Pursuant to the provisions of Article 28 of the Annotated Code of Maryland and the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the District Council, and the Prince George's County Planning Board of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, joint public hearing to receive testimony regarding the preliminary plan generally located within part of Planning Area 70 in accordance with the recommendations of the *Preliminary Glenn Dale-Seabrook-Lanham & Vicinity Sector Plan and Proposed Sectional Map Amendment (SMA)*. The sector plan area is generally bounded by Good Luck Road, Cipriano Road, and Greenbelt Road (MD 193) to the north; Glenn Dale Boulevard (MD 193), Daisy Lane, Hillmeade Road, Annapolis Road (MD 450), and Enterprise Road (MD193) to the east; John Hanson Highway (US 50) to the south; the Capital Beltway (I-95/I-495) to the west; and also includes the Prince George's Sports Center Property off Good Luck Road.
