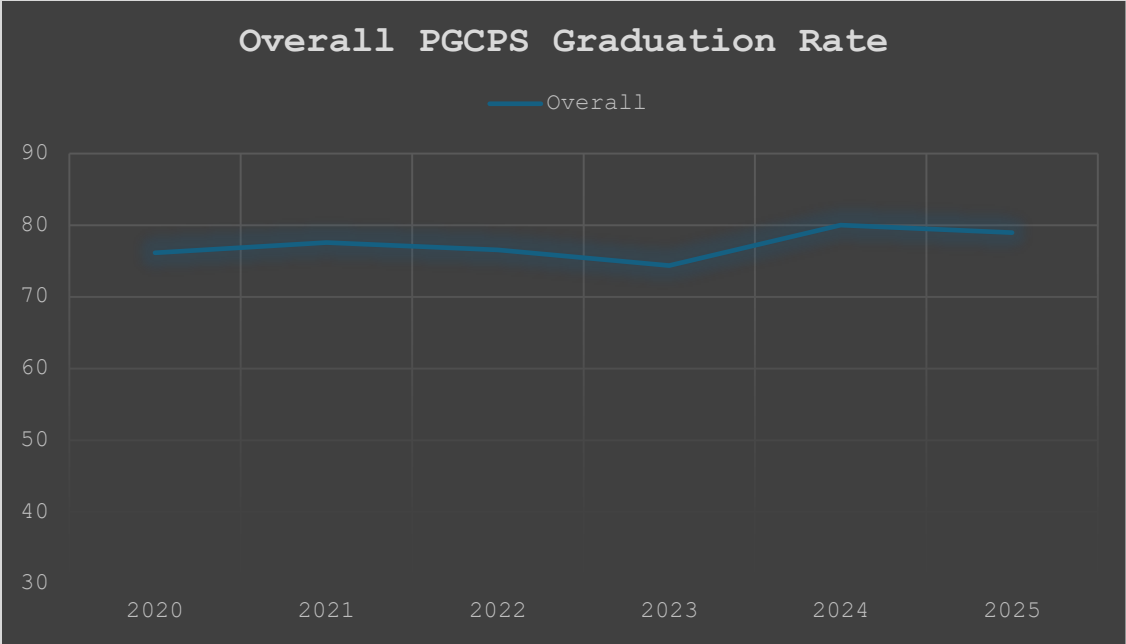

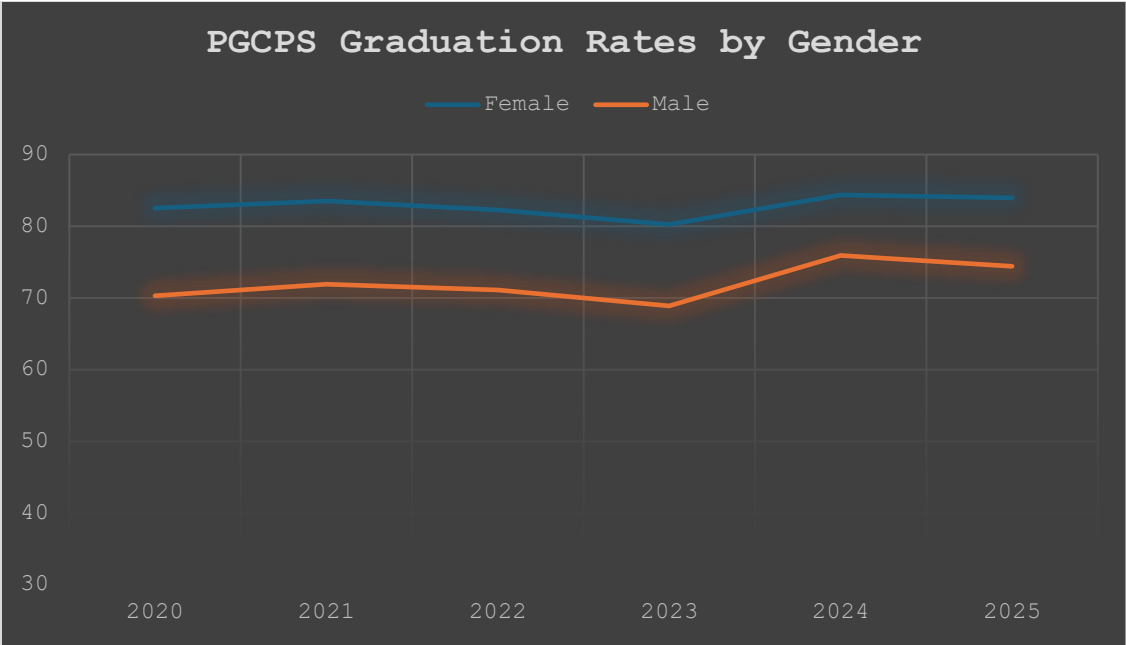
## Introduction and General Overview

This report analyzes graduation rates, provided by the [Maryland State Report Card](#), of all Prince George’s County Public High Schools from SY 2019-2020 to SY 2024-2025. The Maryland Report Card presents the ability to view graduation rates through both four-year and five-year cohorts. This report focuses on four-year cohorts, which measures the percentage of students who graduated within four years of beginning high school. All schools were broken down into three subgroups; gender, race, and service groups, which include groups such as students with disabilities and multilingual learners. The report also provides a comparison of how schools are performing compared to not only county averages, but state averages across this six-year span as well. During the pandemic, particularly in service groups, the county saw a decrease in graduation rates, but are now showing signs of improvement, particularly from 2023 to 2024. When a subgroup contains only a small number of students, year-to-year results may fluctuate significantly, as each individual student has a proportionally greater impact on the overall outcomes. Some schools have subgroup populations that are either too low or nonexistent and are ultimately suppressed for the anonymity of the students.

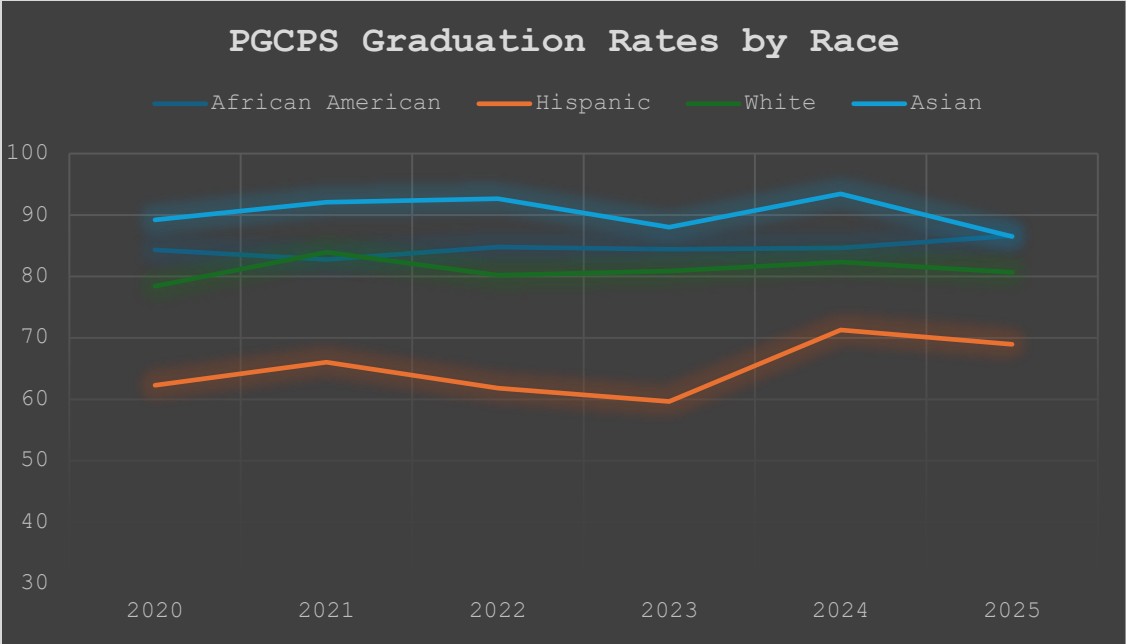
Over the past two years, Prince George’s County has achieved its highest graduation rates since at least 2019, maintaining an overall rate of around 79% in both 2024 and 2025.



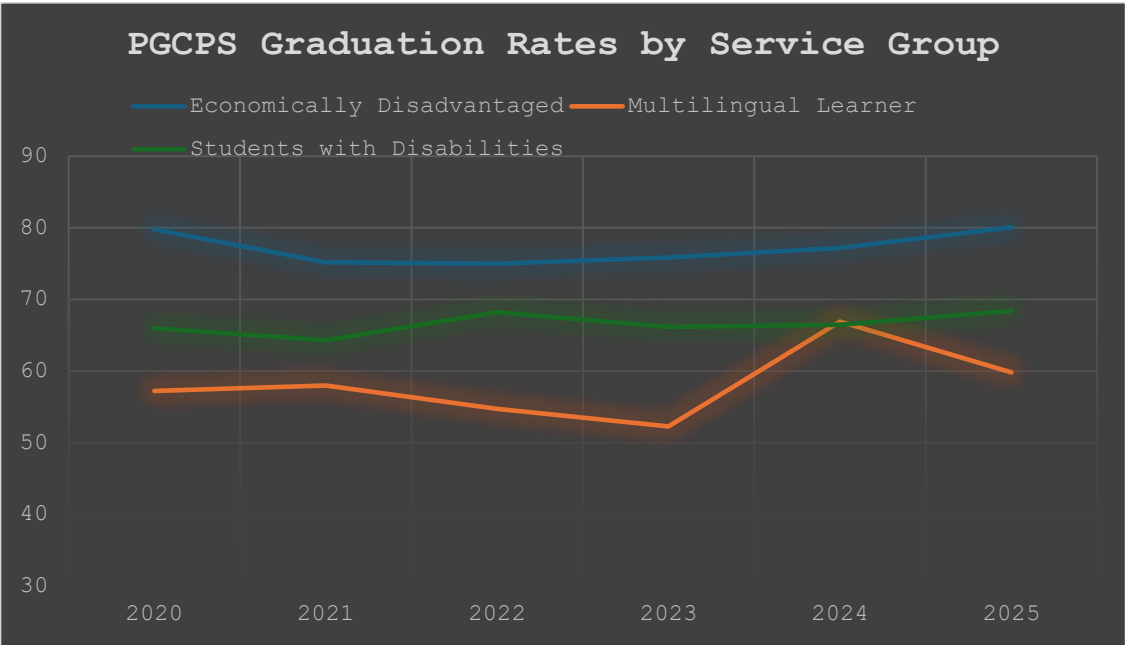
Across the County, female students have consistently outperformed their male counterparts, with female students maintaining a graduation rate above 80% since 2020. From 2020-2023 male graduation rates hovered around 70% before jumping above 74% in 2024 and 2025.



Graduation rates by race have largely remained consistent, except for Hispanic students, where we witness a 10% spike from 2023 to 2024.



The graduation rate for Economically Disadvantaged students has continuously increased since 2021, rising to similar rates pre-Covid. The graduation rate has largely remained consistent since 2022 for students with disabilities, with an average graduation rate of 67% since 2022. Multilingual Learners take a similar leap as observed for Hispanic students in the chart above, jumping from 52% in 2023 to 67% in 2024, before falling slightly back under 60% in 2025.



This chart shows each school's graduation rate and compares it with the previous year's performance.

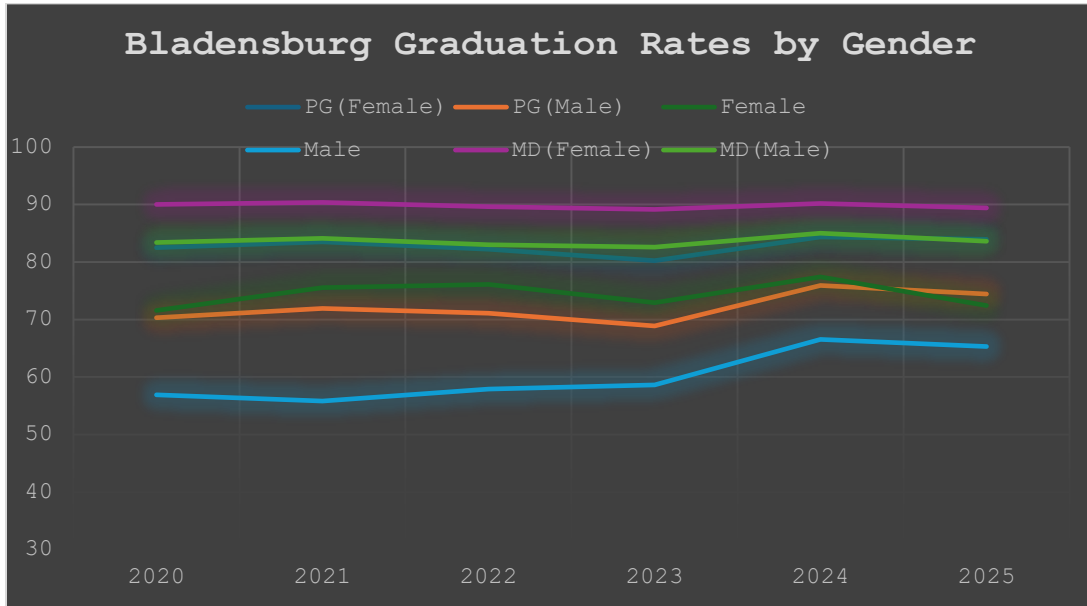

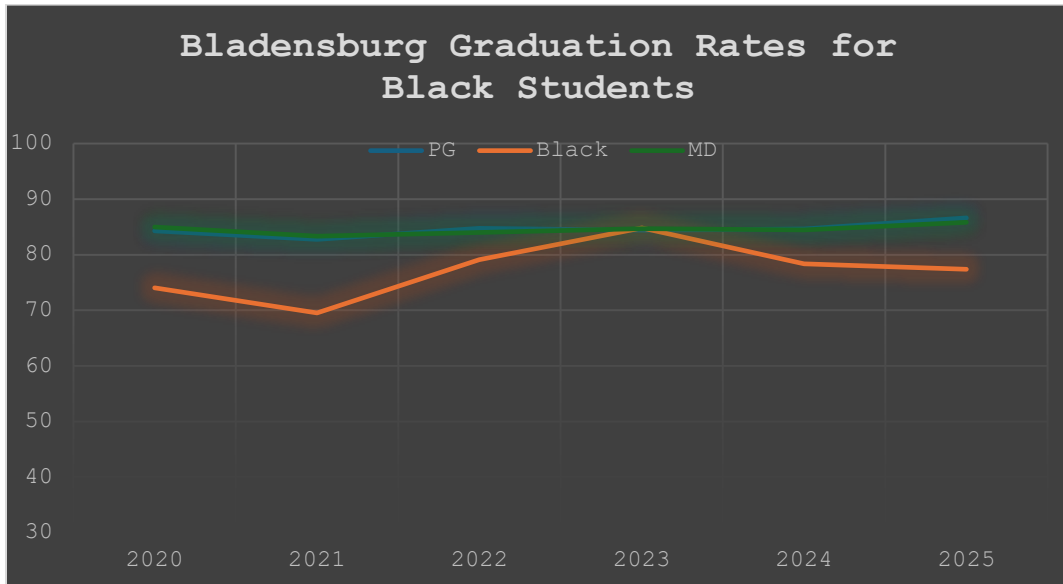
**Bladensburg High School**

Bladensburg High School graduation rate falls below the county average, with an average rate of 66.8% over the last six years. Graduation rates for male students have risen, averaging

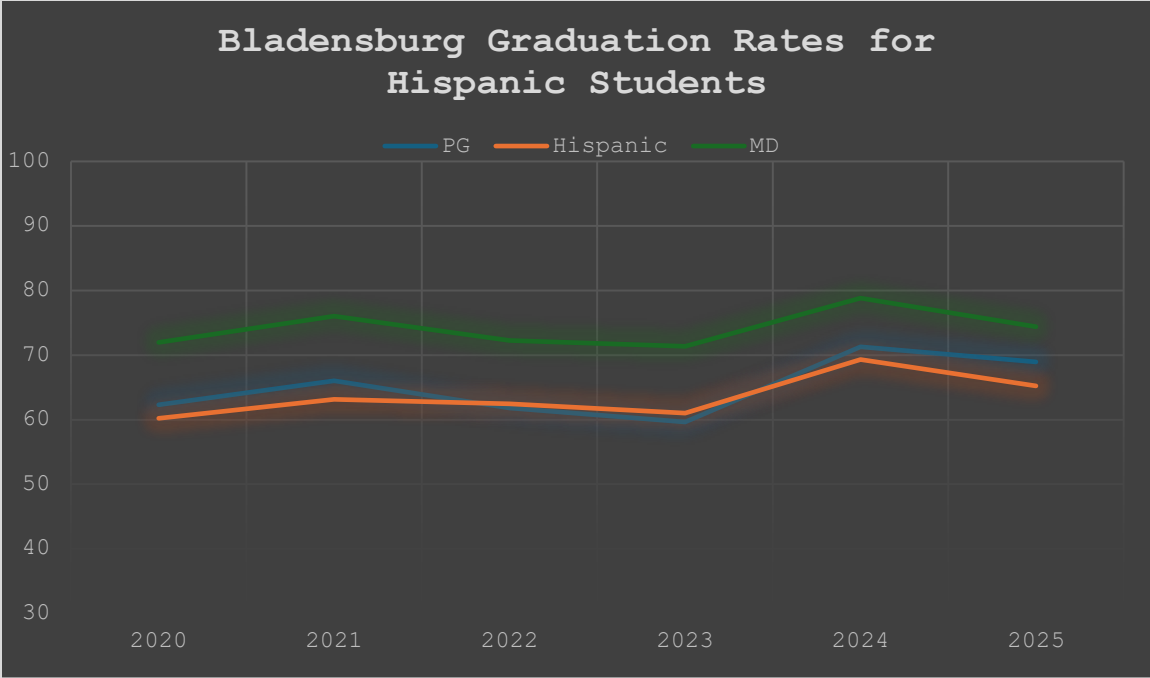
65.92% over the past 2 years, while female students have graduated at an average rate of 74.3%.



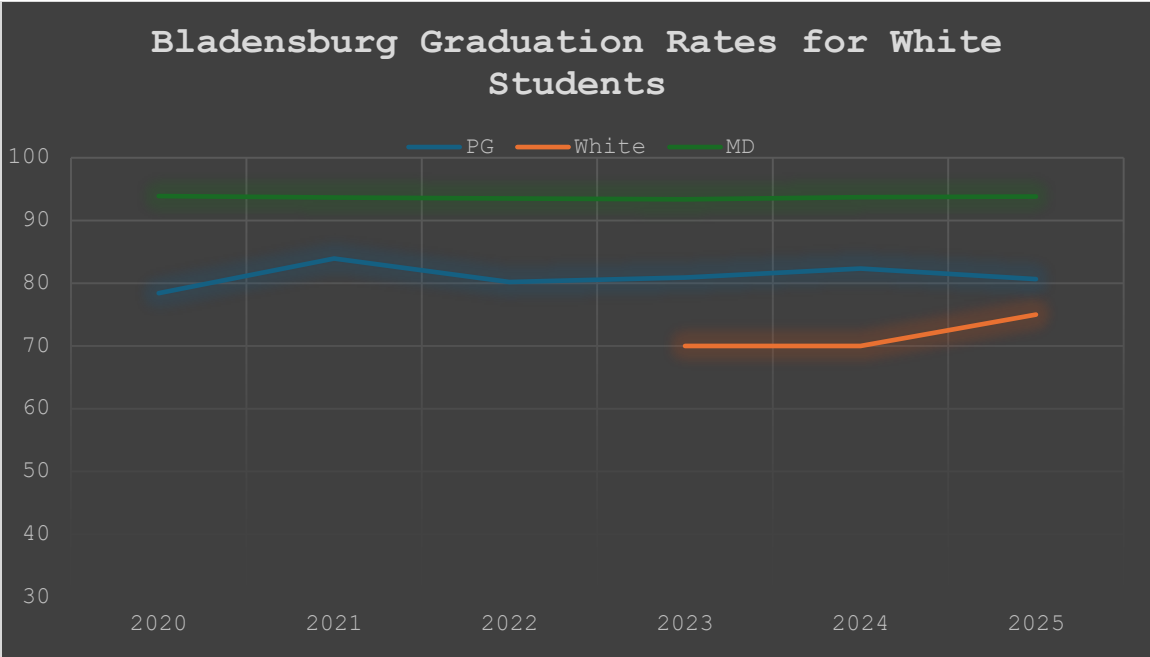
African American graduation rates at Bladensburg High School have dipped over the past couple of years, falling from 85% in 2023 to 77% in 2025.



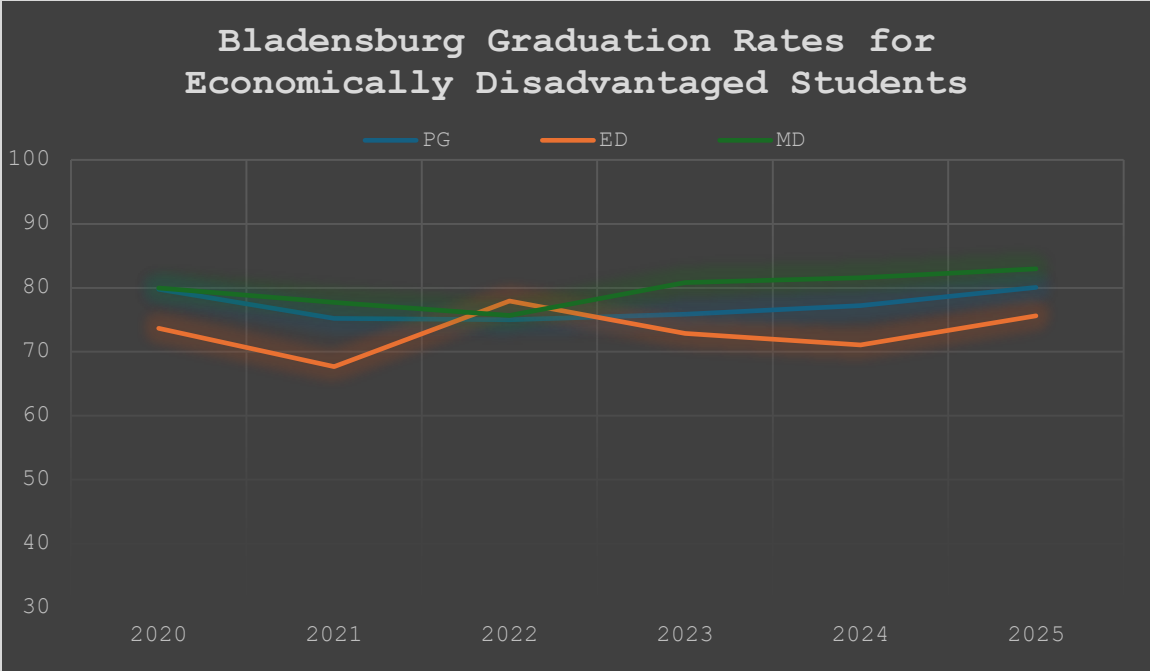

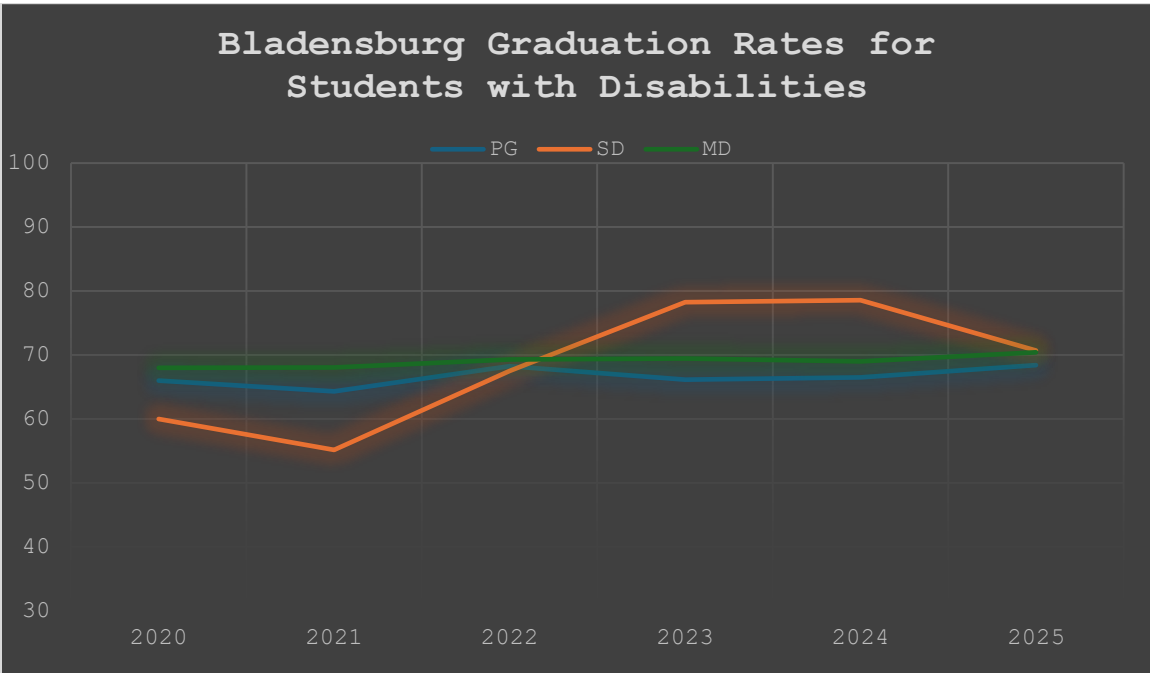

Economically disadvantaged students have graduated at an average rate of 73.1% over the past six years, as we see a slight jump from 2024 to 2025.

