5	Sec. 2-231.09. Definition.
6	(a) Contractor means any business or person having a written contract with the County
7	as defined by Sec. 10A-101(a)(12) of the Prince George's County Code.
8	Sec. 2-231.10. Prohibition.
9	During the performance of any contract, no Contractor, through its employees or agents,
10	shall engage in human sex trafficking or human labor trafficking as defined by Section 14-191,
11	Subtitle 14 of The Prince George's County Code.
12	Sec. 2-231.11. Filing a Complaint.
13	(a) Filing Complaints. If any person believes that a Contractor or a Contractor's employees
14	or agents does not comply with the prohibitions against human sex trafficking and human labor
15	trafficking set forth in Sec. 14-191, Subtitle 14, of The Prince George's County Code, they may
16	file a complaint with the Office of Human Rights.
17	(b) Complaint Requirement. A complaint under this Section must:
18	(1) be filed;
19	(2) include the particulars of the alleged violation, the name and address of the
20	Contractor alleged to have committed the violation as set forth in Sec. 14-191, Subtitle 14, of the
21	Prince George's County Code, and
22	(3) any other information required by the Office of Human Rights.
23	(c) Dismissal. If after an investigation by the Office of Human Rights, the Contractor is
24	found to have not been in violation of the prohibitions against human sex trafficking and human
25	labor trafficking in, the Office of Human Rights must dismiss the complaint and mail copies of
26	its findings to the Respondent-Contractor, the Complainant, and the Office of Procurement.
27	(d) Non-Compliance Penalty. If after an investigation by the Office of Human Rights, the
28	Contractor is found to be in violation of the prohibition against human sex trafficking and human
29	labor trafficking as set forth in Sec. 14-191, Subtitle 14, the Office of Human Rights shall refer
30	this decision to the Office of Procurement, whereby the Office of Procurement shall initiate
31	suspension and debarment proceedings pursuant to Sec. 10A-148 and consider any other relief

1	available to the Office of Procurement, including but not limited to, contract termination and										
2	breach of contract damages.										
3	(e) Criminal Prosecution. An investigation or finding made by the Office of Human Rights										
4	under this Section is not intended to preclude a criminal investigation or criminal prosecution by										
5	the State's Attorney's Office or any law enforcement agency.

16	Subtitle 14, of the Prince George's County Code, has been found to have violated the prohibition										
17	against human sex trafficking and human labor trafficking.										
18	(17) Been convicted of, plead nolo contendere, or been sentenced pursuant to the Child										
19	Sex Trafficking Screening and Services Act, the Anti-Exploitation Act of 2019, Human										
20	Trafficking & Prostitution Offenses 2019, or other comparable State, Federal, U.S. Territory,										
21	or District of Columbia statute for violation of criminal laws prohibiting human labor										
22	trafficking or human sex trafficking.										
23	(18) Been found in violation of the wage and hours requirements Maryland Annotated										
24	Code, Labor and Employment Code §§ 3-401, et seq.

26	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby										
27	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,										
28	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of										
29	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining										
30	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this										
31	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such										

1	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,											
2	or section.											
3	SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on forty-five (4)											
4	calendar days after it becomes law.
