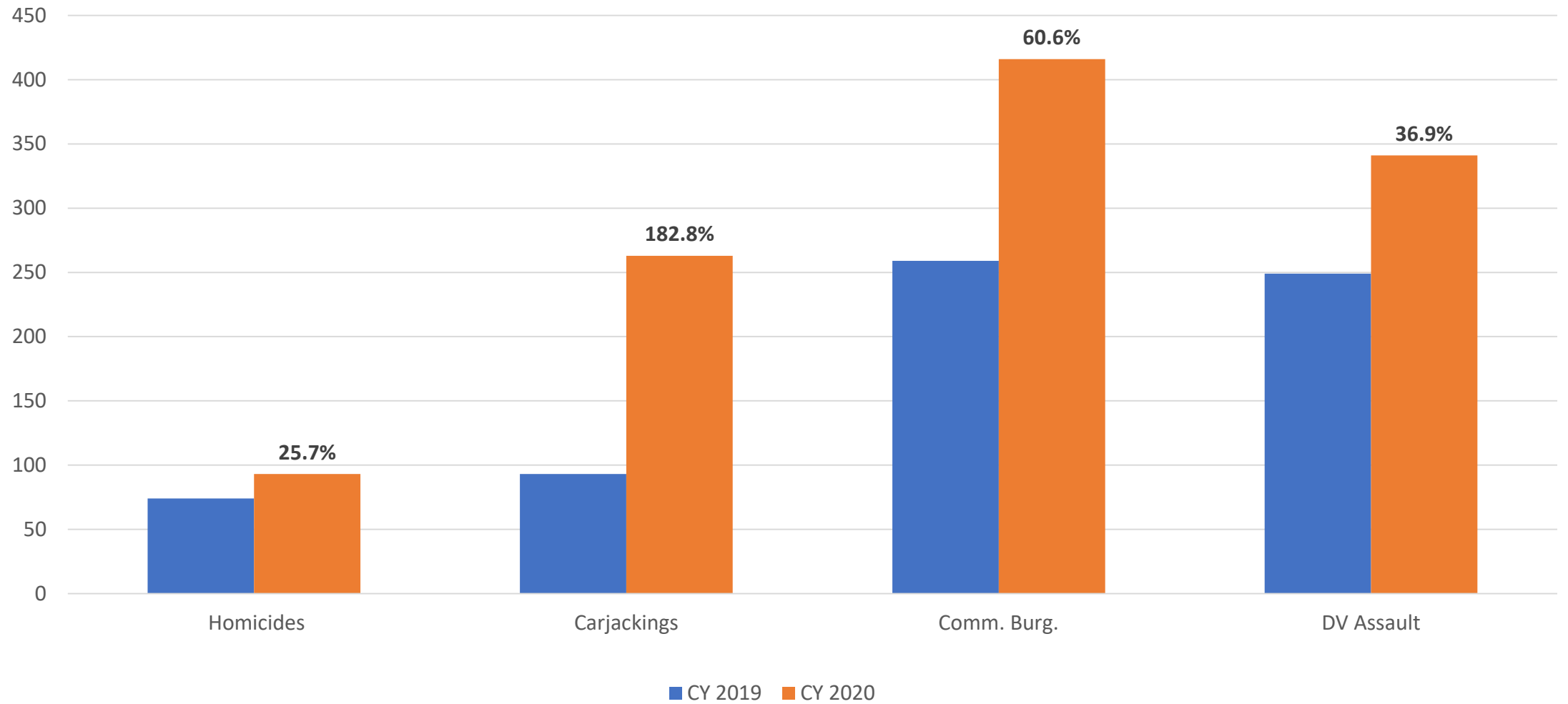

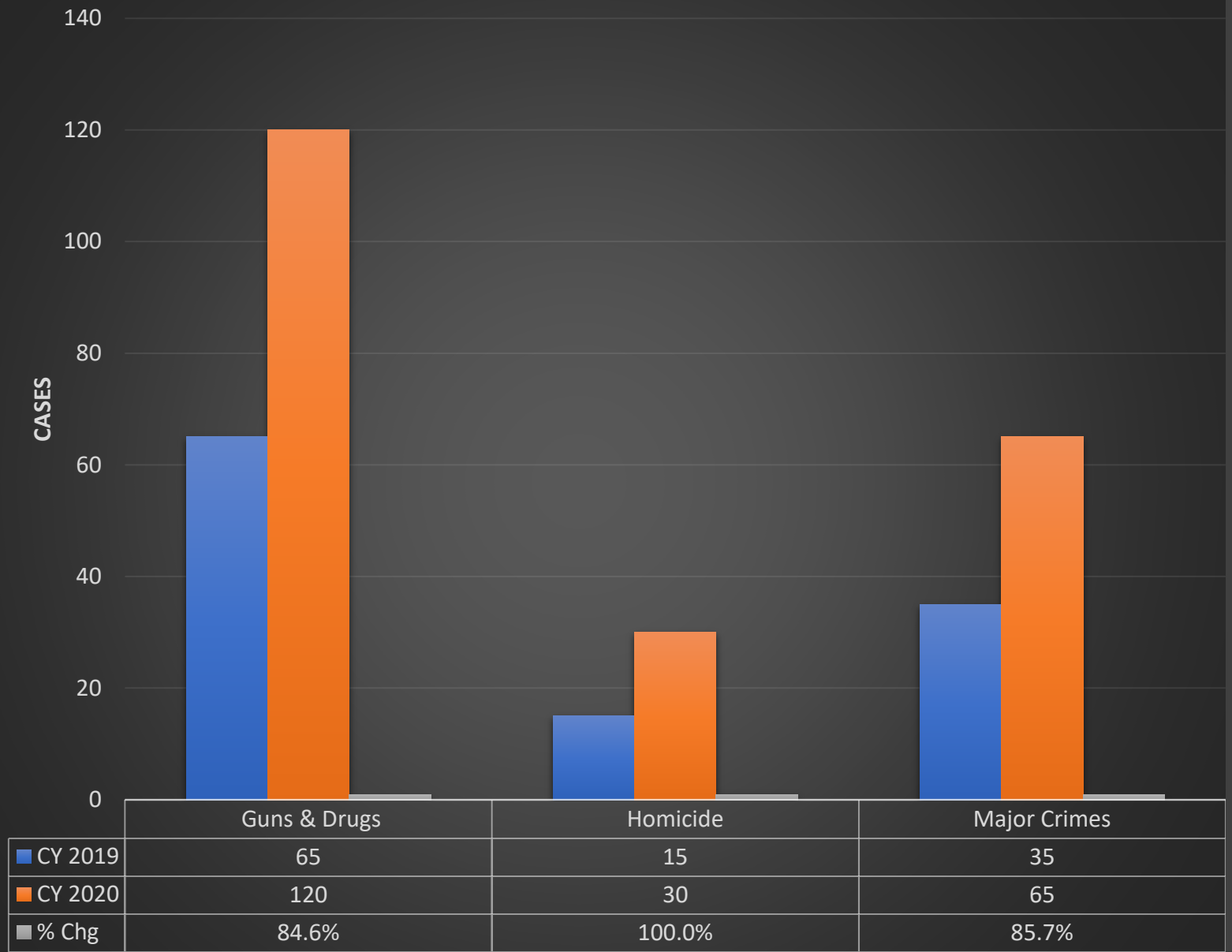

Increases in Crime

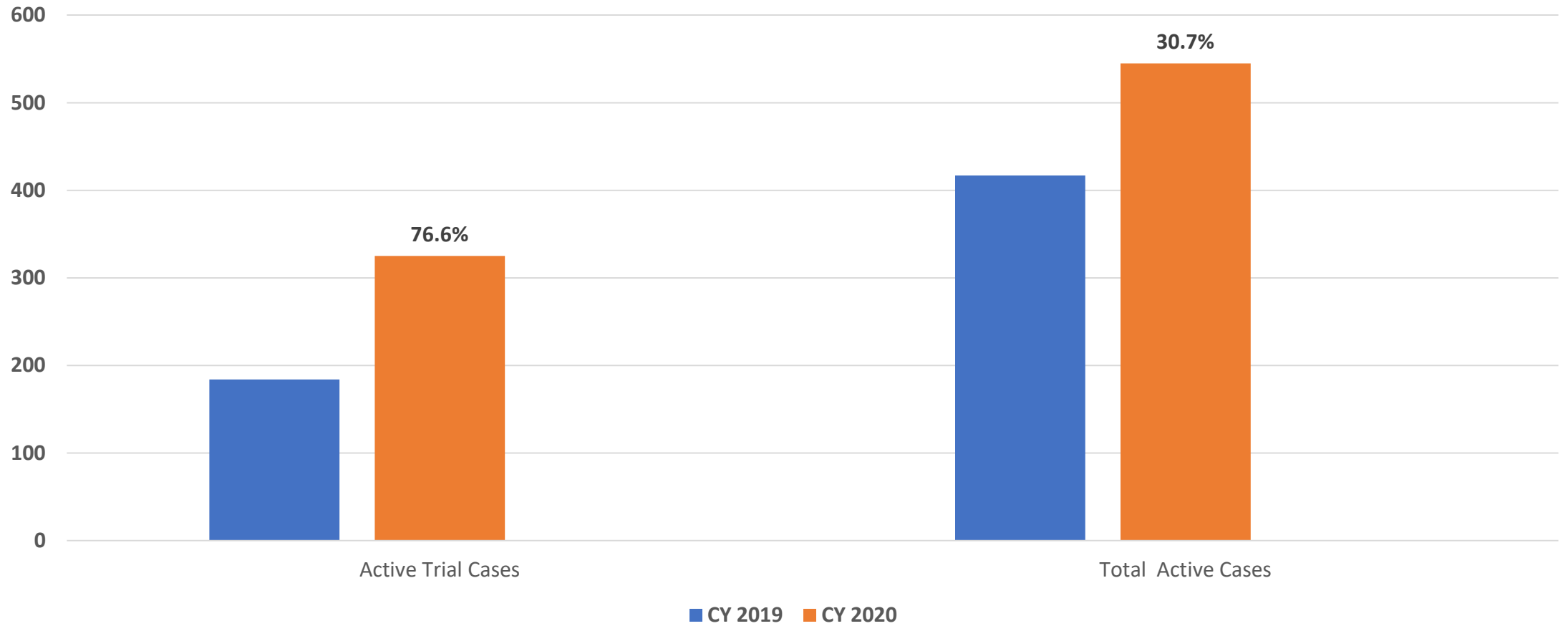


ASA Average Trial Caseload Comparison by Unit

Circuit Court Backlog

- Currently there are approximately 1800 pending jury trials in Circuit Court.
- As caseloads increase, the Court will be under pressure to reduce the backlog as quickly as possible once jury trials resume. It is unlikely that continuances will be granted due to the Constitutional issues caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The SAO is actively pursuing ways to resolve as many cases as possible. It is difficult to resolve cases via plea because many of the defendants are facing significant periods of incarceration and defense attorneys are reluctant to enter pleas without knowing that the State can produce witnesses at trial.
- While the Grand Jury was suspended from October to March over 400 criminal informations (CI) have been filed. Cases continue to accumulate.

Impact of Body Camera Roll Out

- The body camera deployment will create the need to expand the SAO digital discovery unit.
- In addition to the need for staff, the need for additional storage capabilities will be required. Even with the benefit of the Unified Digital Evidence (UDE), once the body camera footage is uploaded the footage will need to be reviewed, redacted, and stored for production to the defense counsel.
- Our Demonstrative Evidence Unit estimates that an hour of body camera footage requires approximately 1.7GB of space. Therefore 20,000 hours of footage will require 34,000 gigabytes or 34 TB terabytes of space.

- Fringe: \$151,500
- Operating: \$24,000
- Total Cost: \$650,500
