EXECUTIVE ORDER

No. 23 -2012

WHEREAS, there is a need to provide governmental services in the most efficient and cost effective manner; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed appropriate to rename the Office of Information Technology and Communications to the Office of Information Technology; and

WHEREAS, this name change will more accurately reflect the functions of the Office; and

WHEREAS, Section 503 of the Prince George’s County Charter provides that the County Executive may propose changes to the organization of the Executive branch, including the establishment or abolition of agencies, and the assignment of functions, powers and duties among agencies, which proposals shall be set forth in Executive Orders in statutory form and be submitted to the County Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

SECTION 1. The Schedule of Legislation of the Charter for Prince George’s County, Maryland, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

SCHEDULE OF LEGISLATION

* * * * *

Section 9. Office of Information Technology [and Communications].

There shall be an Office of Information Technology [and Communications] headed by the Director of Information Technology [and Communications]. The Director shall be responsible for information management and technology within the County government and for maintaining an effective and efficient information and communications system, including coordination with the Office of Homeland Security to provide maintenance and support for public safety and emergency communication systems. The Director shall also be responsible for the administration of the Cable Television Commission of the County.

SECTION 2. This Order shall be submitted to the County Council pursuant to Section 503 of the Prince George's County Charter and, thereafter, shall become effective sixty (60) calendar days after such submission unless disapproved by a majority vote of the full Council.
