For the purpose of establishing a fund to compensate the owners of structures that are			
condemned by the County due to the failure of subsurface soils.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,			
Maryland, that Sections 10-283, 10-284, and 10-285 of the Prince George's County Code be and			
the same are hereby added:			
SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.			
DIVISION 16. CONDEMNED HOUSING COMPENSATION FUND.			
Sec. 10-283. Establishment of Condemned Housing Compensation Fund.			
(a) There is hereby established the Condemned Housing Compensation Fund for the			
purpose of providing financial assistance to eligible owner-occupants of single-family residential			
structures for the purchase of single-family residential properties that have been condemned by			
the County due to the failure or movement of unsuitable subsurface soils. All funds made			
available for the purposes of this Division shall constitute a special fund of the County and all			
such funds shall be paid into or out of or otherwise expended from such special fund.			

- (b) Commencing with the submission of the Fiscal Year 2001-2002 County expense and capital budgets, and on at least an annual basis thereafter, the County Executive shall recommend to the County Council for approval, a proposed method of financing the Fund, taking into account all appropriate alternative methods of financing the fund, including the following methods:
 - (1) The issuance of general obligation bonds;
 - (2) The use of funds from current expense budget appropriations; or
- (3) The use of funds derived from Federal or State grants made available to the County for financing the purchase of condemned structures.

Sec. 10-284. Eligibility requirements for the purchase of condemned property.

- (a) In addition to such requirements and conditions as are established under the regulations required to be prepared and approved under Section 10-285, no purchase authorized herein shall be made unless:
 - (1) The subject property is improved by a single-family residential structure;
- (2) The Director of the Department of Environmental Resources has issued a written order condemning the subject property as unsafe for human habitation due to the failure or movement of unstable subsurface soils;
- (3) The subject property was occupied by the owner immediately prior to the property being condemned as unfit for human habitation; and
- (4) Funds have been appropriated to the Fund in an amount sufficient to purchase the subject property.

Sec. 10-285. Administration and regulations.

- (a) The County Executive is hereby empowered and authorized to purchase condemned property under the provisions of this Division and the approved regulations.
- (b) All purchases of condemned property made by the County Executive for the purposes set forth under this Division shall be made out of the Condemned Housing Compensation Fund only.
- (c) Prior to the purchase of any condemned property hereunder the County Executive shall prepare proposed regulations governing the administration of the Fund and the purchase of condemned property therefrom, and shall forward such proposed regulations to the County

2	shall be initiated and approved in the same manner.		
3	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five		
4	(45) calendar days after it becomes law.
