ll, as a natural outcome, empower and strengthen communities as they address	
the symptoms of	social and economic issues such as homelessness; and	
WHEREAS	S, the County's Homeless Services Partnership, the County Executive's advisory	
board on homeless issues, has shown leadership in the effort to improve services to residents		
experiencing hor	nelessness using the Continuum of Care model; and	
WHEREAS	S, one of the fundamental principles guiding the recommendations of the County	
Executive's Hon	neless Services Task Force was the County's on-going commitment to increase	
the coordination,	collaboration and communication with others in the community who share the	
County's commi	tment to serving the poor and economically disadvantaged; and	

WHEREAS, recommendations in the 1998 report of the County Executive's Homeless Services Task Force have, among other results, yielded an outcome of marked improvement in

the integration of services among numerous County agencies, community-based organizations and faith-based service providers; and

WHEREAS, the County's Continuum of Care service providers have made substantial progress toward the common goal of creating a seamless homeless service delivery system that includes prevention, outreach, emergency shelter, transitional housing, permanent housing with services and is augmented with an array of supportive services; and

WHEREAS, it has been demonstrated that through improved communication, coordination and collaboration the Prince George's County Continuum of Care has benefited from the work of committed advocates from across the County and has realized an overall 38% increase in homeless services spending over the past four years; and

WHEREAS, because of increased spending, improved project designs have resulted in enhanced on-site services such as comprehensive case management, employment assistance, substance abuse counseling, life skills training and housing placement assistance for persons residing in emergency shelters; and

WHEREAS, over the last five years advocates around the country have made substantial progress in educating Congress and the public about the need for additional resources for addressing the needs of homeless people; and

WHEREAS, new grant awards supporting an increased homeless services capacity have come from at least ten federal, state and local funding sources; and

WHEREAS, the County agencies listed below have been involved with either the funding or the provision of services to the Continuum of Care for residents experiencing homelessness:

- λ The Department of Social Services
- λ The Department of Housing and Community Development
- λ The Office of Central Services
- λ The Department of Family Services
- λ The Health Department
- λ The Fire Department
- The Department of Environmental Resources
- λ The Police Department
 - λ The Public School System
 - The Department of Public Works and Transportation; and

WHEREAS, despite the determined efforts of all stakeholders to address the root causes of homelessness, it must be acknowledged that there are ongoing goals to be accomplished to insure social and economic stability for all citizens of Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive joins with the Council in this resolution to emphasize the County's commitment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that County agencies are urged to continue to engage the citizens of the County in strengthening communities to address the causes of homelessness through ongoing and increased communication, coordination and collaboration. Such communication, coordination and collaboration shall, at a minimum, result in the following outcomes:

- λ A reduction in the occurrence of homelessness; and
- A comprehensive, five-year strategic plan to address increased and improved services to residents of Prince George's County experiencing homelessness; and
- λ The identification of additional financial resources; and
- Further improvement in the integration of mainstream resources into the Continuum of Care for homeless people in Prince George's County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that strategies and action steps included in the comprehensive five-year plan, shall become part of the County's FY 2001-2005 Consolidated Plan submission to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. In addition, progress made toward the accomplishment of these strategies and actions steps shall be reported on annually by The Homeless Services Partnership, which is the County Executive's advisory board on homeless issues. This annual report shall be presented in writing to the County Executive and the County Council during the month of August of each year.
