(5) [No tree larger than six (6) inches in diameter and thirty (30) feet in height shall be cut down without the written permission of the grantee or its authorized representative; except, that clearing such land for site improvement, road construction or removing trees for the purpose of protecting utility lines and to eliminate a hazard to persons or property may be exercised without prior permission if no more than twenty (20) such trees are to be cut.] The property is in conformance with all applicable provisions of Division 2 of Subtitle 25 and/or an approved Tree Conservation Plan.

BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, subparagraph, subsection, or section.
