EXPLANATION OF GRANT ADJUSTMENTS

HEALTH DEPARTMENT

The Health Department received additional funding for several existing grant programs totaling (\$245,352) and four new FY2002 grants totaling (\$1.3 million). A \$54,000 FY2001 award was received for the RYAN White HIV/AIDS program. The four new grants are 1) Healthline Media (\$350,000), 2) Safe Motherhood (\$937,545), 3) Arbovirus Surveillance (\$10,000) and 4) Hepatitis C Surveillance (\$52,749). The Healthline Media Grant will provide information, referral and appointment services for uninsured and underinsured pregnant women and their children. Safe Motherhood will provide comprehensive perinatal services to Prince George's County residents who are uninsured through a contractual arrangement with a community based, private group of pre-natal and family planning providers. Arbovirus Surveillance will provide dead bird pick-up services pertaining to the West Nile Virus. The Hepatitis C grant will investigate findings related to Hepatitis C. In addition, the Ryan White HIV/AIDS supplemental grant was received.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Police Department has received funding for two new grants, the Anti-Money Laundering Grant (\$229,032) and Street and Commercial Robbery Abatement Grant (\$101,837). The Department of Justice is anticipated to provide funds to establish an anti-money laundering unit and the Maryland Department of State Police will support crime prevention efforts.

HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Additional grant funding for FY2001 has been awarded for the Rental Allowance Program.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

New grant funding has been awarded from the National Safe Kids Campaign to support car seat safety checks (\$1,000) and (\$2,000) have been given for the activities of the International Walk to School Day. Unanticipated grant awards in the amount of \$50,000 is also being given to the Fire Department to cover the cost of any minor grants throughout the current fiscal year.

SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT

The Sheriff's Department is being awarded a \$51,601 Information and Technology grant from the state to purchase and install computer equipment for the purpose of implementing a tracking system for firearm seizures and recoveries.

DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES

A grant (Project Impact - \$315,000) is being received for mitigation and prevention in some of the County's environmental disaster-prone areas that was previously programmed for administration by the Fire Department.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

The Department of Social Services has received a new federally-funded grant for Adoption Mediation.