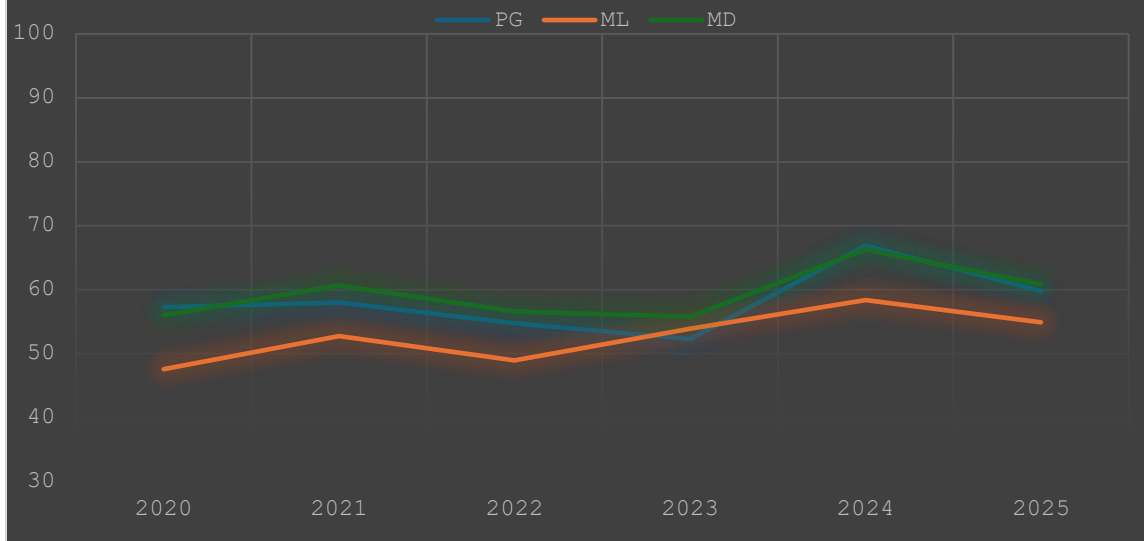


Students with Disabilities at Bladensburg High School have witnessed an over 20% increase from 2021 to 2024, before slightly dipping to 70.7% in 2025.



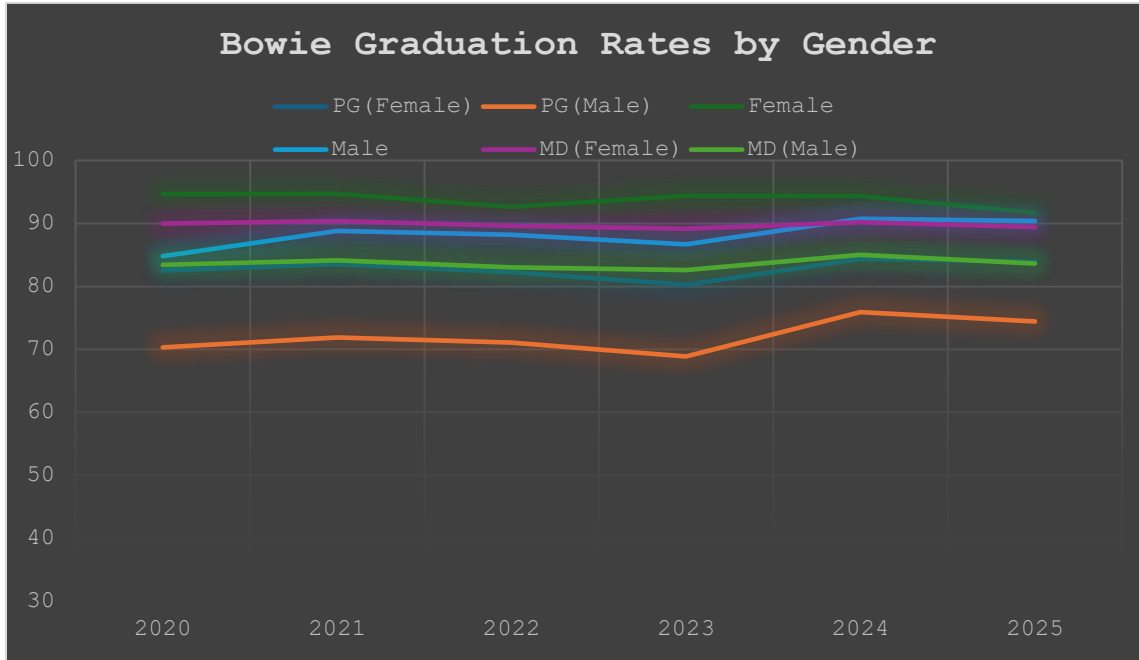

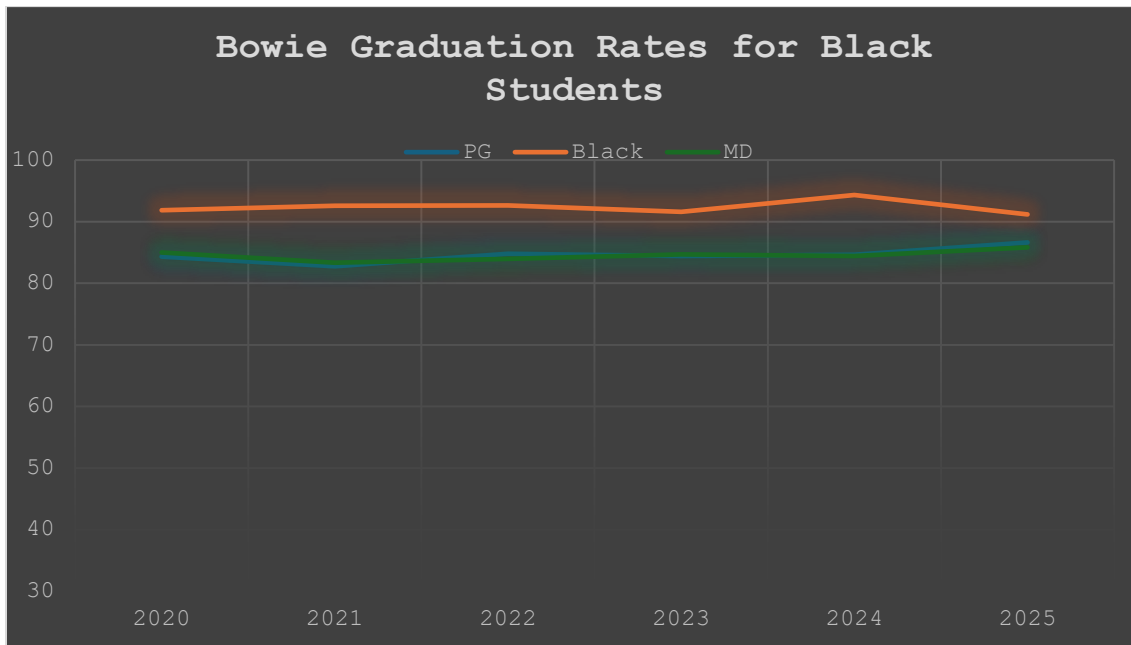


# Bowie High School

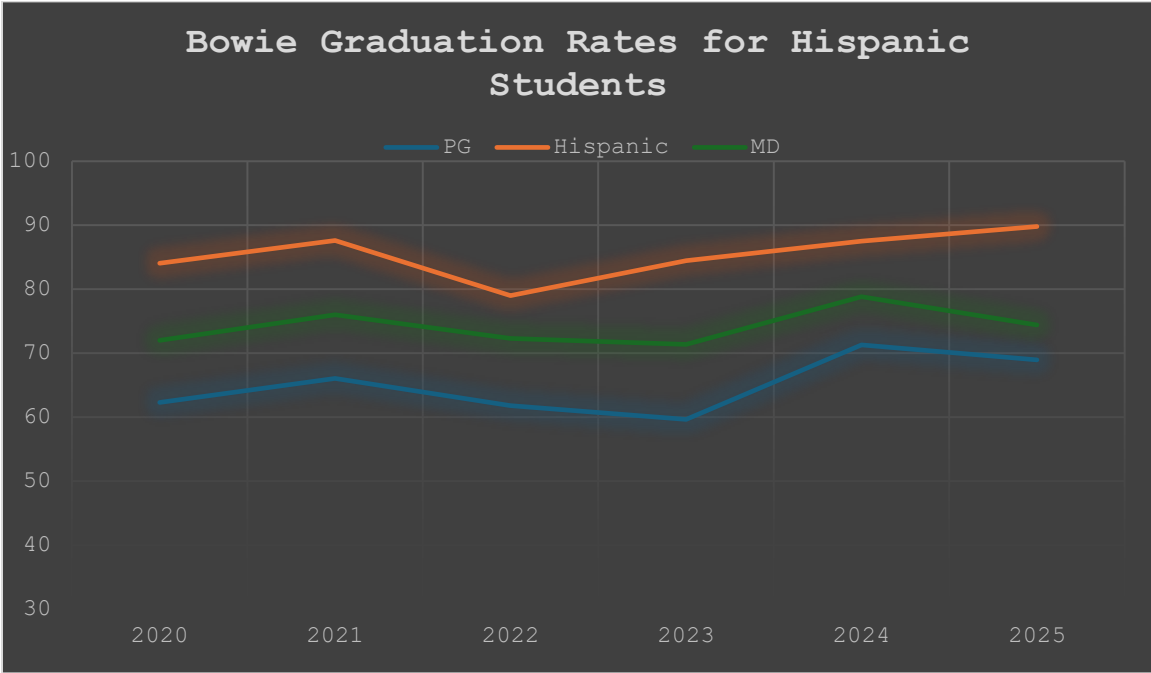

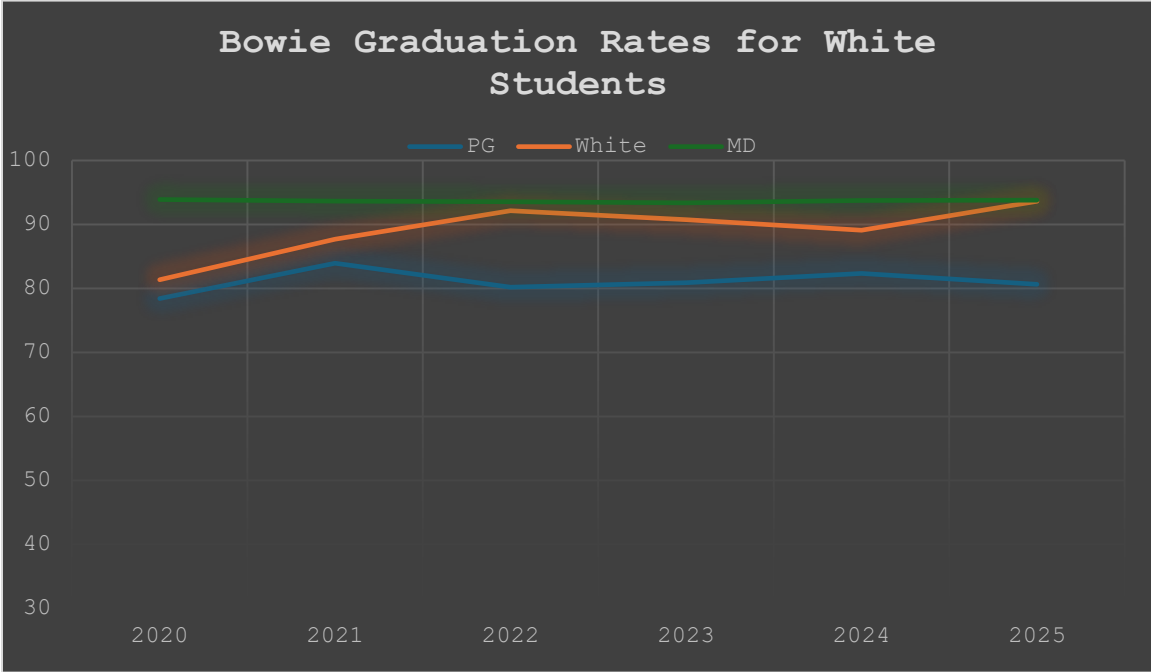
African Americans over the last five years at Bowie High School have graduated at an average rate of 92.4%, above both State and County averages.



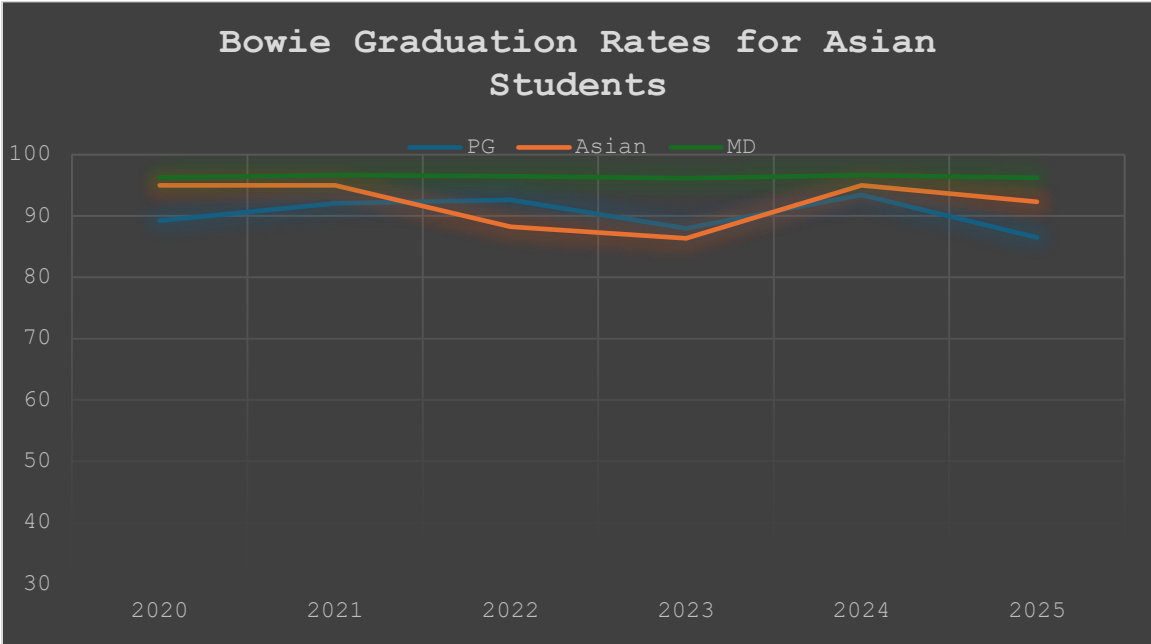
The graduation rate for Hispanic students at Bowie High School has jumped by over 10% since 2022, marking the highest rate for Hispanic students across the county.



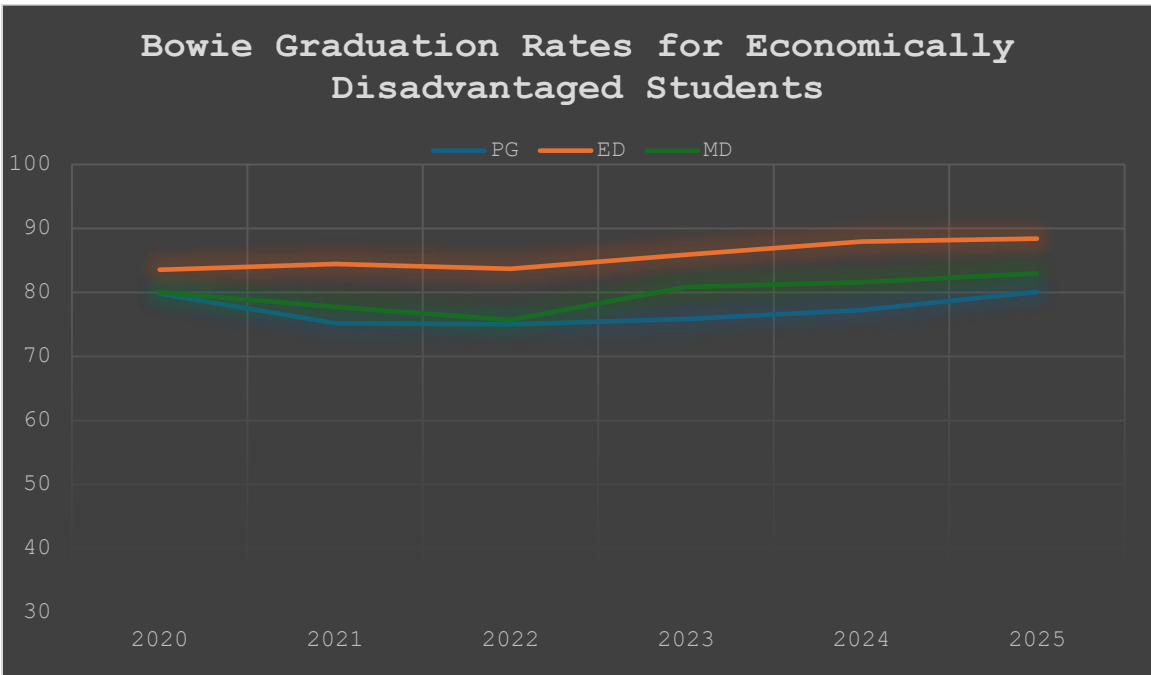

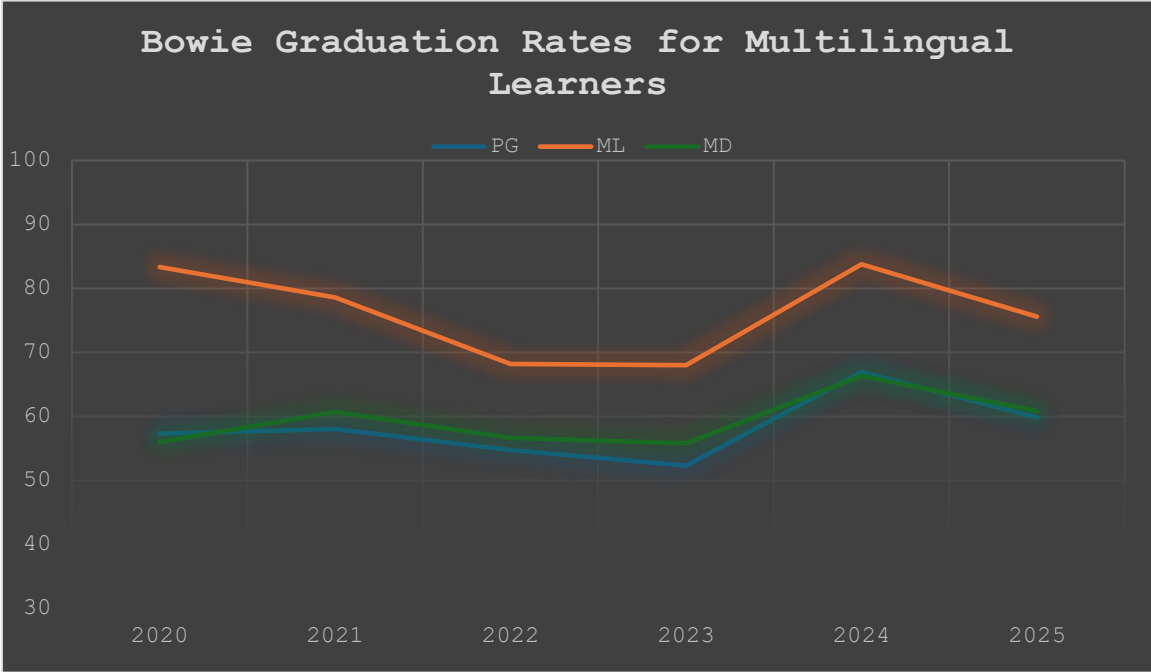

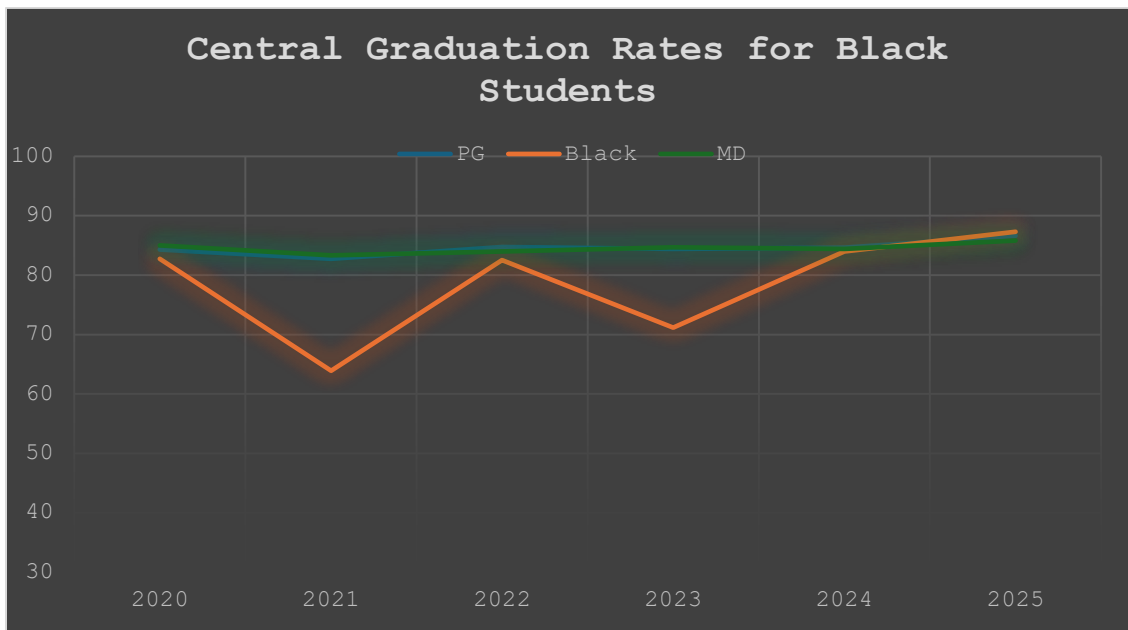


# Central High School

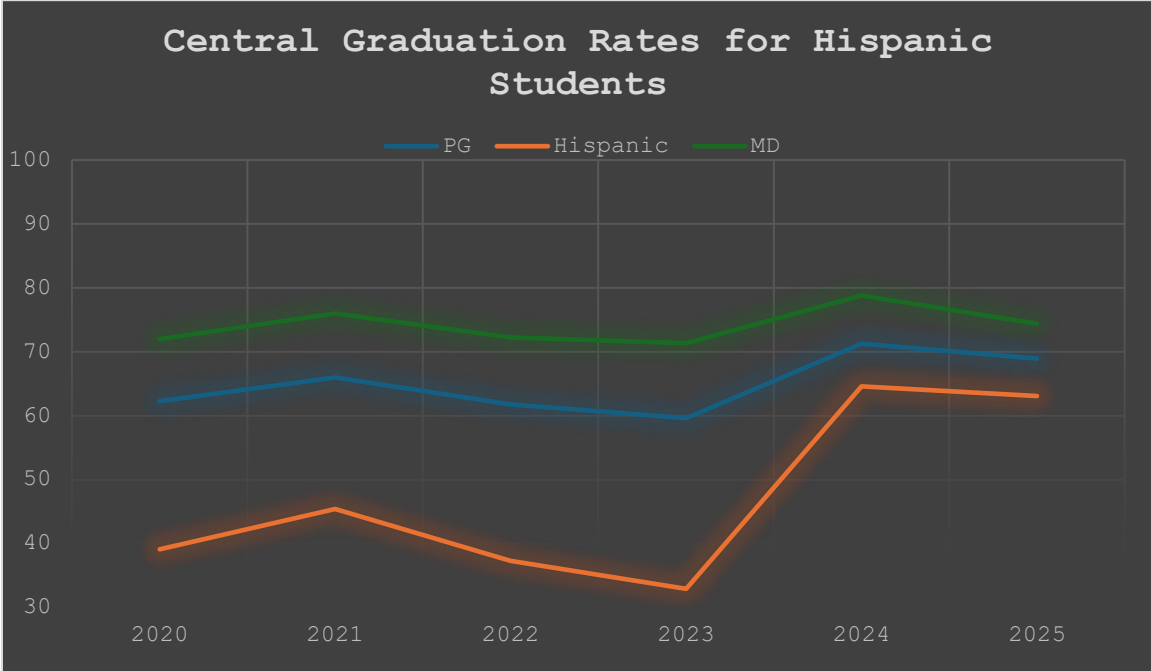
Central High School graduation rates are below both State and County average, with an average of 65.6% over the last six years. Both male and female graduation rates saw a significant spike from 2023 to 2024, with the male graduation rate rising by nearly 25%, while female graduation rates rose by nearly 20%.



