## LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

## PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE REPORT

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0-0 (In favor: Council Members Casula,

Fletcher, MacKinnon, Mills and Wineland).

Staff explained that this legislation prohibits the keeping of "junked vehicles", which is defined on page 1 of Attachment A, on any property, except in an enclosed garage. Certain exemptions are listed on page 2, and the legislation provides procedures for impoundment of the vehicles.

There were no comments received regarding this resolution.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Pursuant to Article 28, Section 8-112.1 of the Maryland Annotated Code, municipalities within the Maryland-Washington Metropolitan District are permitted to enact certain ordinances affecting parking in residential and commercial zones subject to the approval of the District Council. The proposed City of New Carrollton ordinance proposes definitions and restrictions pertaining to the storage of junked motor vehicles on residential property which are not in conflict with and are at least as restrictive as County laws.