The graduation rate for African Americans has increased over the past 2 years, from 71% to 87.3% in 2025.



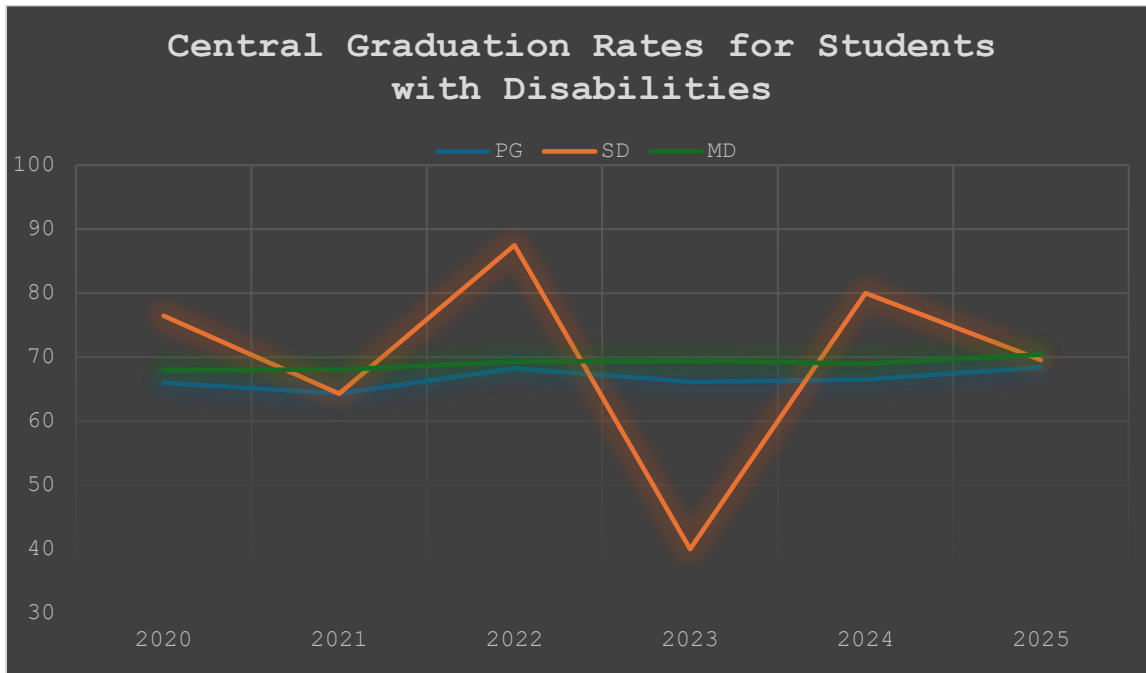

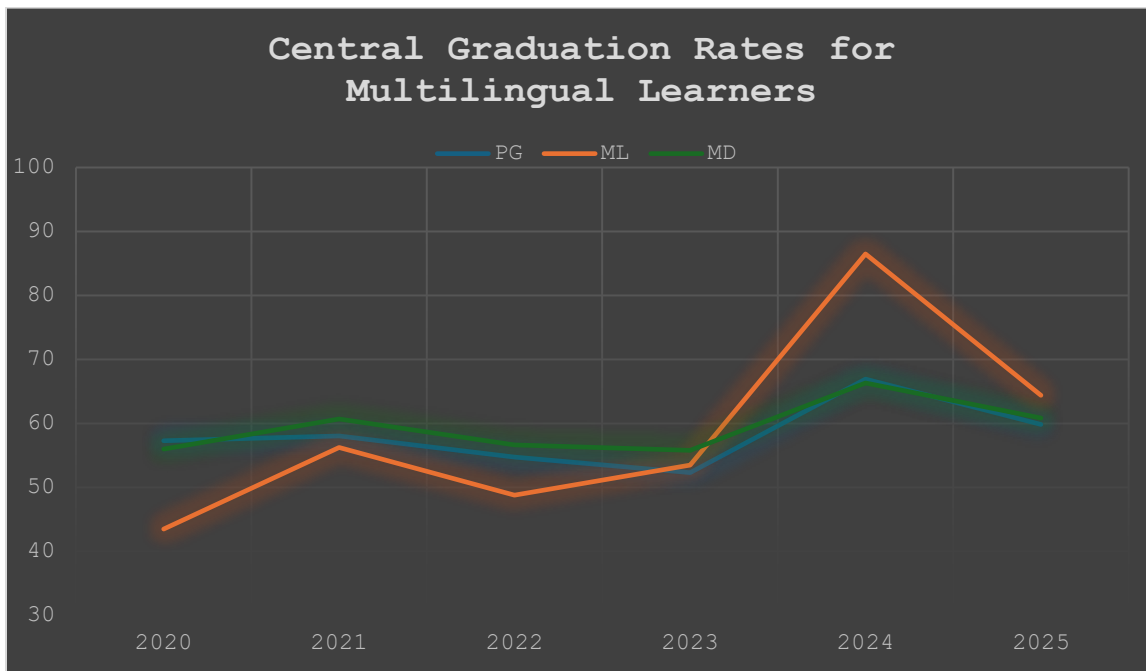

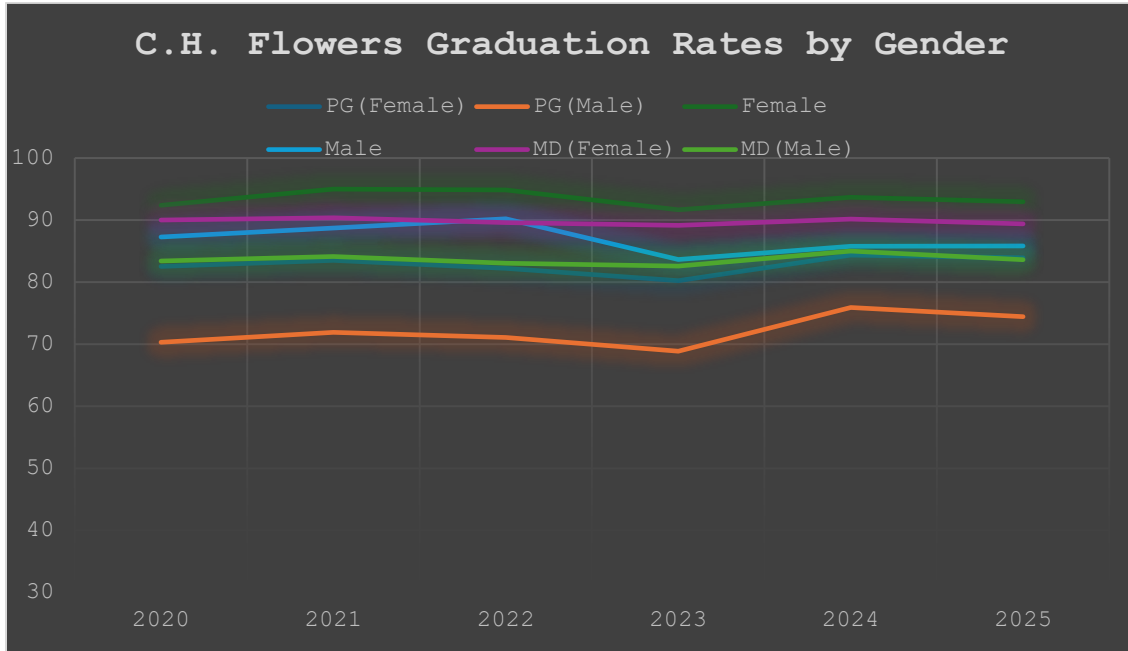

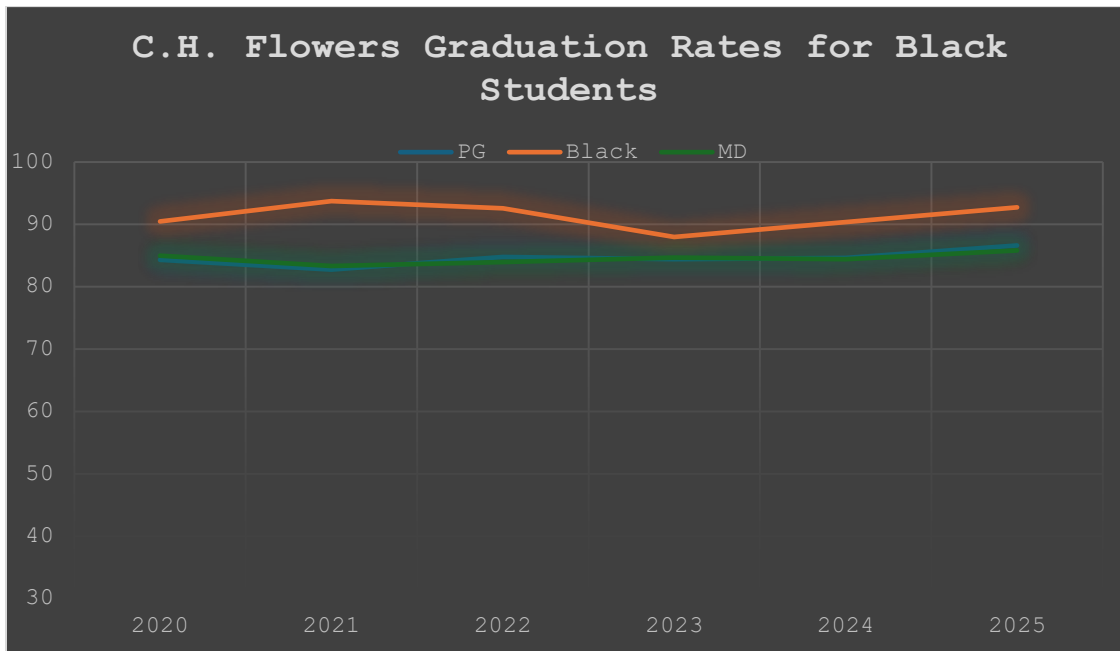


# Charles Herbert Flowers High School

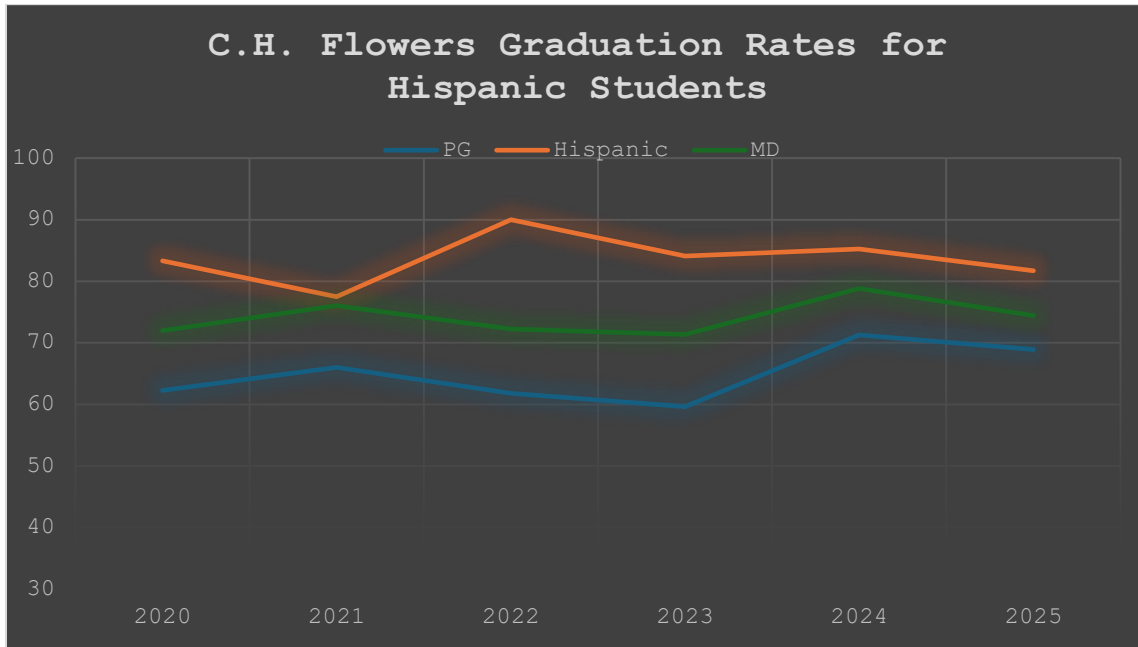

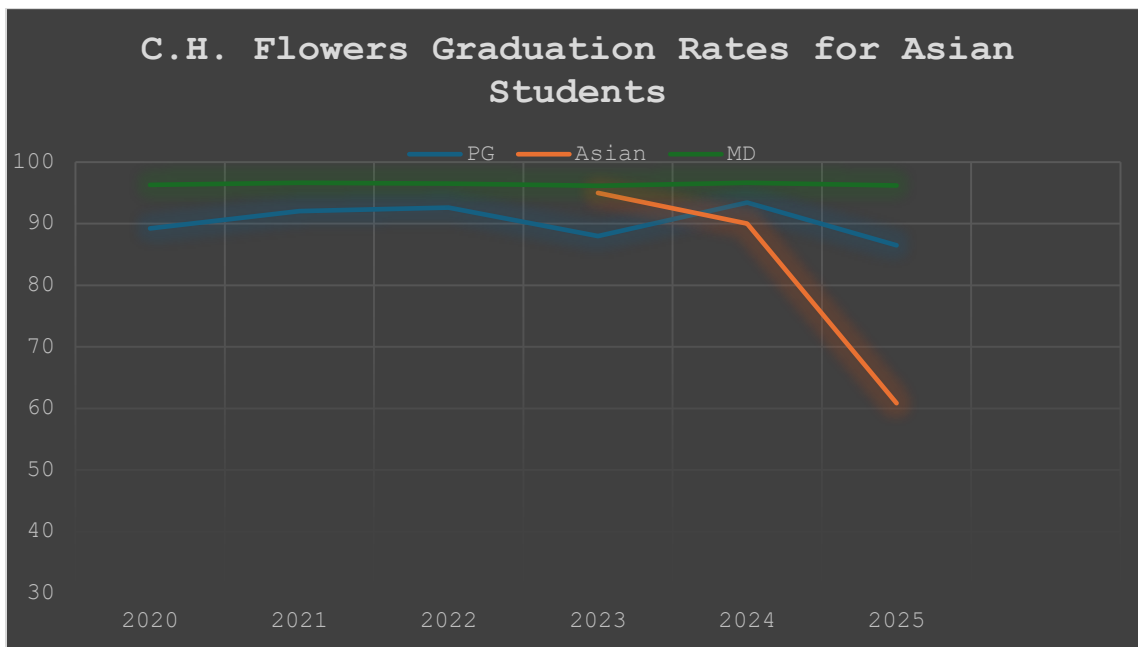
The graduation rate for African Americans at C.H. Flowers High School has gradually increased over the past 2 years, remaining above both State and County averages.



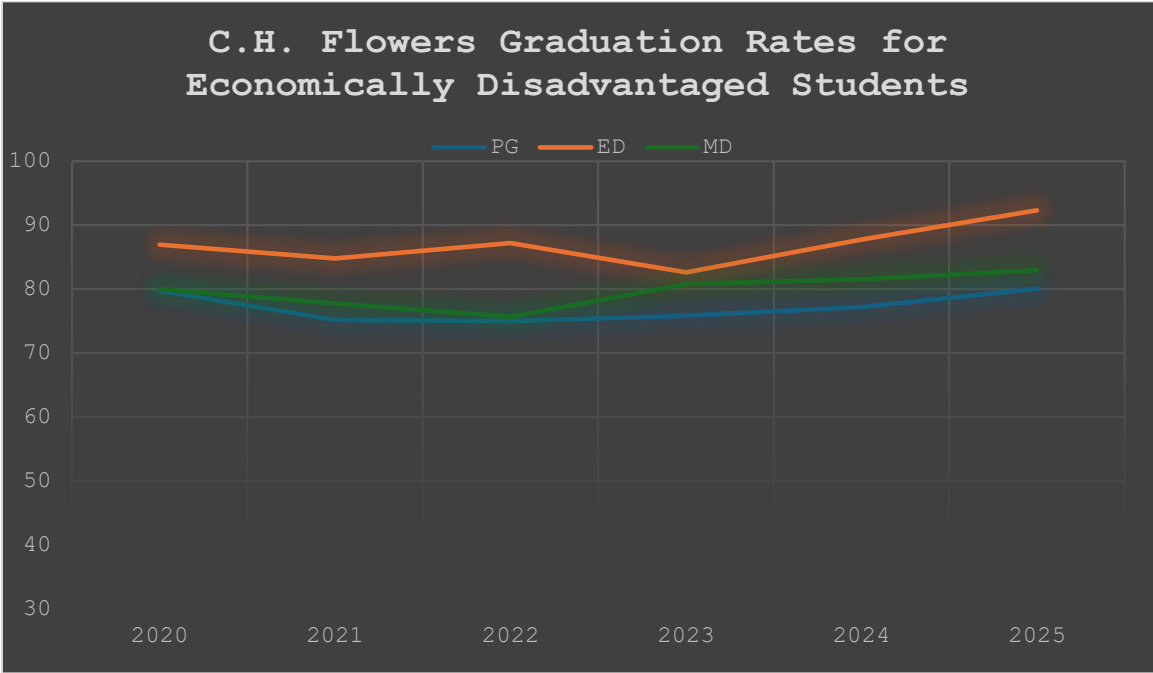
Hispanic graduation rates at C.H. Flowers School have decreased by nearly 10% from 2022 to 2025.



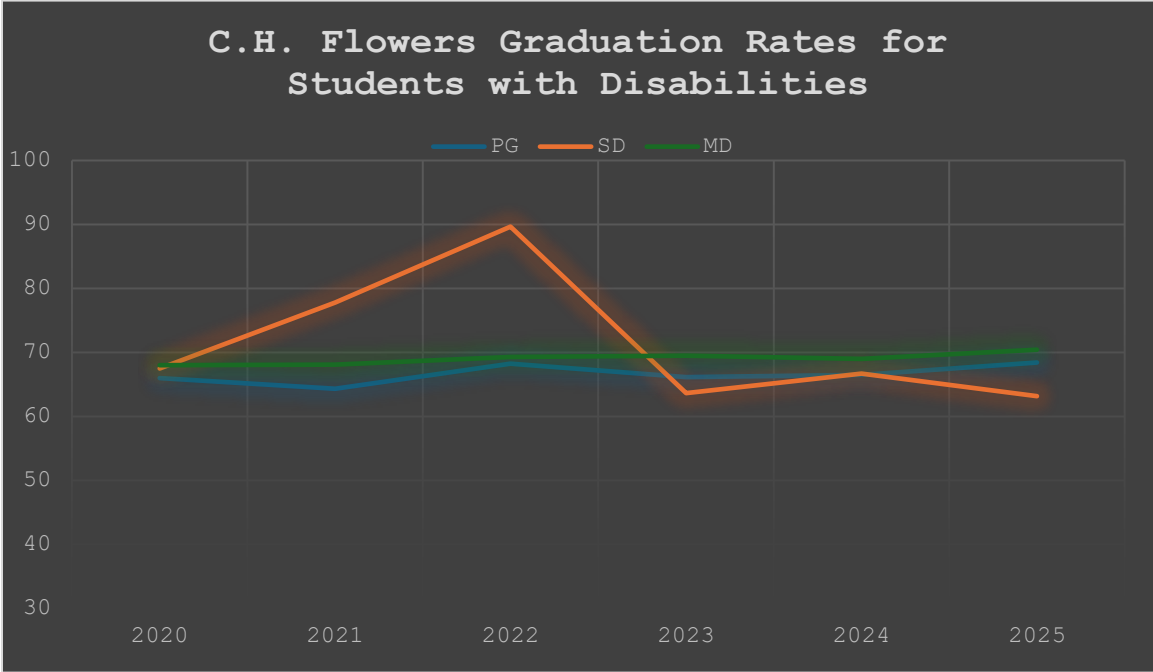

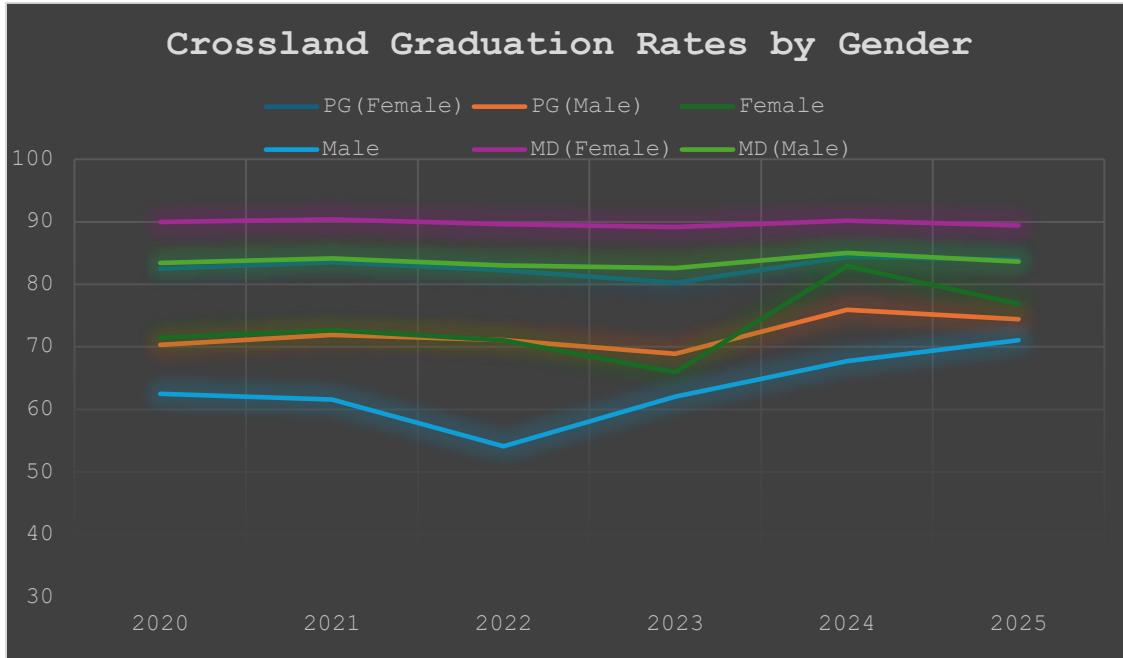

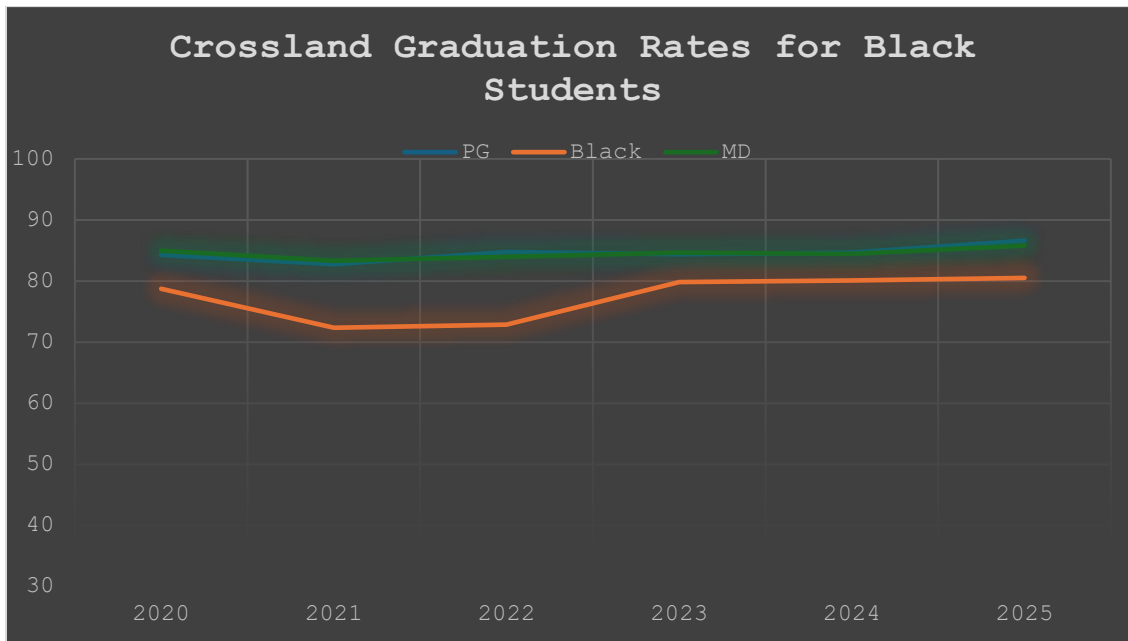


# Crossland High School

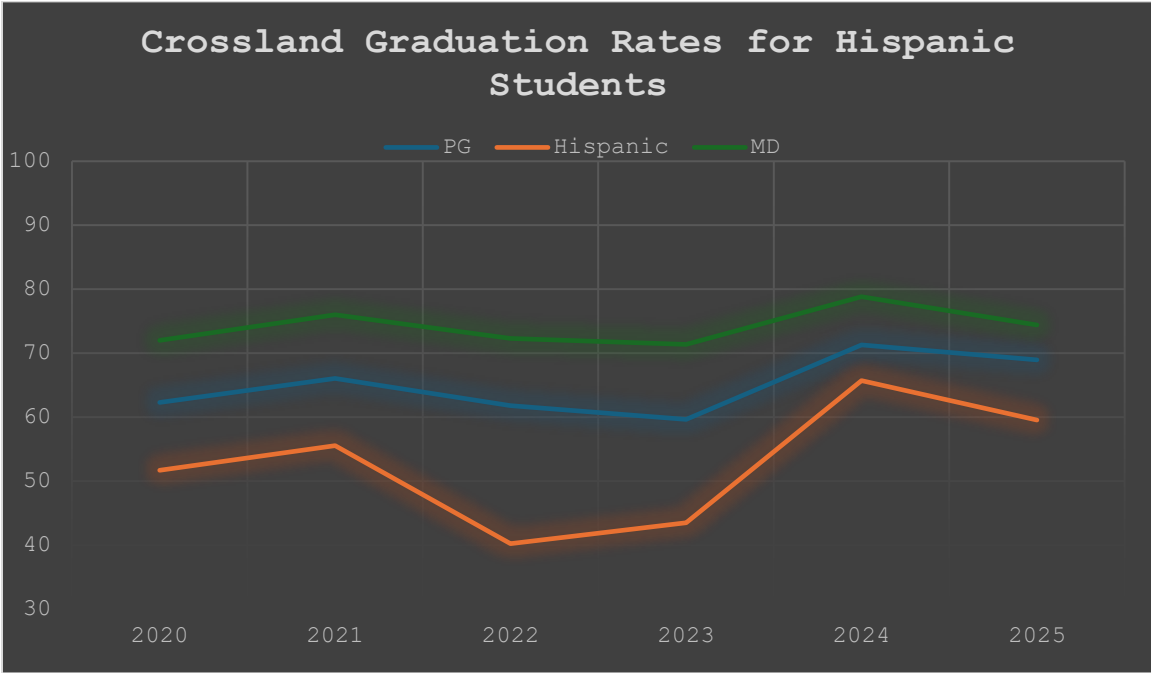

The graduation rate for African Americans at Crossland High School has remained around 80%, below both State and County averages.



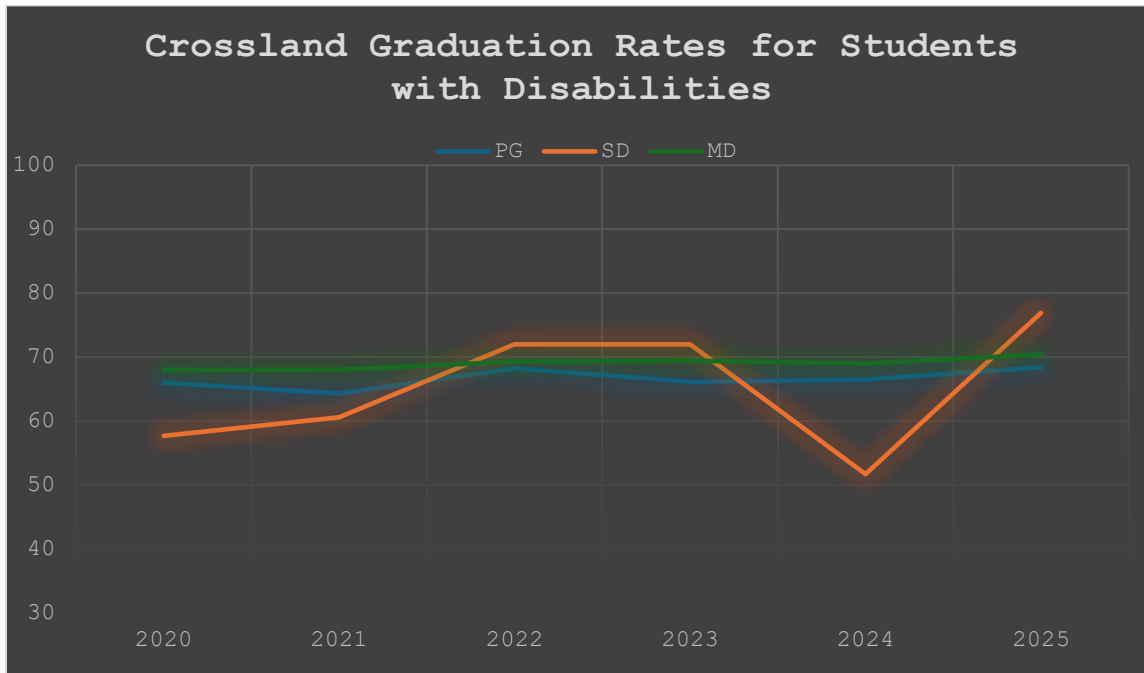

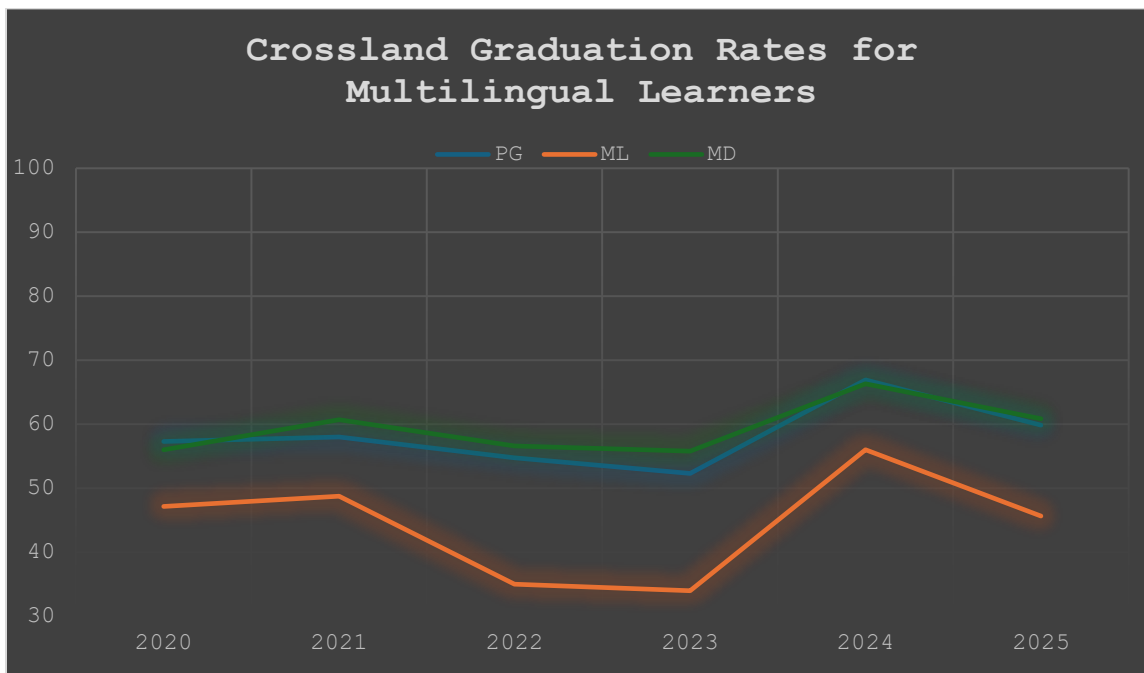
The graduation rate for students who are considered economically disadvantaged has increased significantly since 2022 by nearly 20%.



Students with disabilities at Crossland High School experienced a notable decline in graduation rates in 2024, followed by an apparent recovery in 2025.

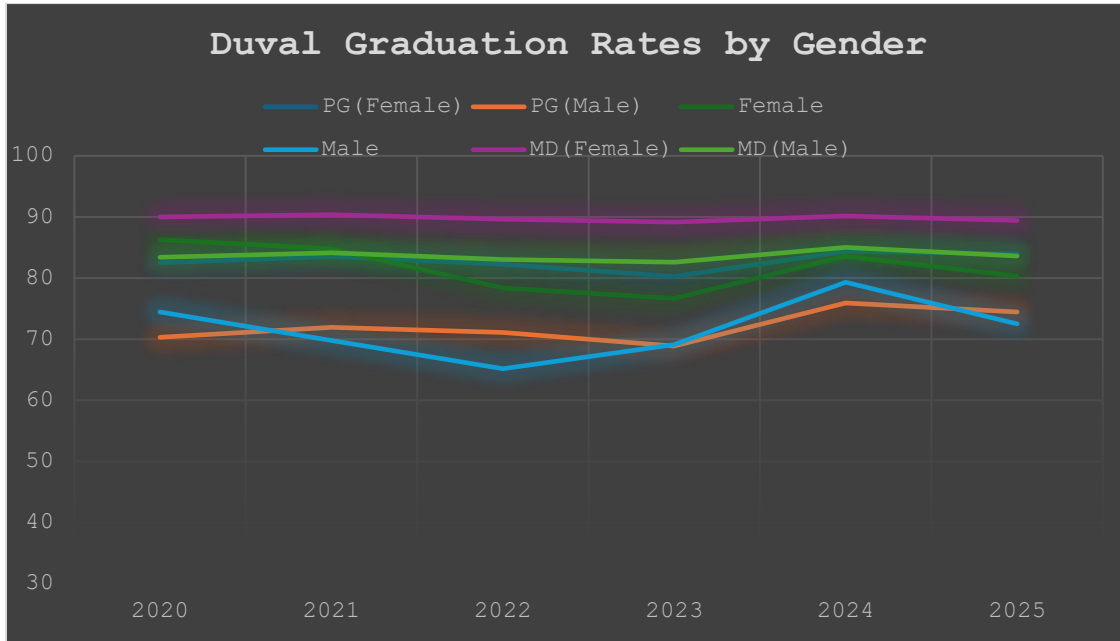

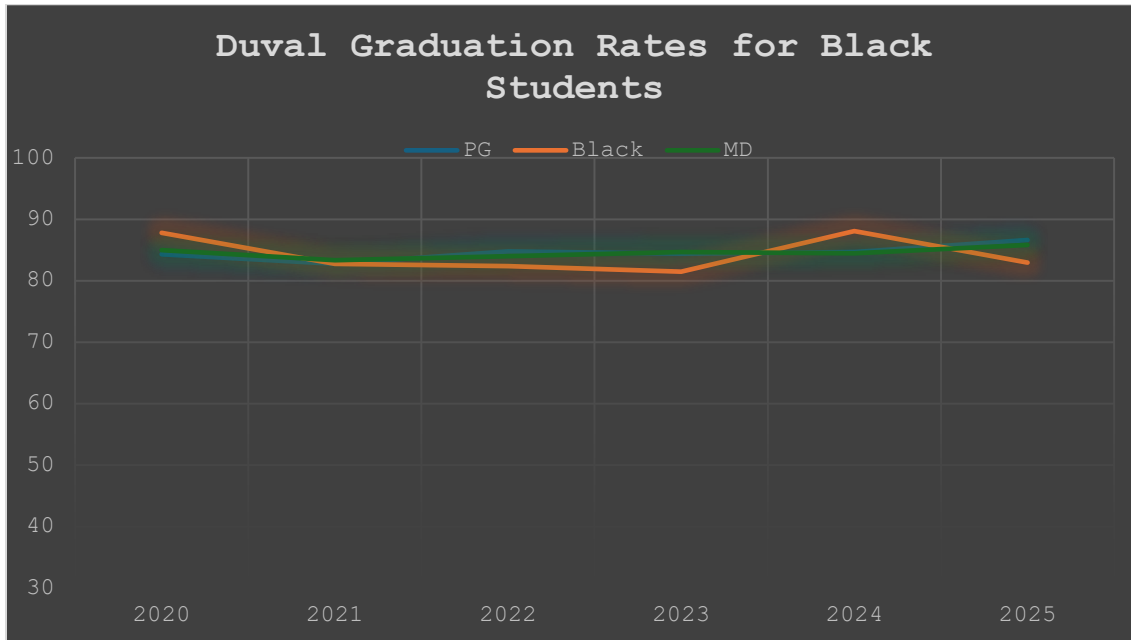


# Duval High School

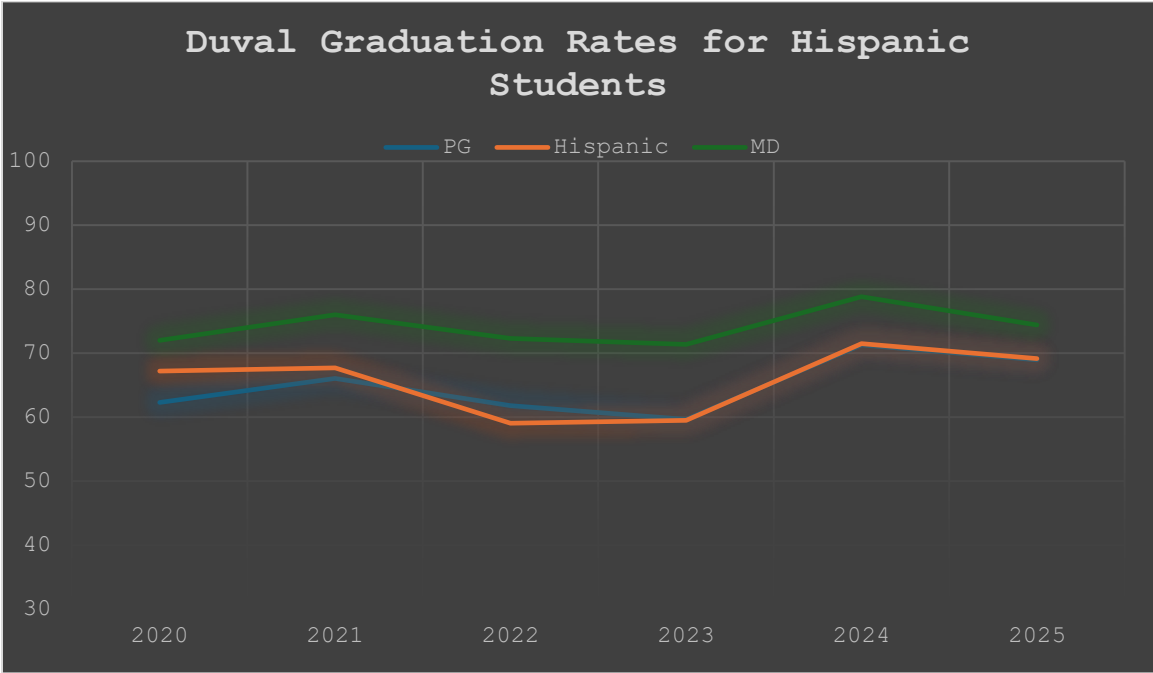
The average graduation rate over the past six years at Duval High School, 76.5%, remains around the County average, although the graduation for both males and females dropped from 2024 to 2025.



The graduation rate for African American students at Duval High School seemingly leveled after a near 10% spike from 2023 to 2024.



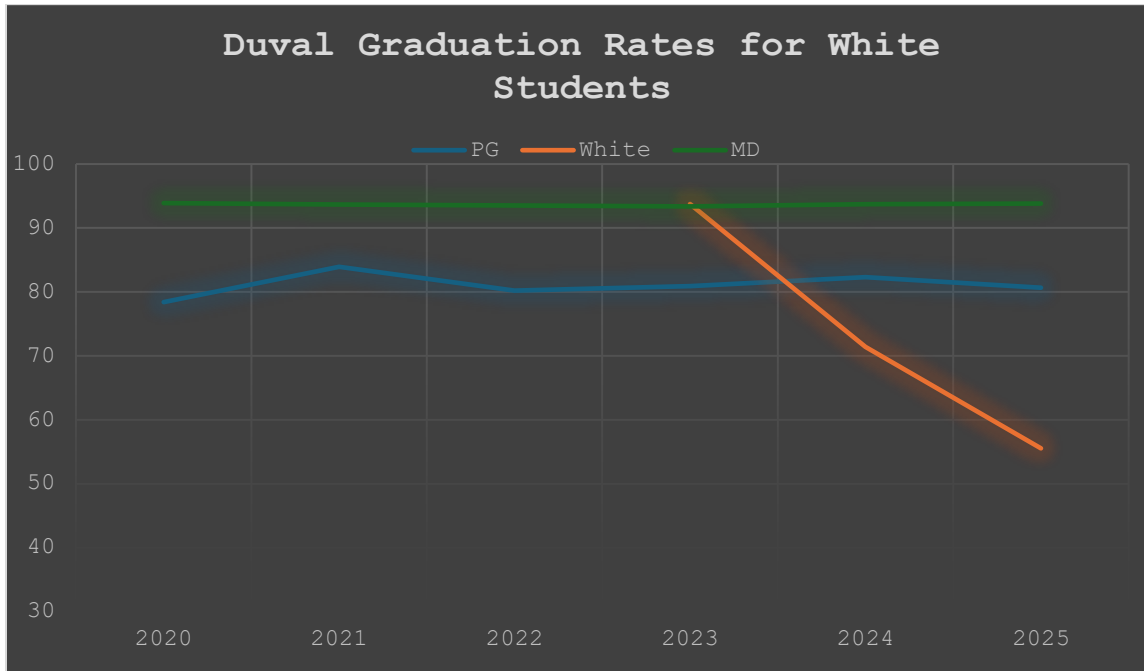
The graduation rate for Hispanic students at Duval High School followed the trend of the County and the State, slightly decreasing over this past year.



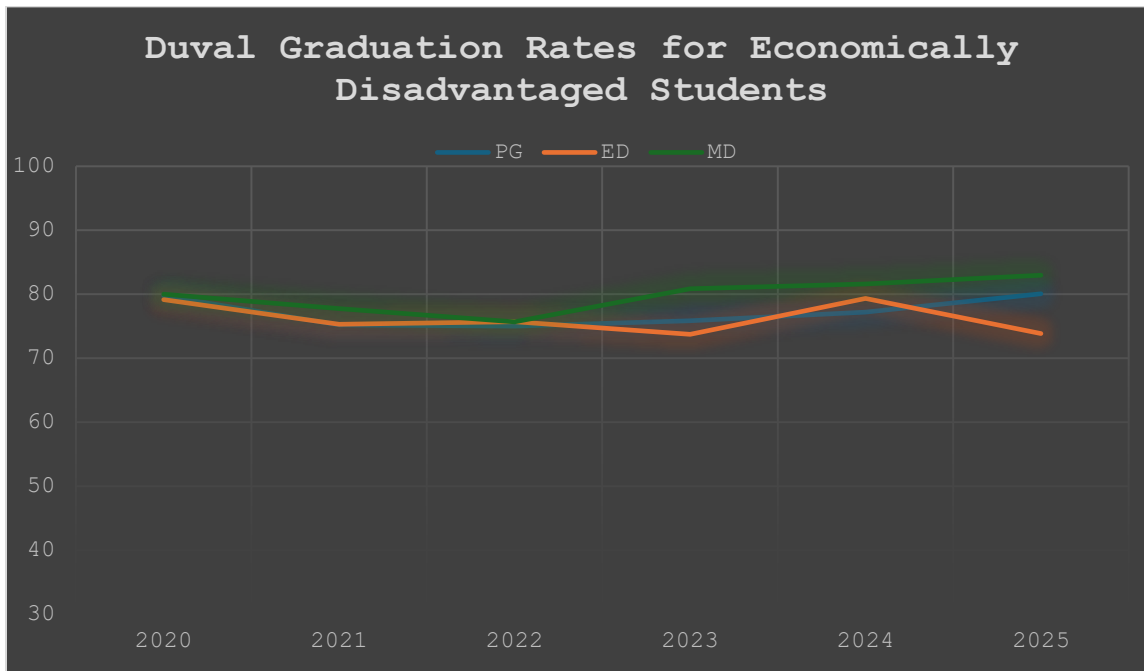

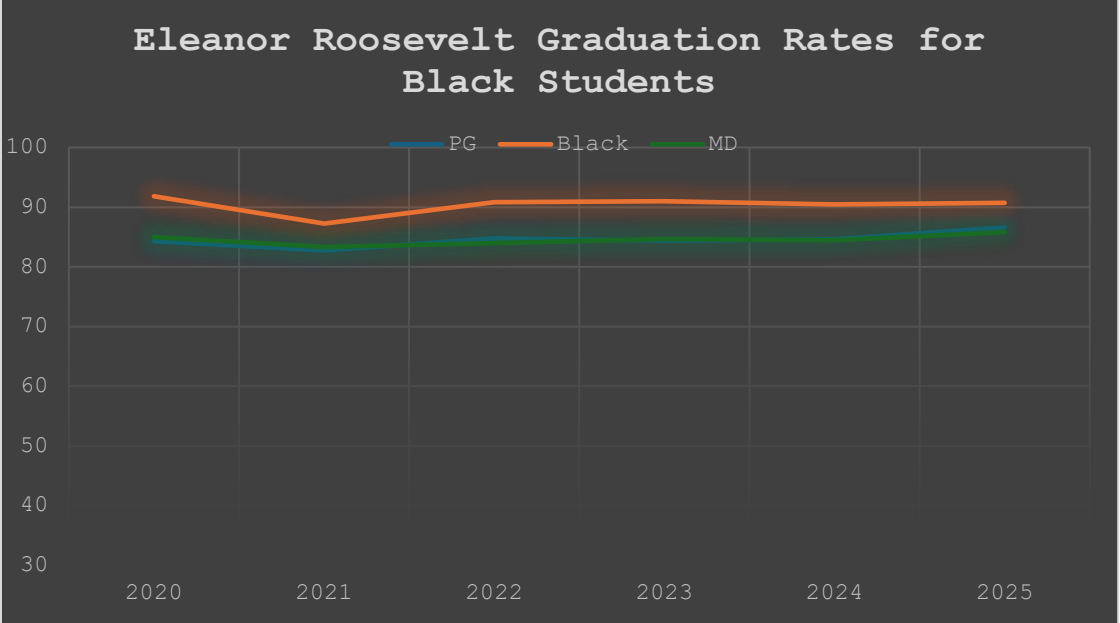


# Eleanor Roosevelt High School

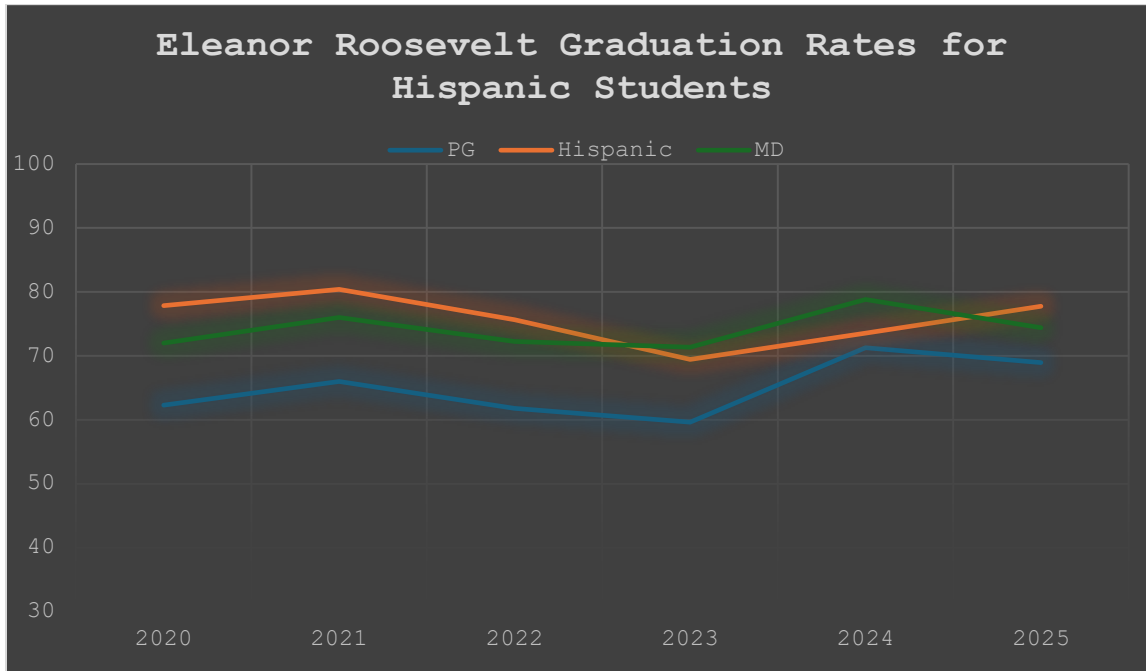

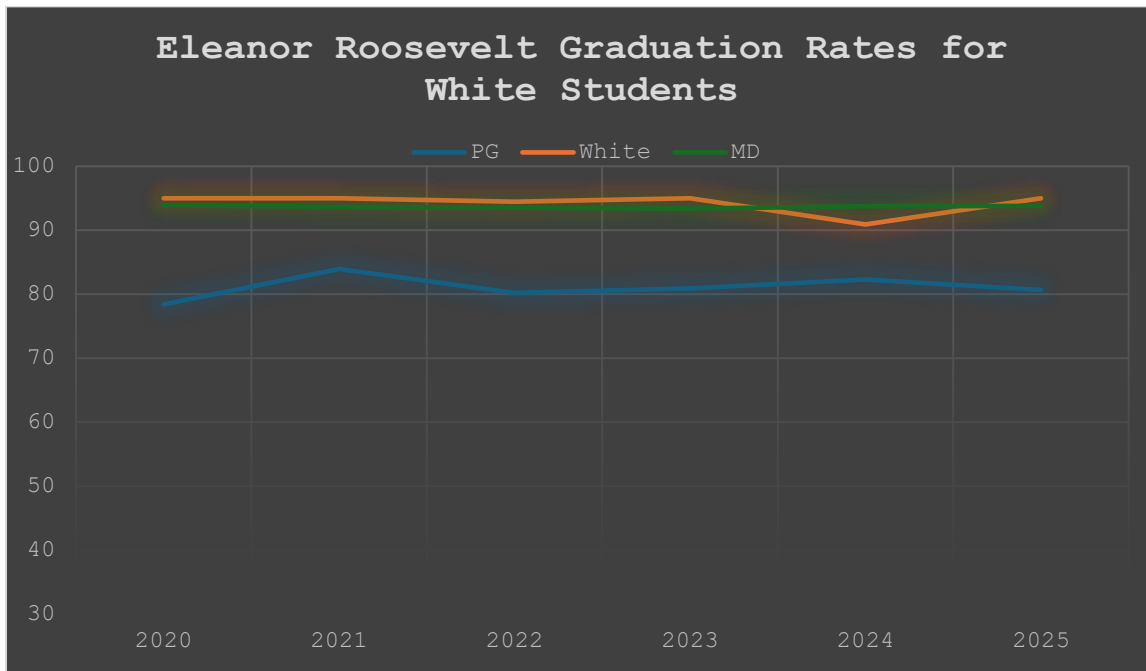
African Americans over the last six years at Eleanor Roosevelt High School have graduated at an average rate of 90.3%, above both State and County averages.



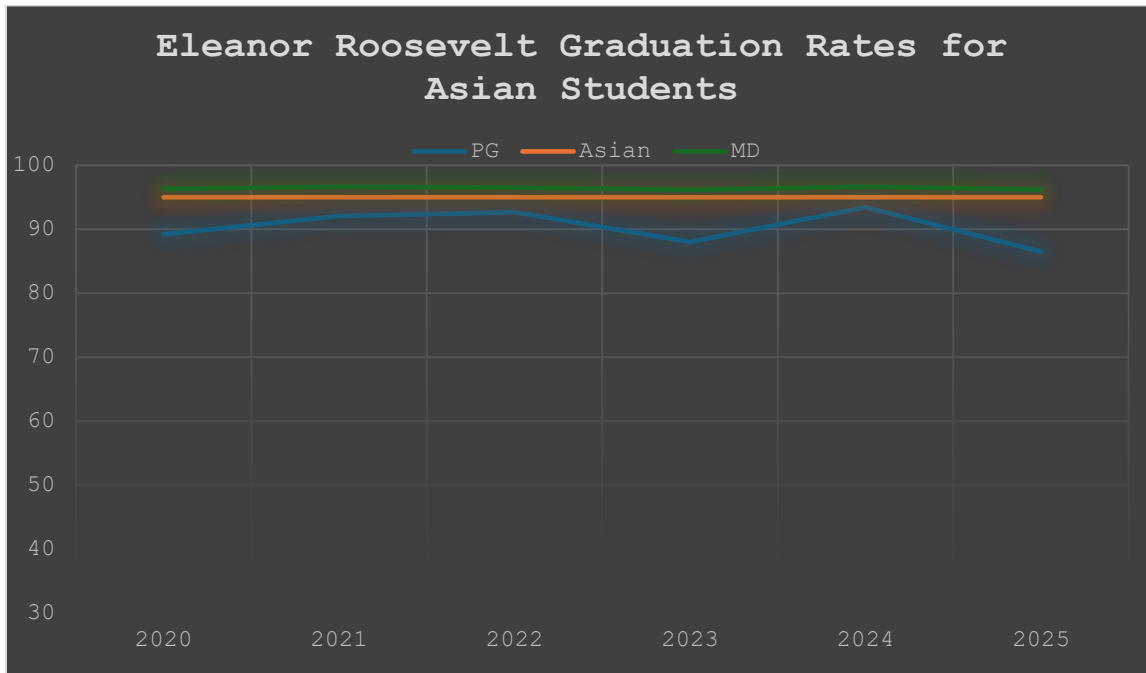

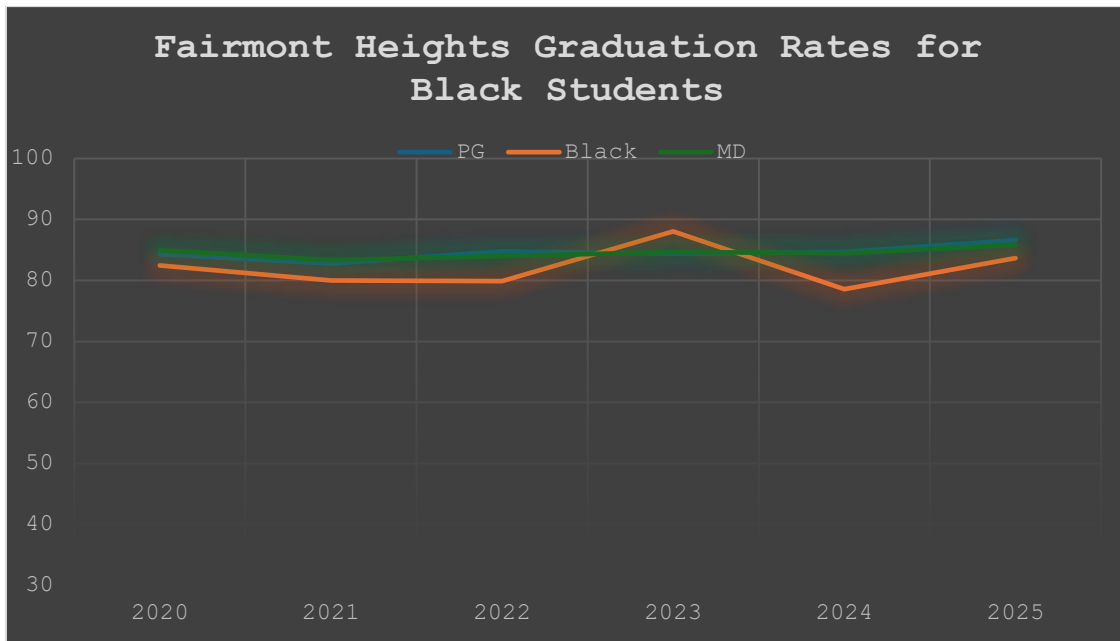


# Fairmont Heights High School

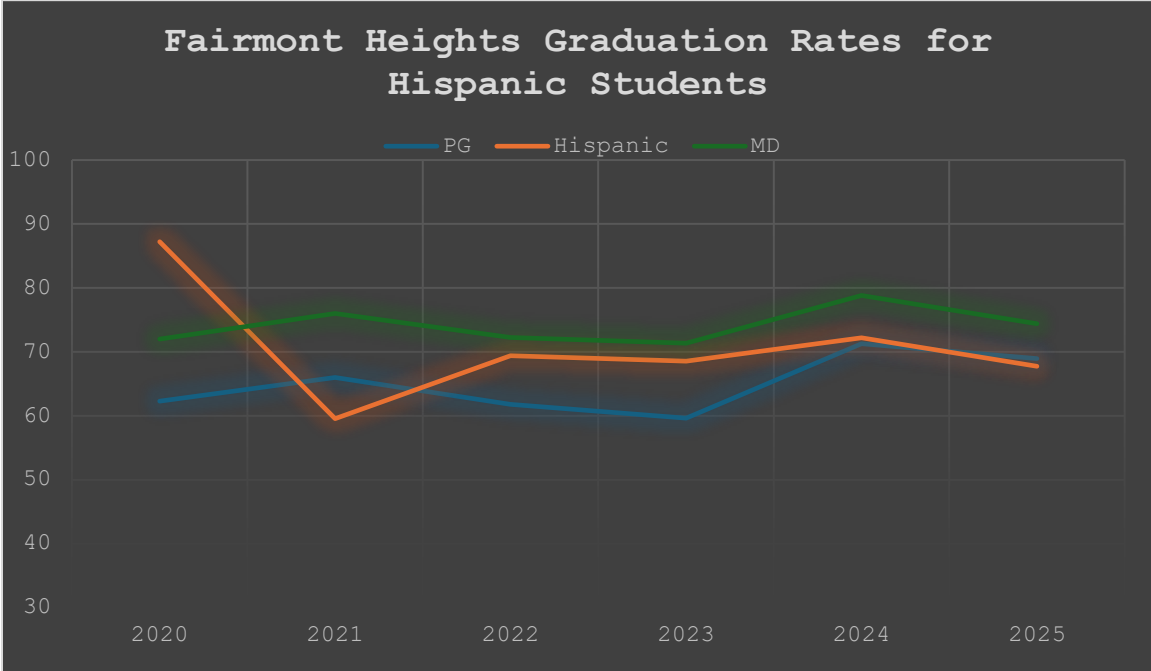

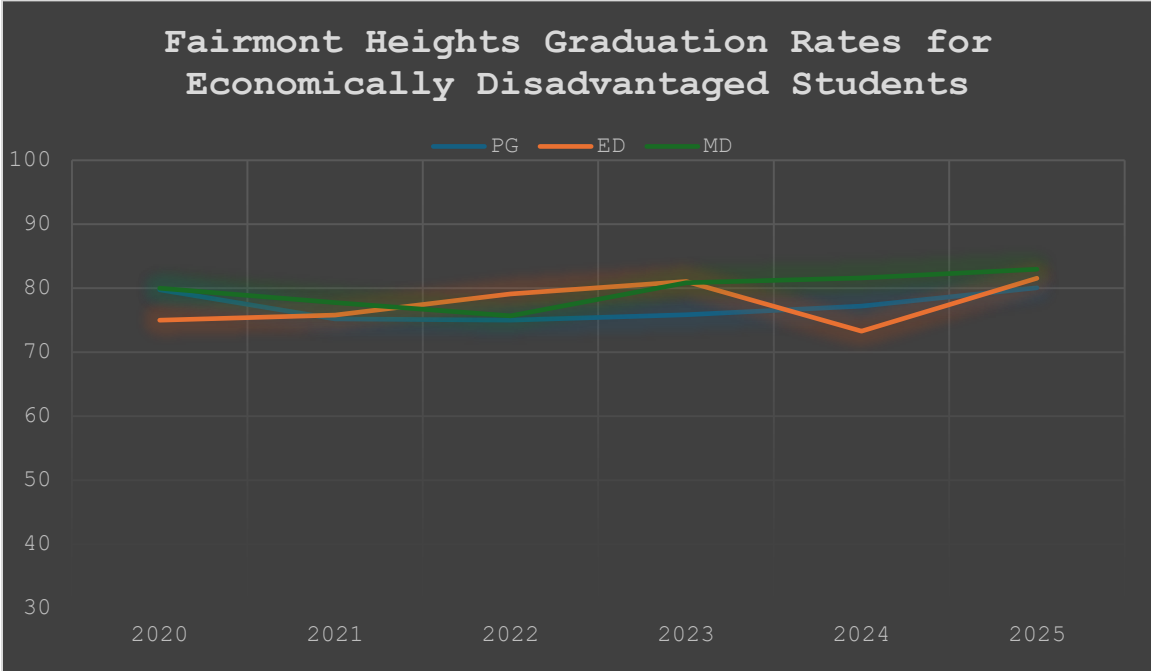
African American students graduated at an 83.9% rate in 2025 after dropping below 79% for the first time since 2019 last year.



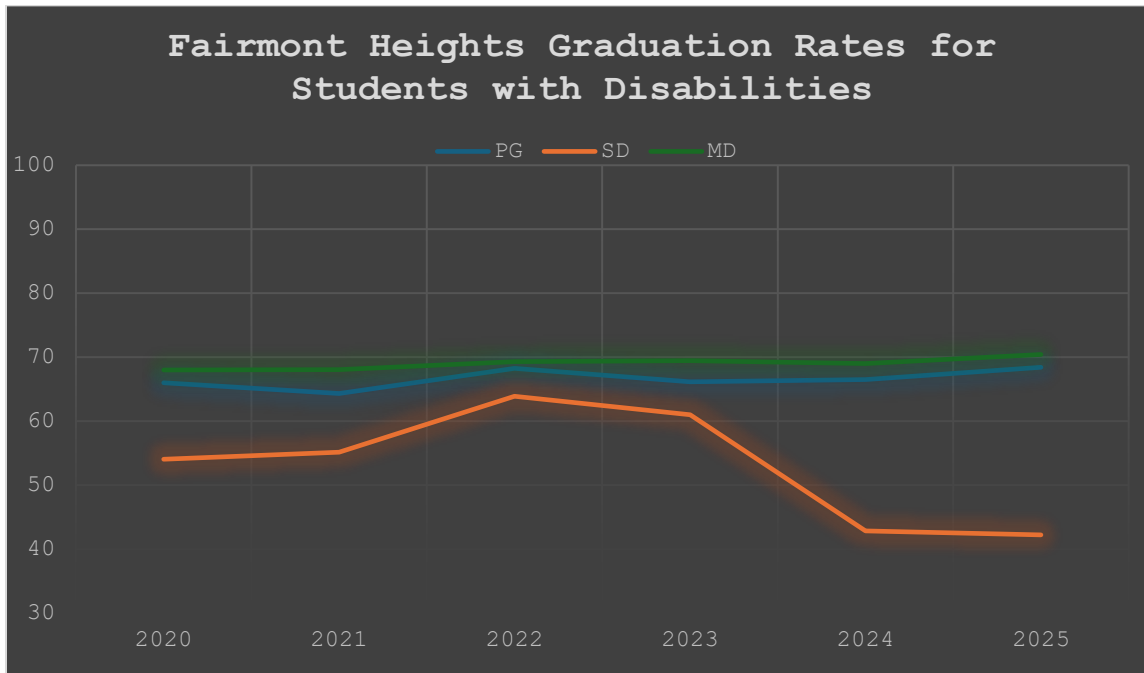

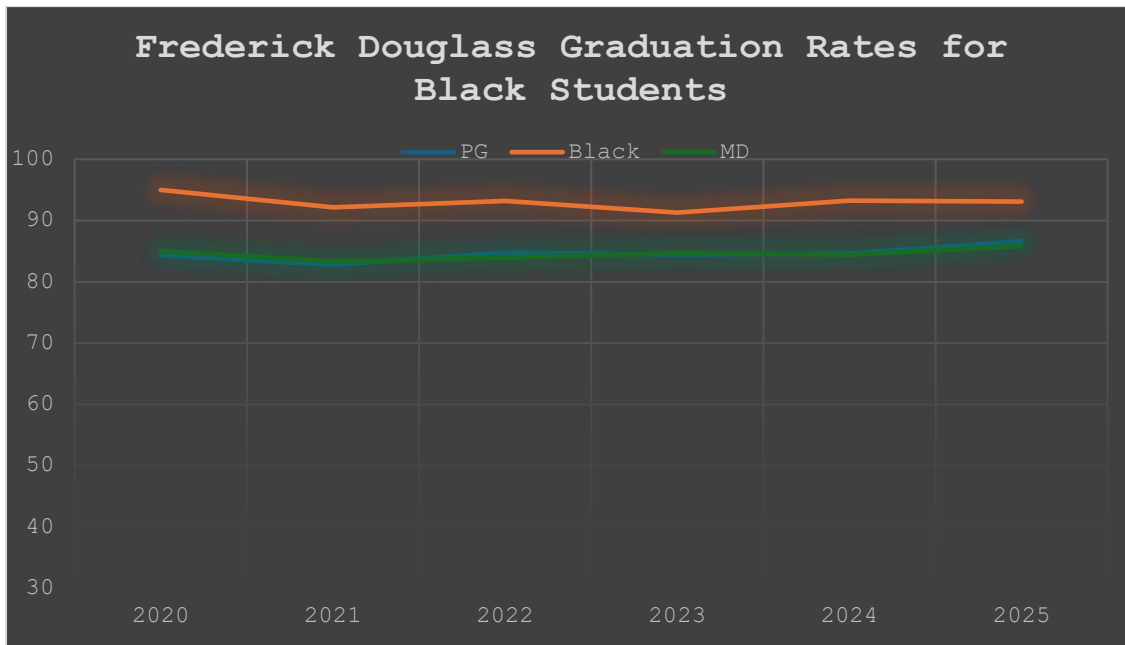


# Frederick Douglass High School

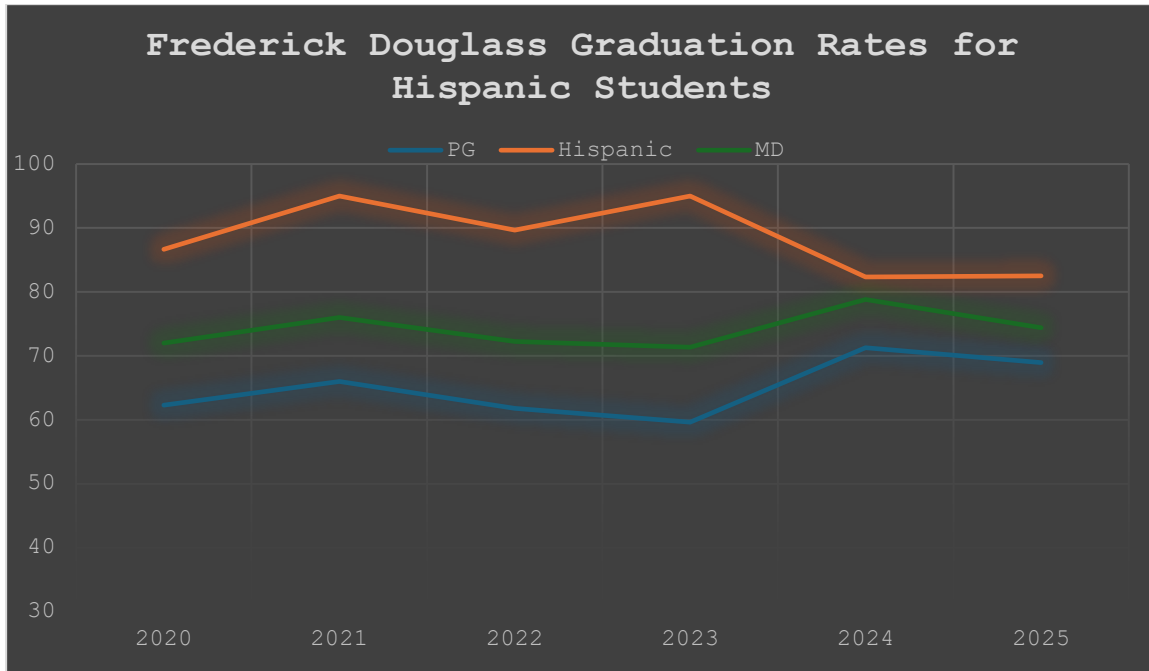

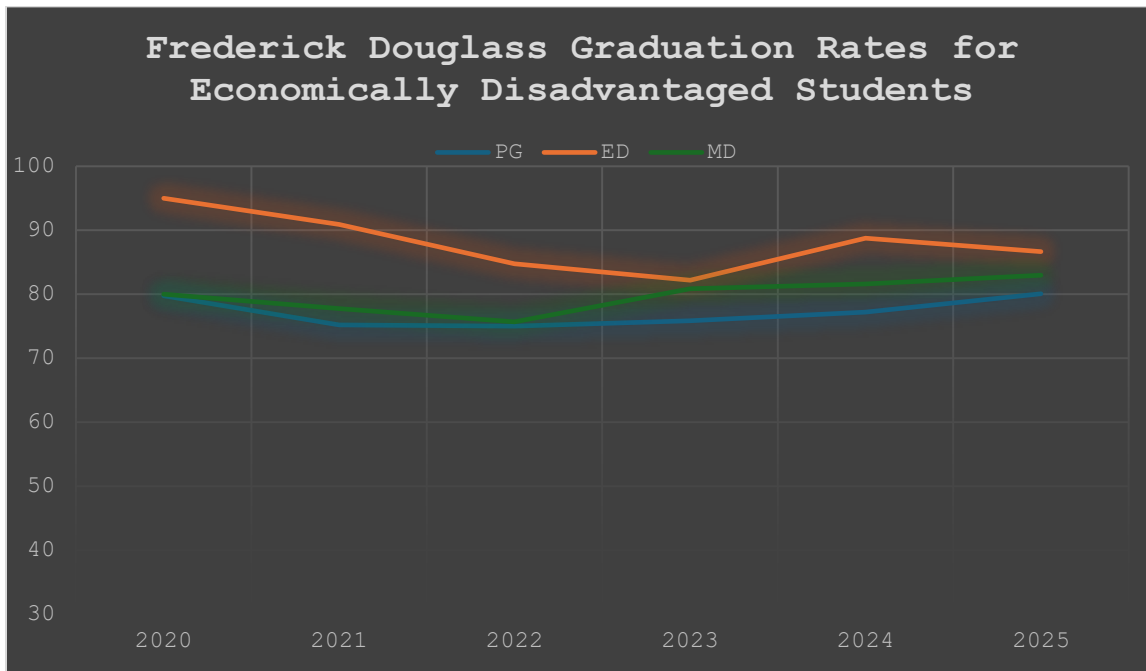
Over the past five years, African Americans have graduated at an average rate of 93%, above both the County and State average.



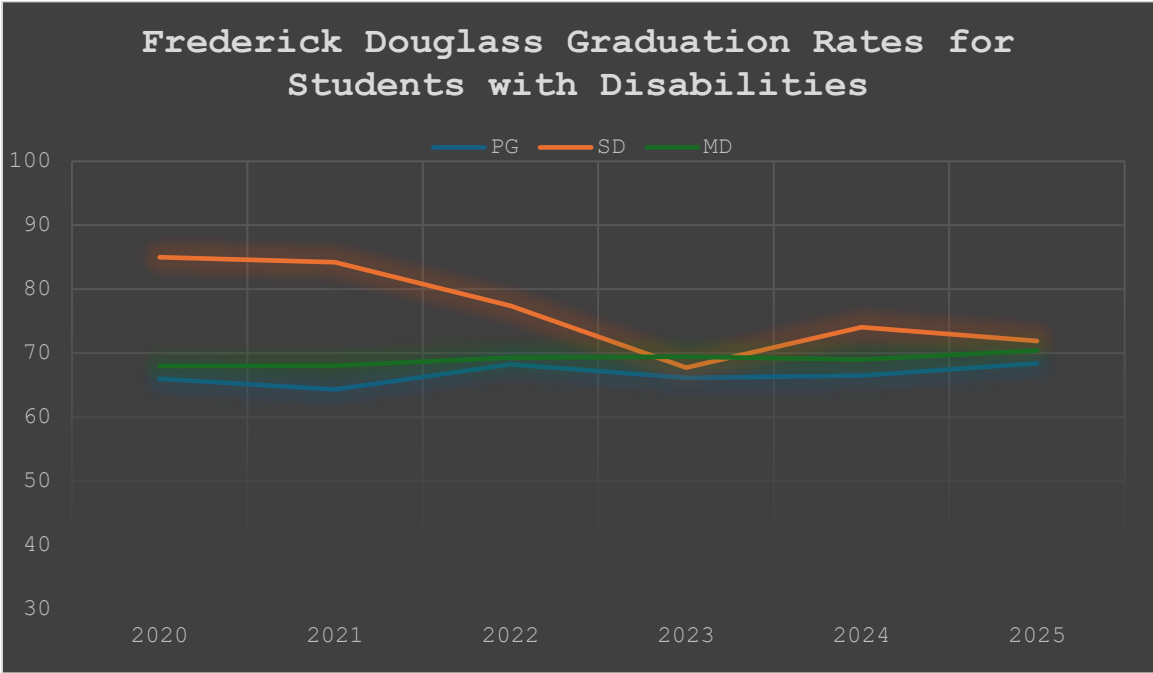

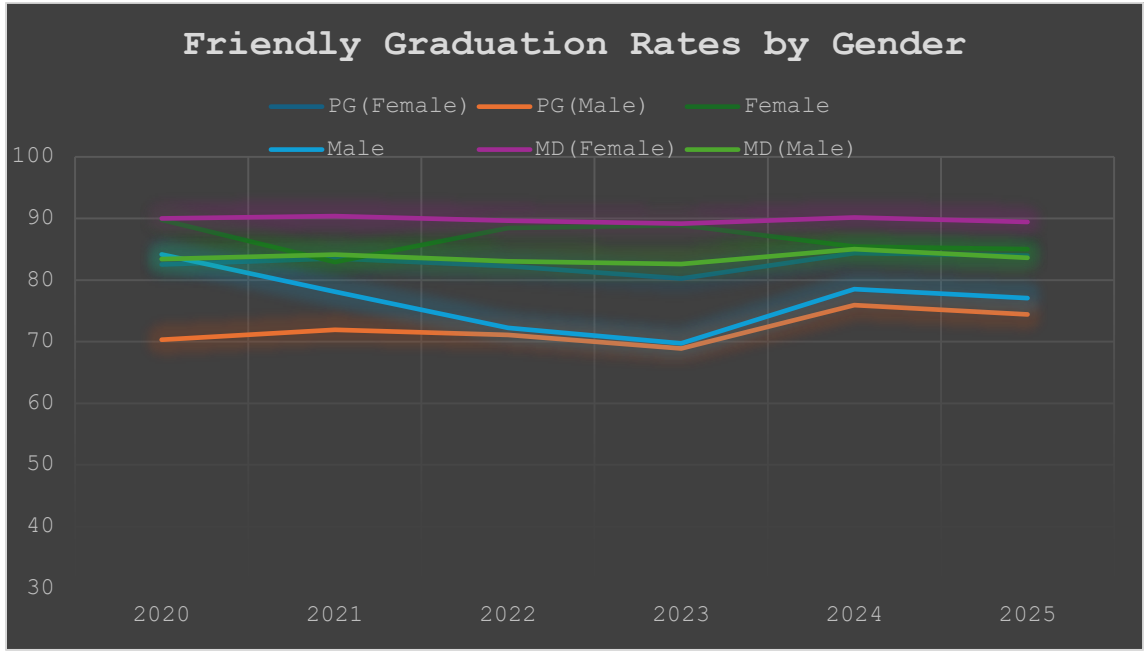

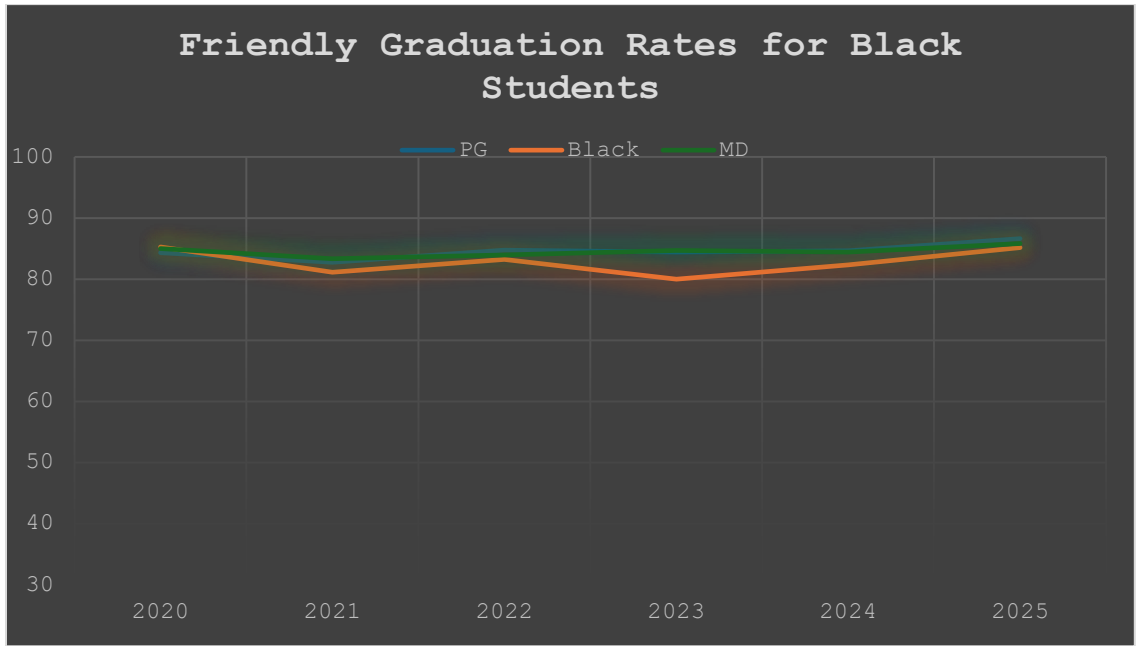


# Friendly High School

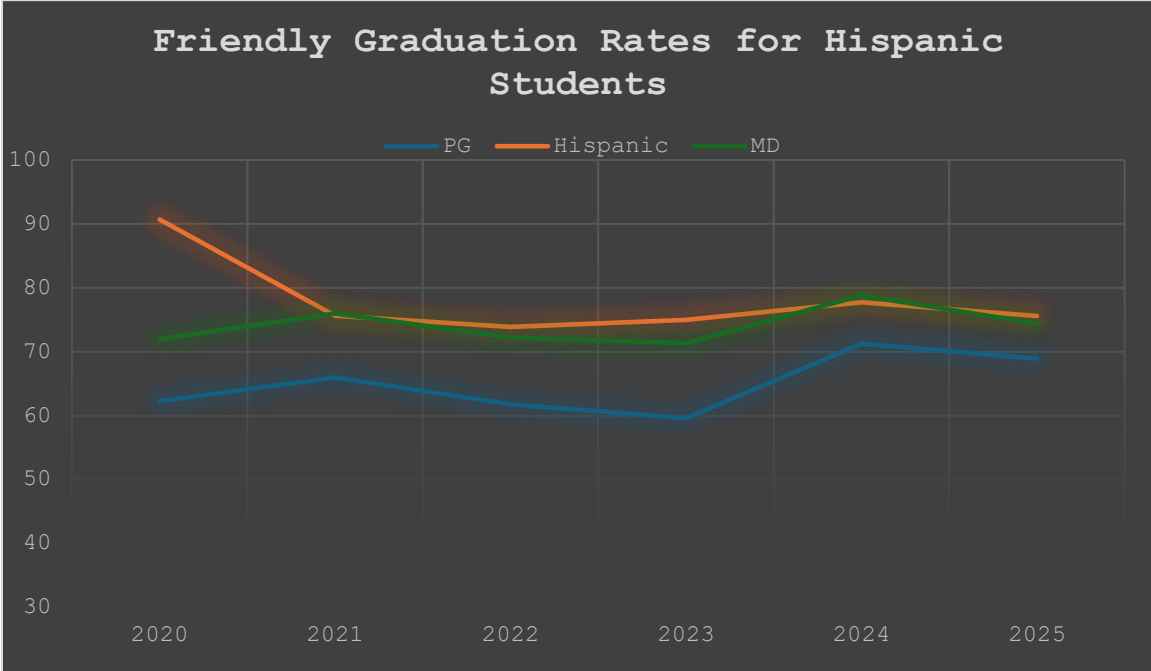

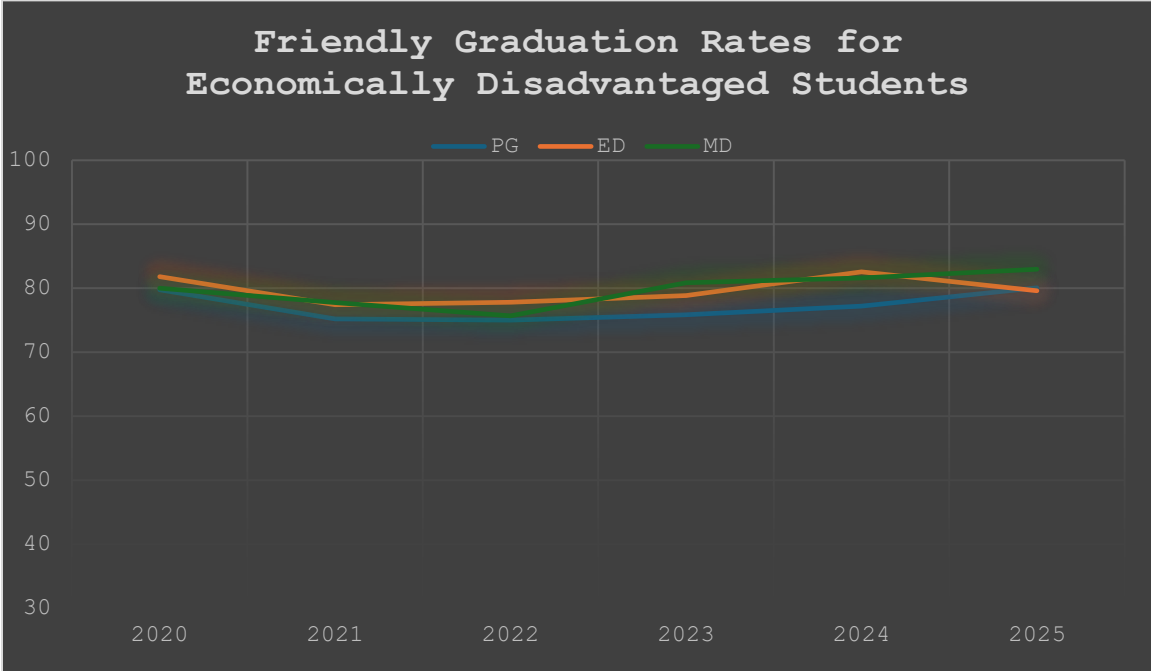

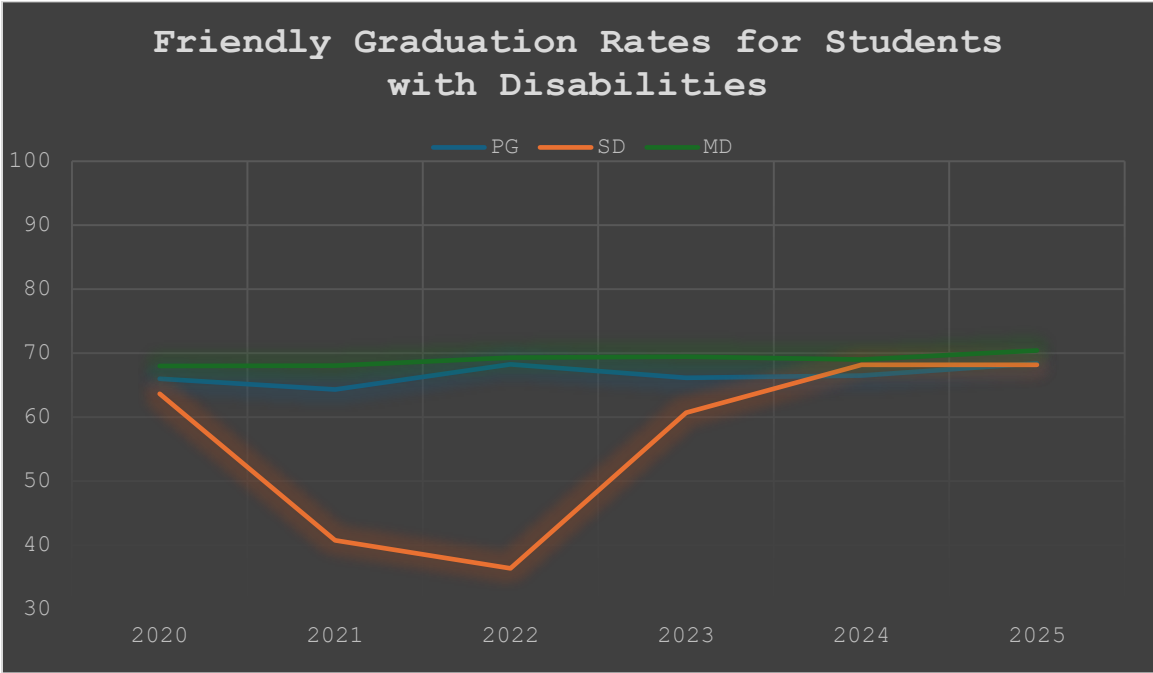

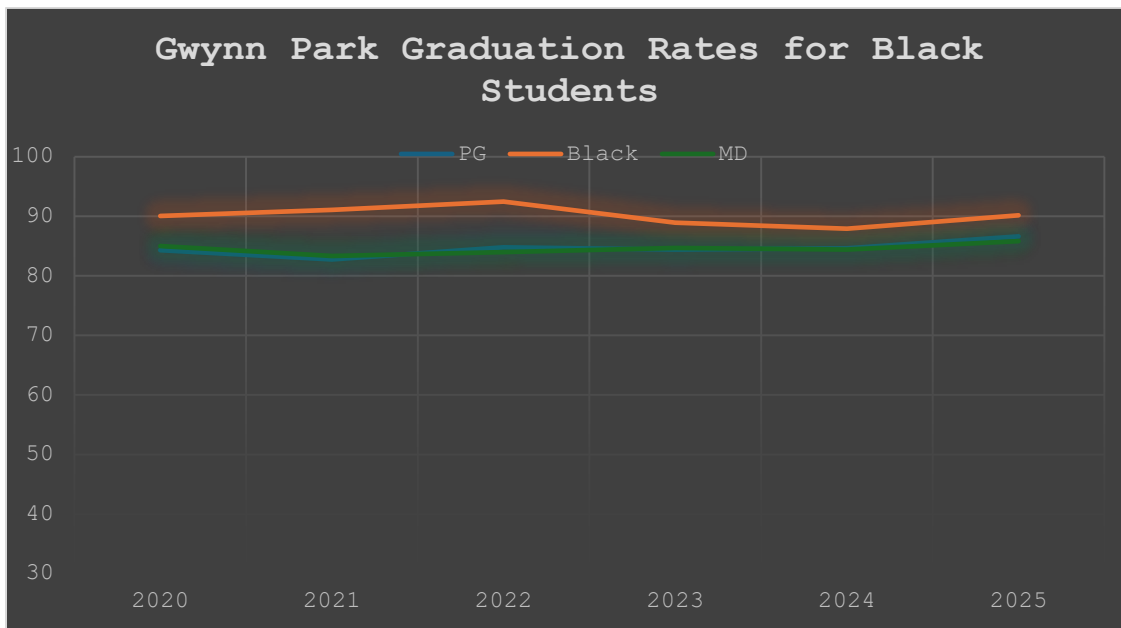


# Gwynn Park High School

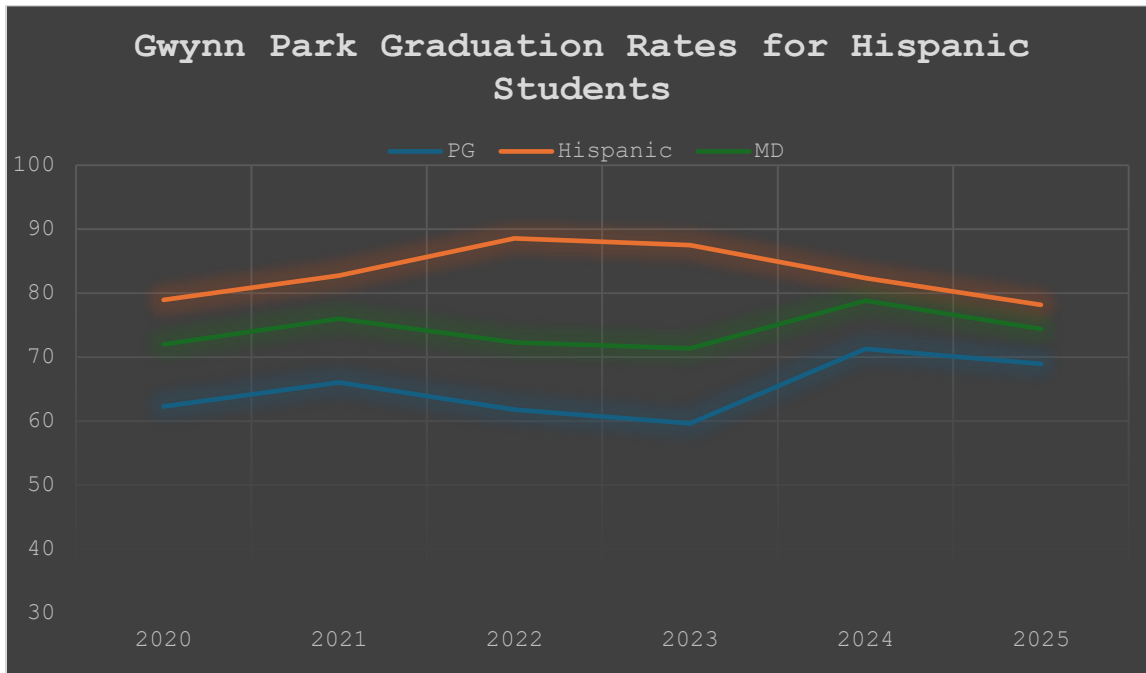

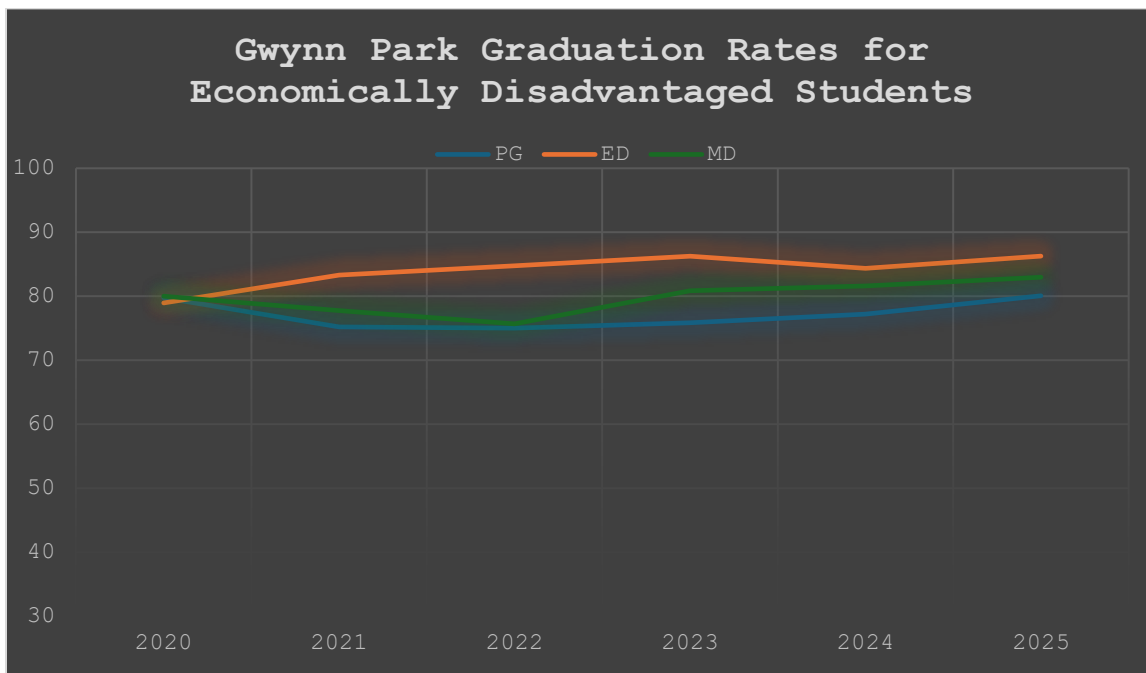
Graduation rates for African Americans at Gwynn Park High School climbed back above 90% after dropping below over the last two years.



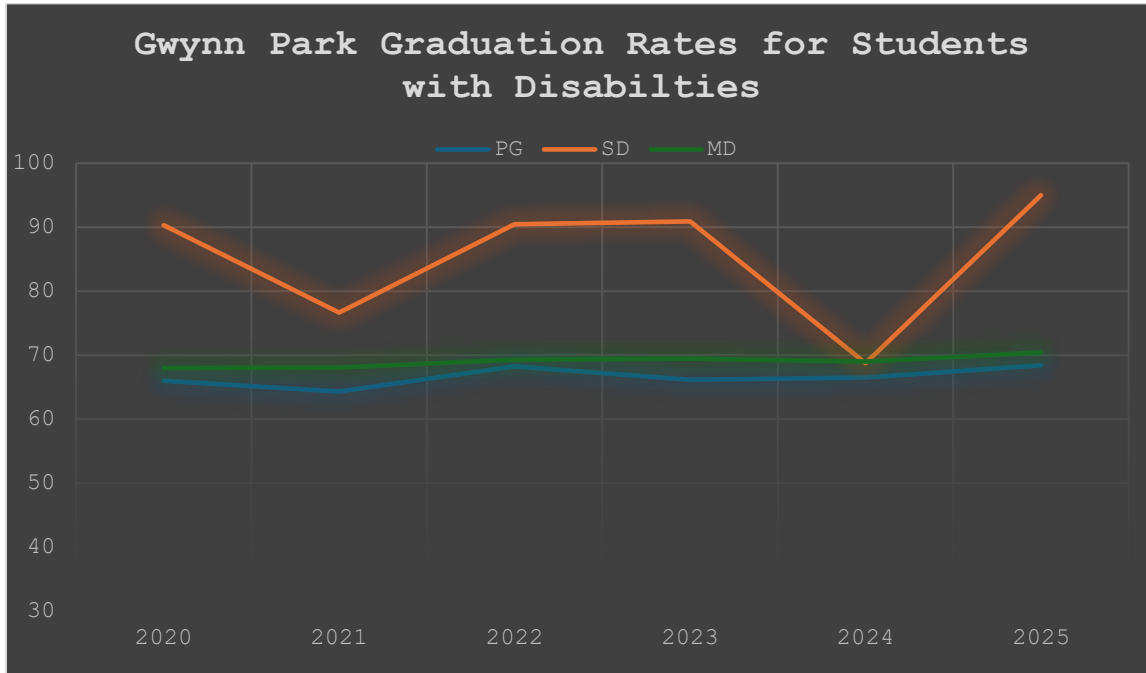

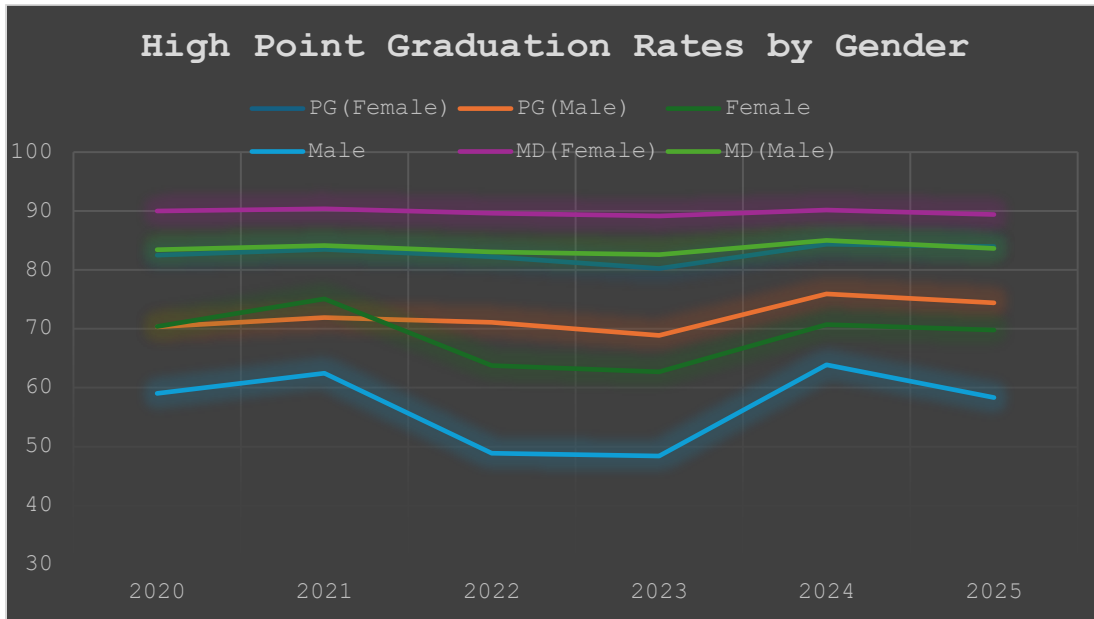

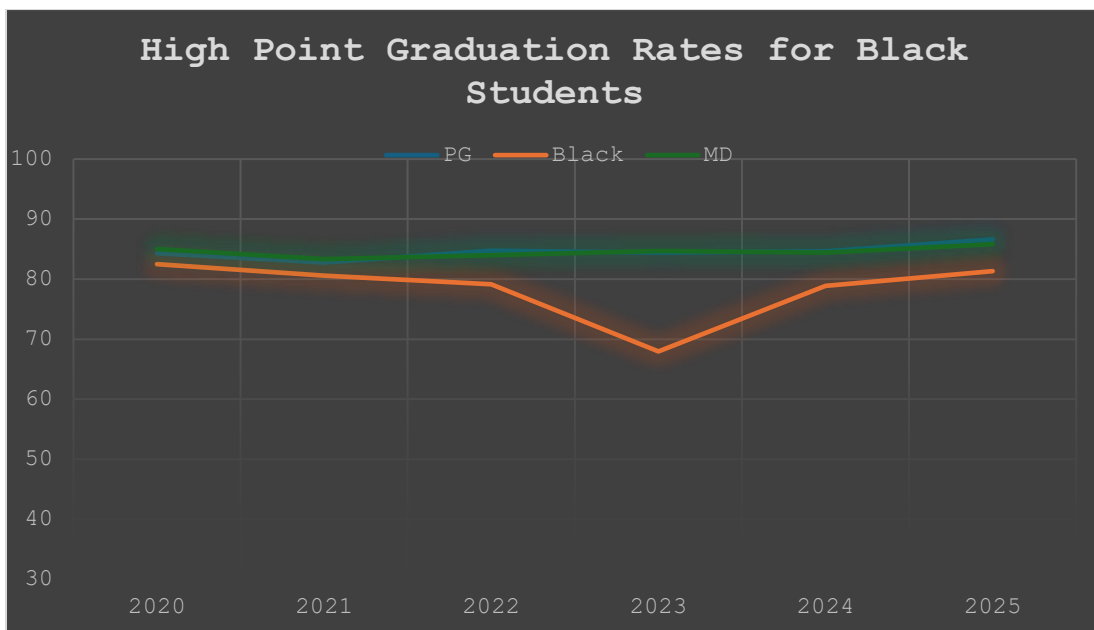


# High Point High School

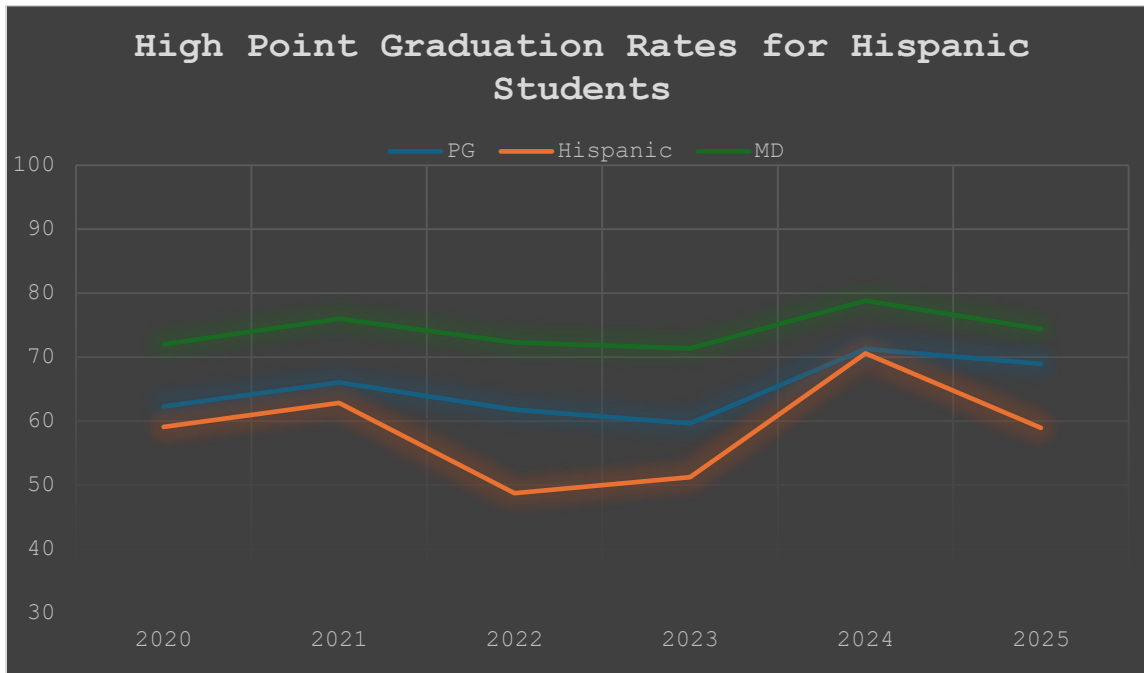

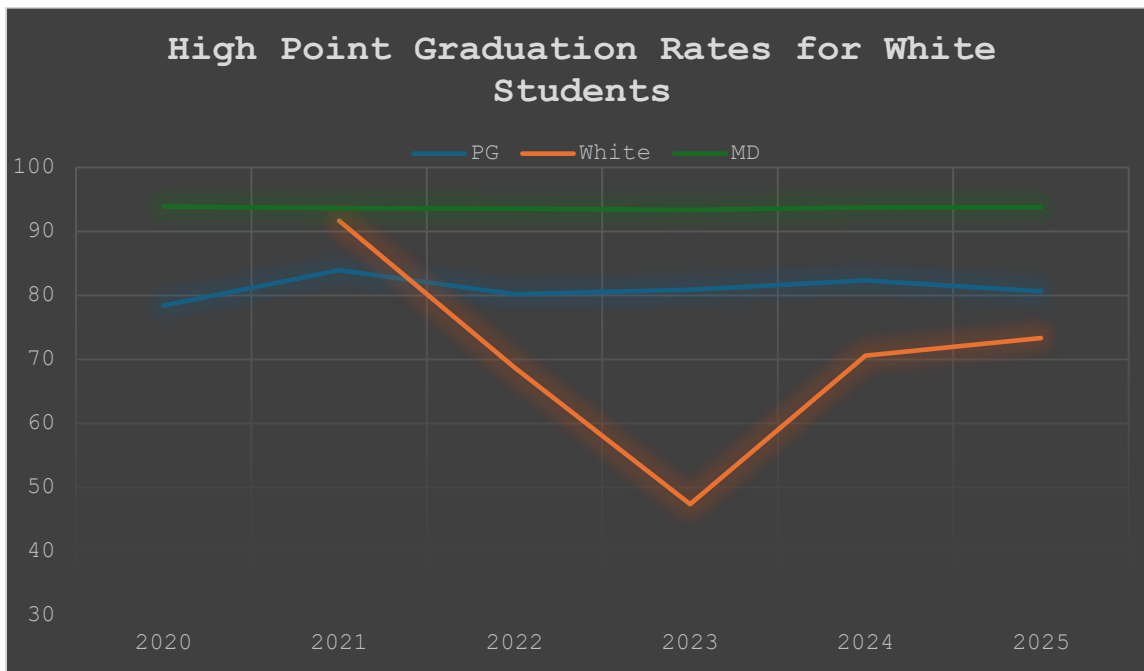
Graduation rates for African Americans at High Point experienced a sharp decline in 2023 but has largely remained around 80% over the past six years.



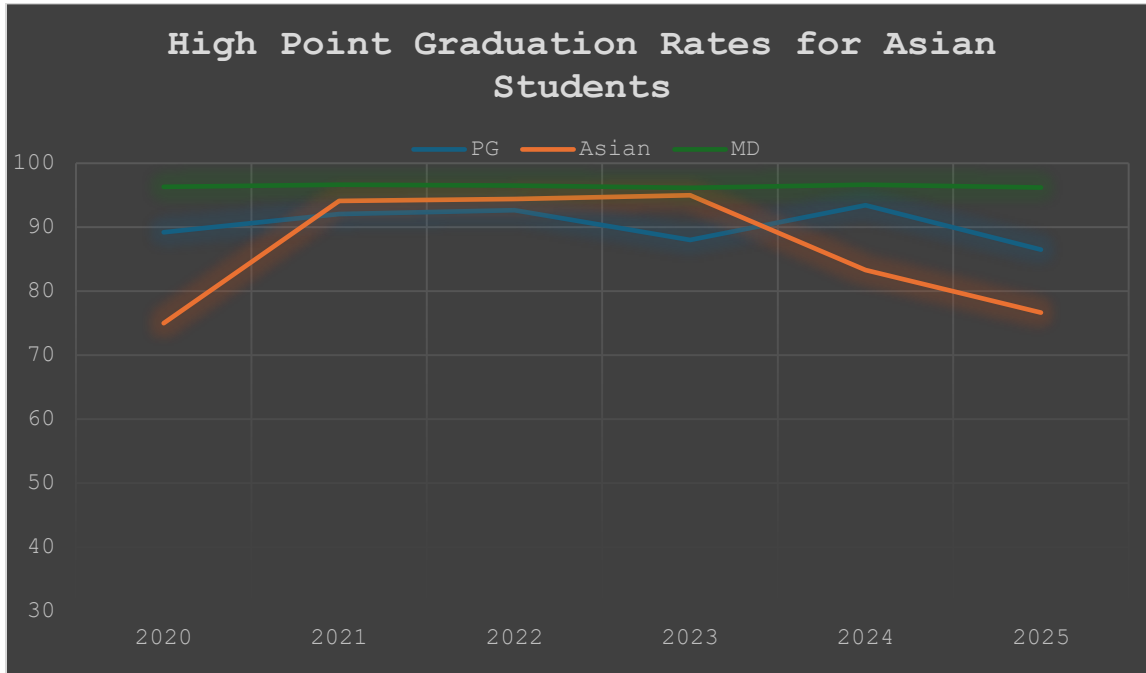

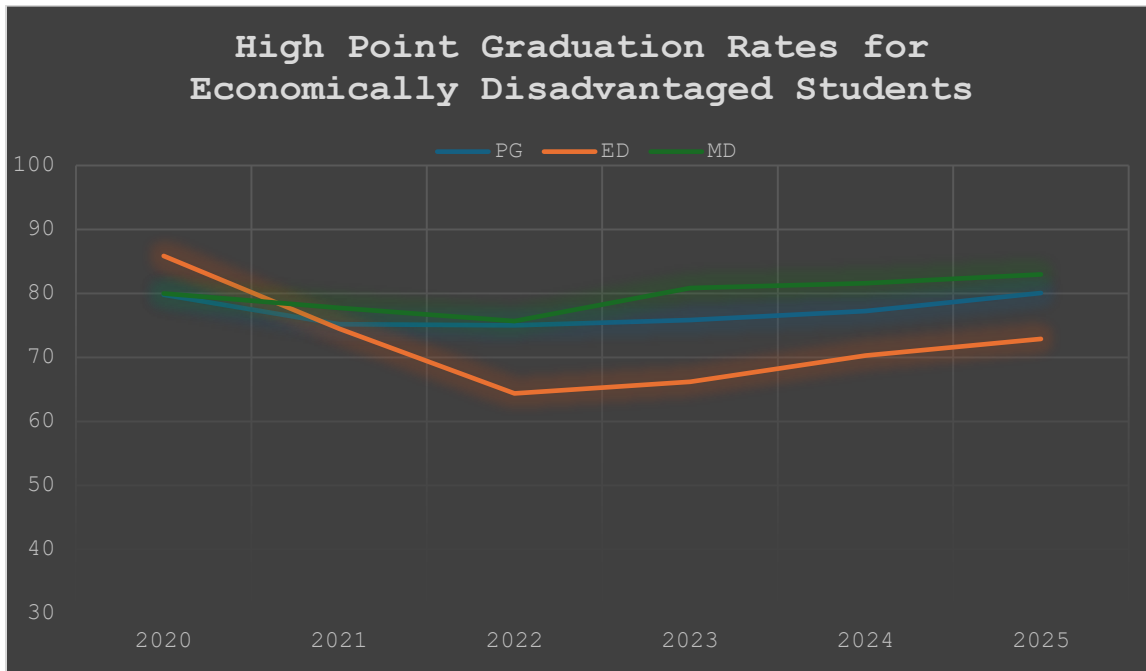

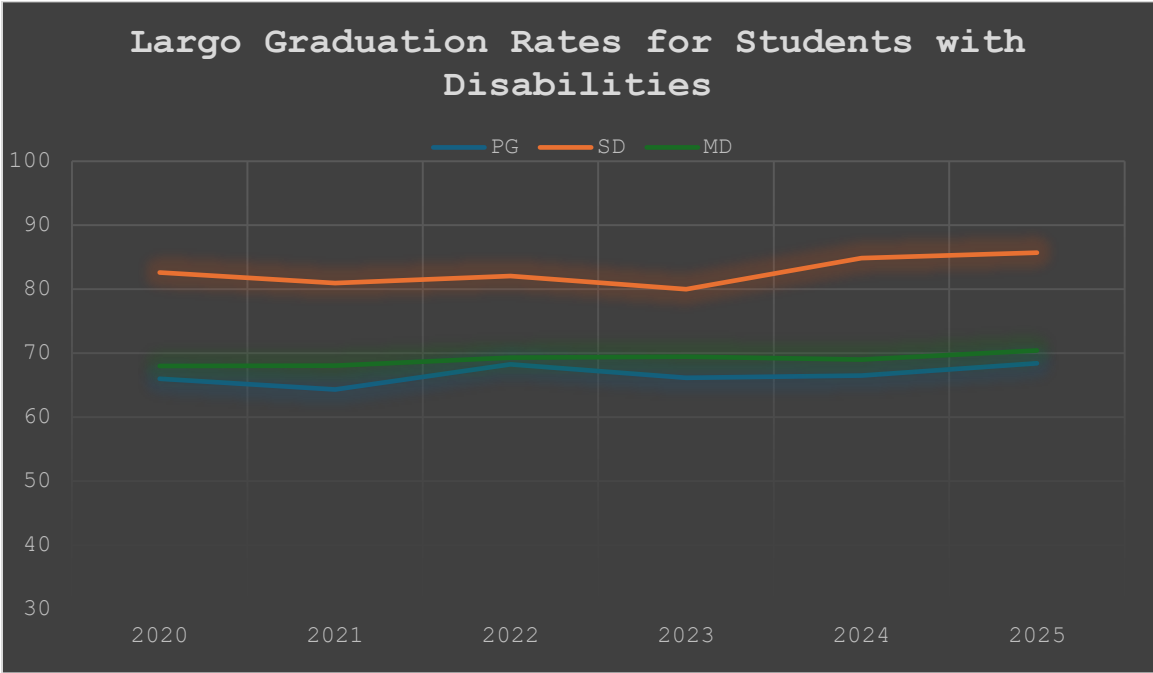

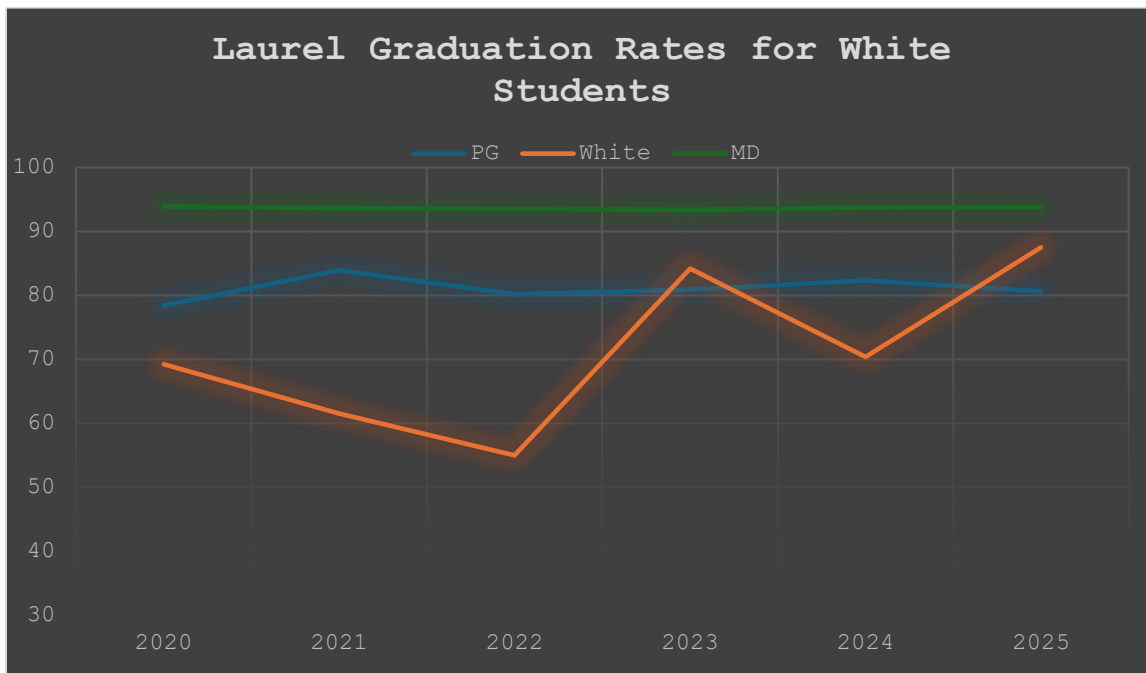
The graduation rate for African Americans at Laurel High School has hovered around 80% over the last five years, slightly below the County and State averages.



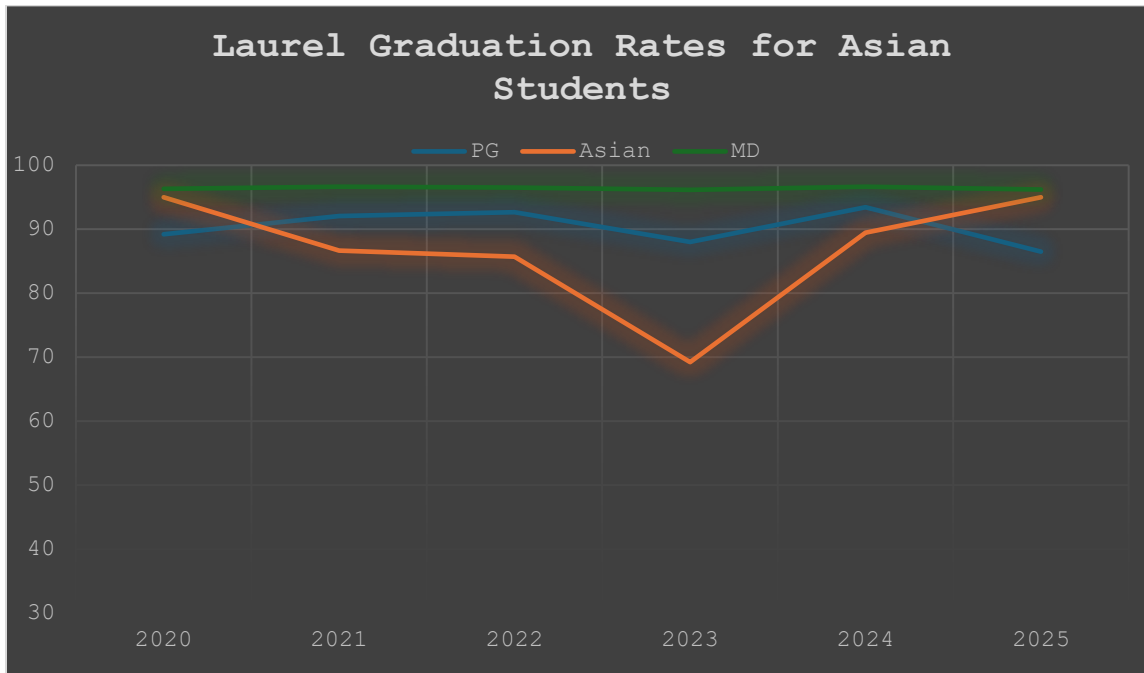

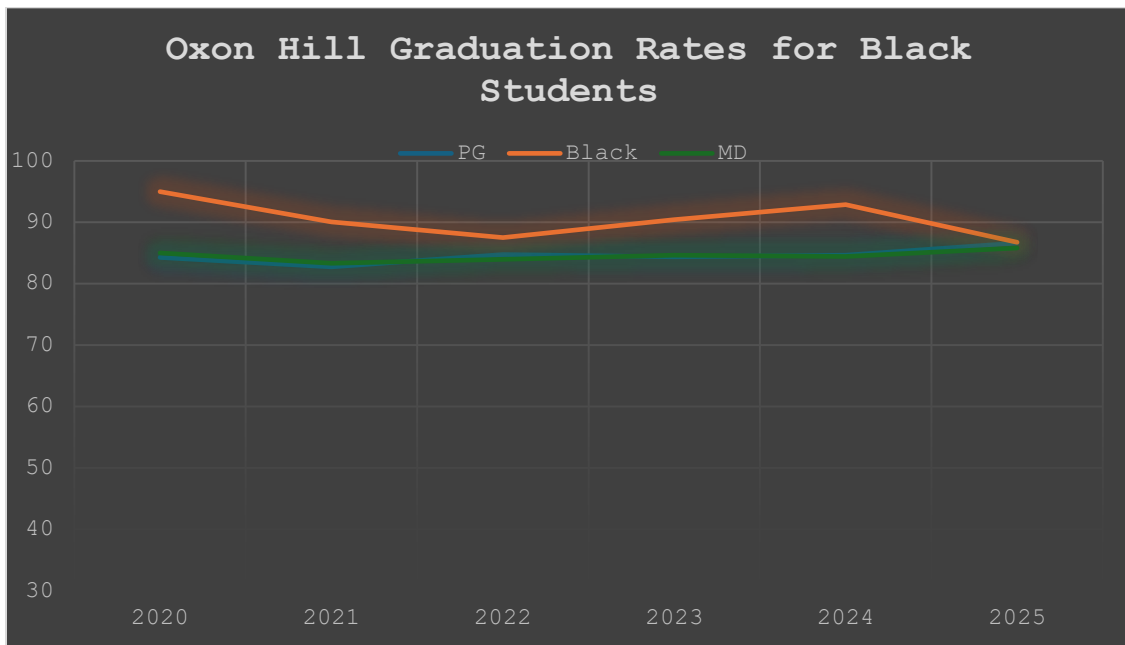


# Oxon Hill High School

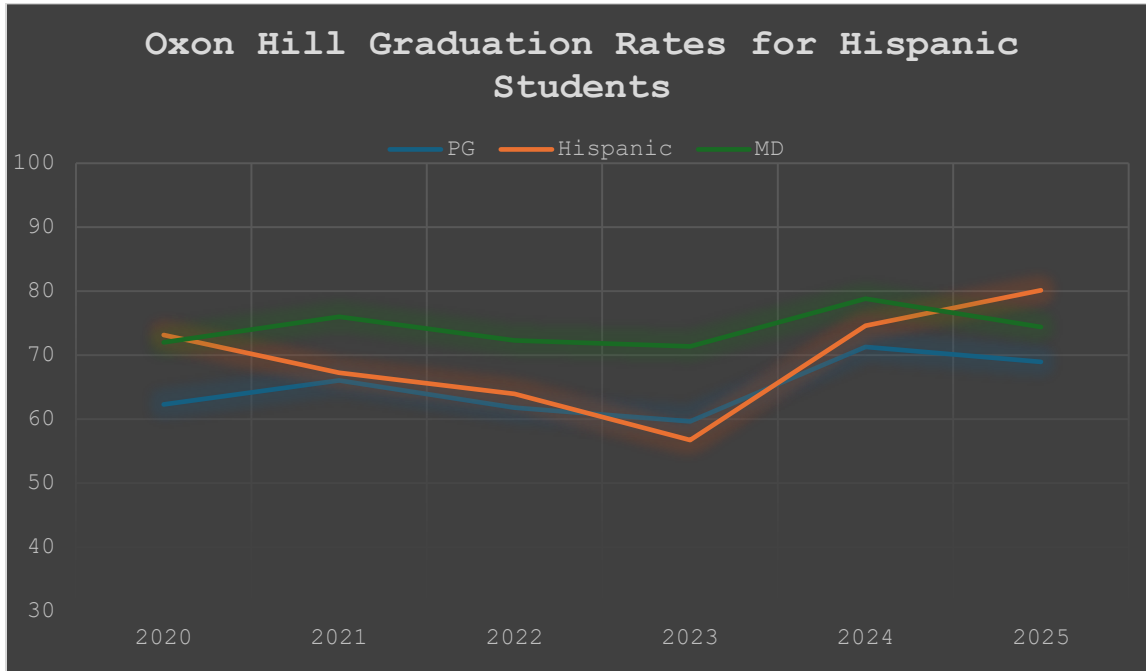

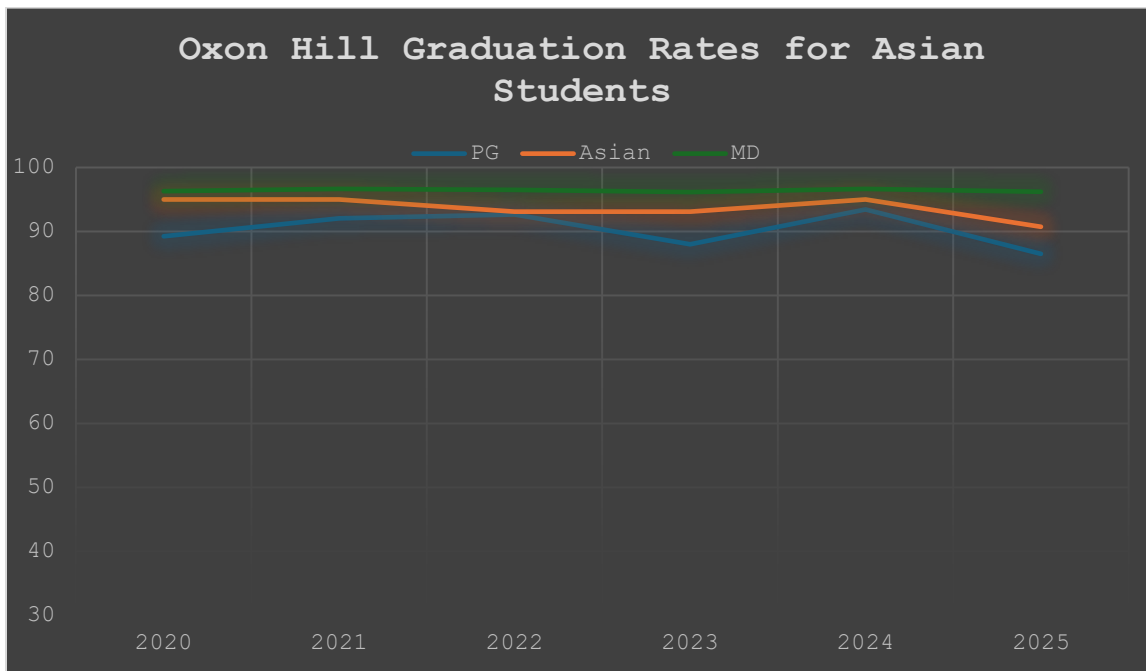
African Americans have graduated at an average rate of 90.4% over the last six years, which is above County and State rates.



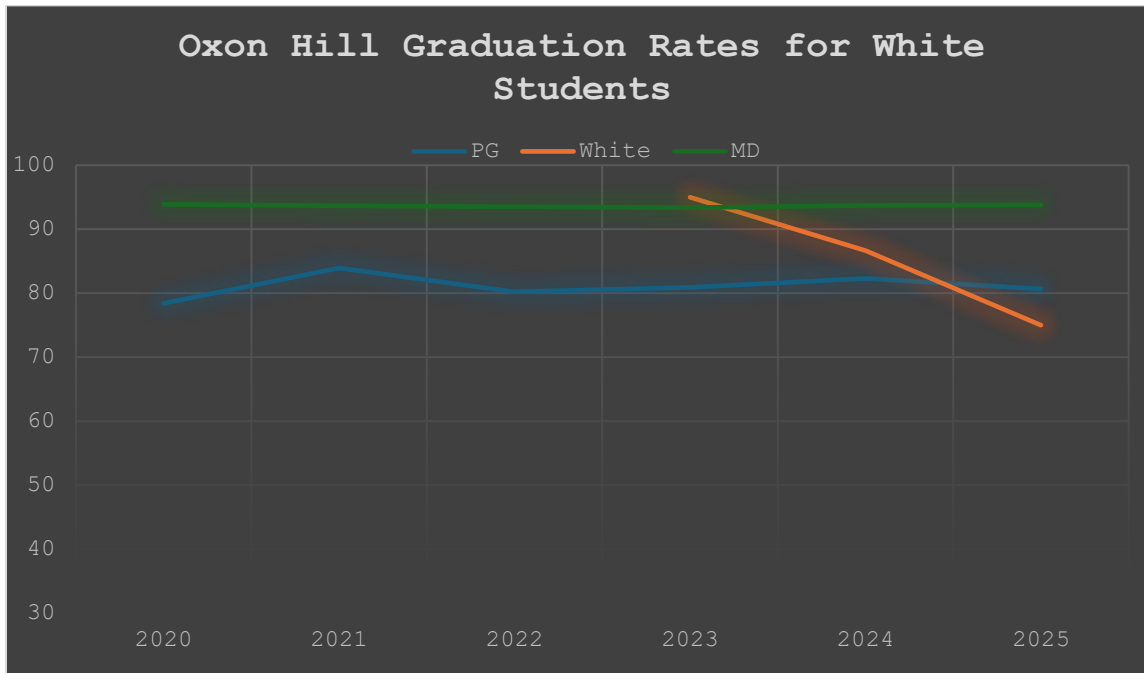
The Hispanic graduation rate gradually decreased from 2020 to 2023, before rising by nearly 24% over the past two years.



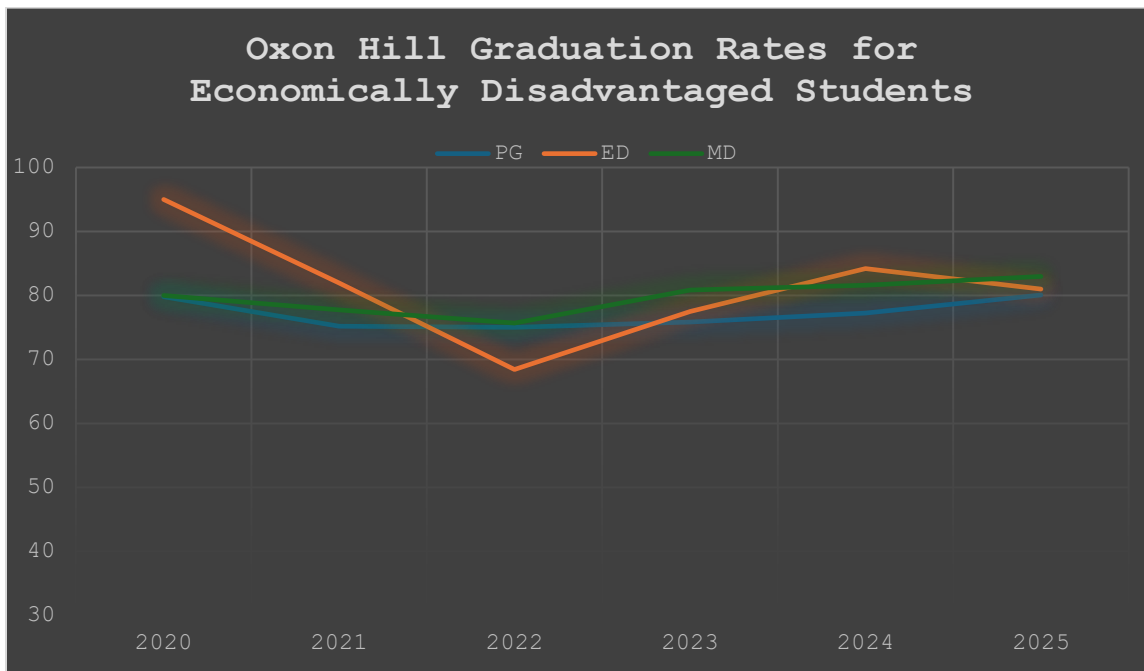

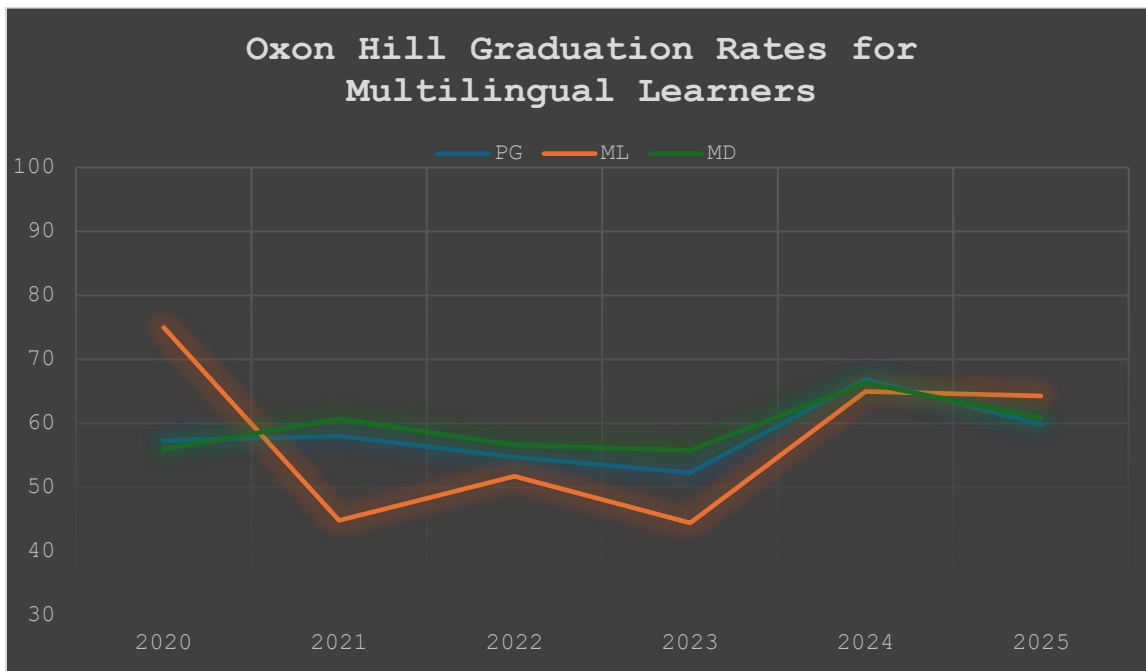

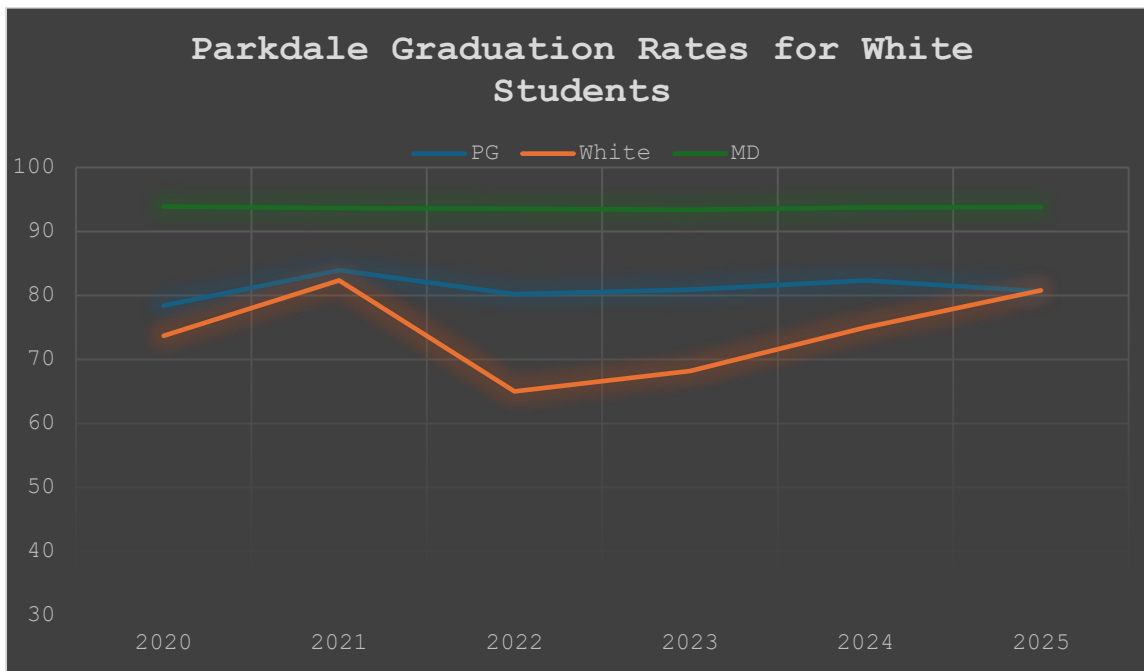
The graduation rate for African American students at Parkdale jumped above 90% for the first time in at least six years.



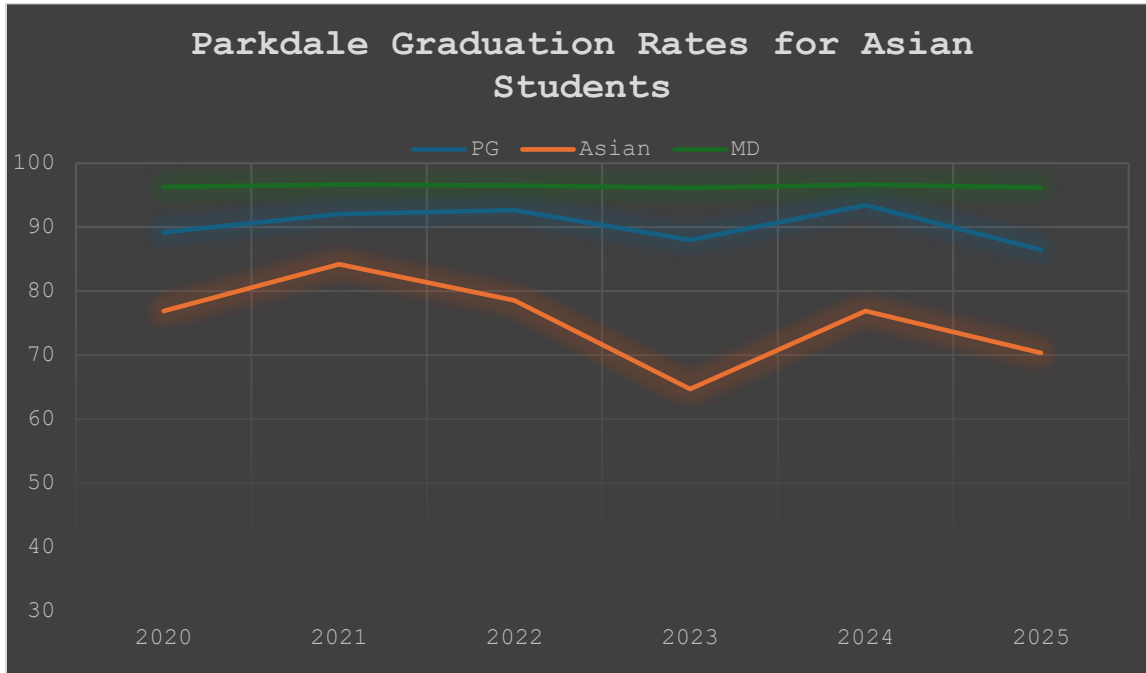

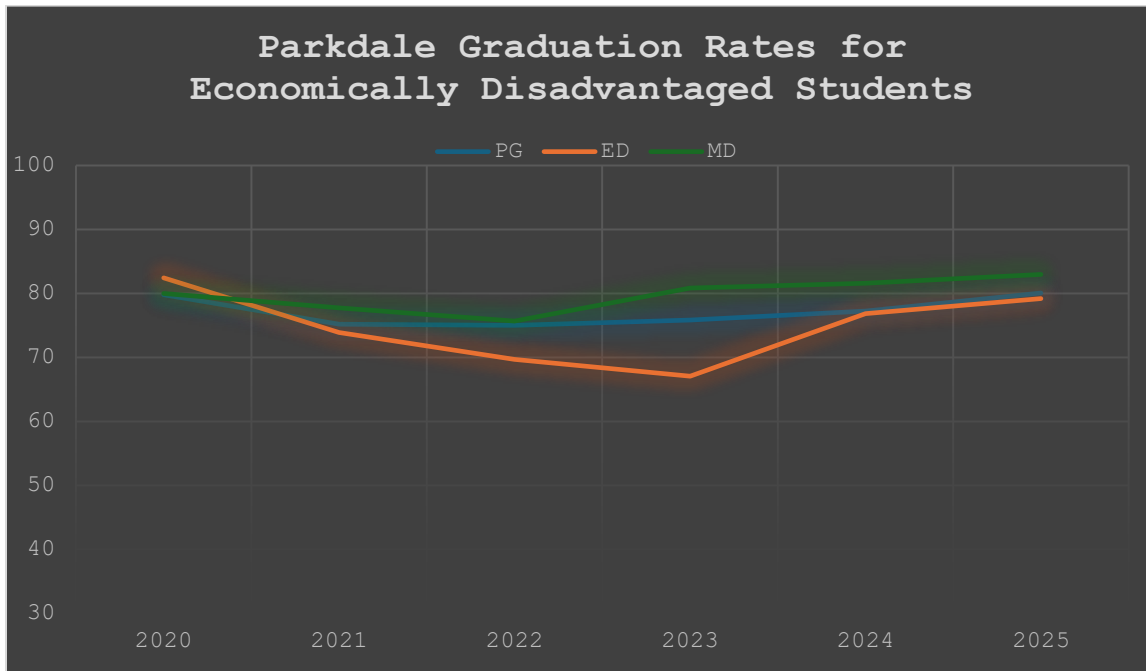

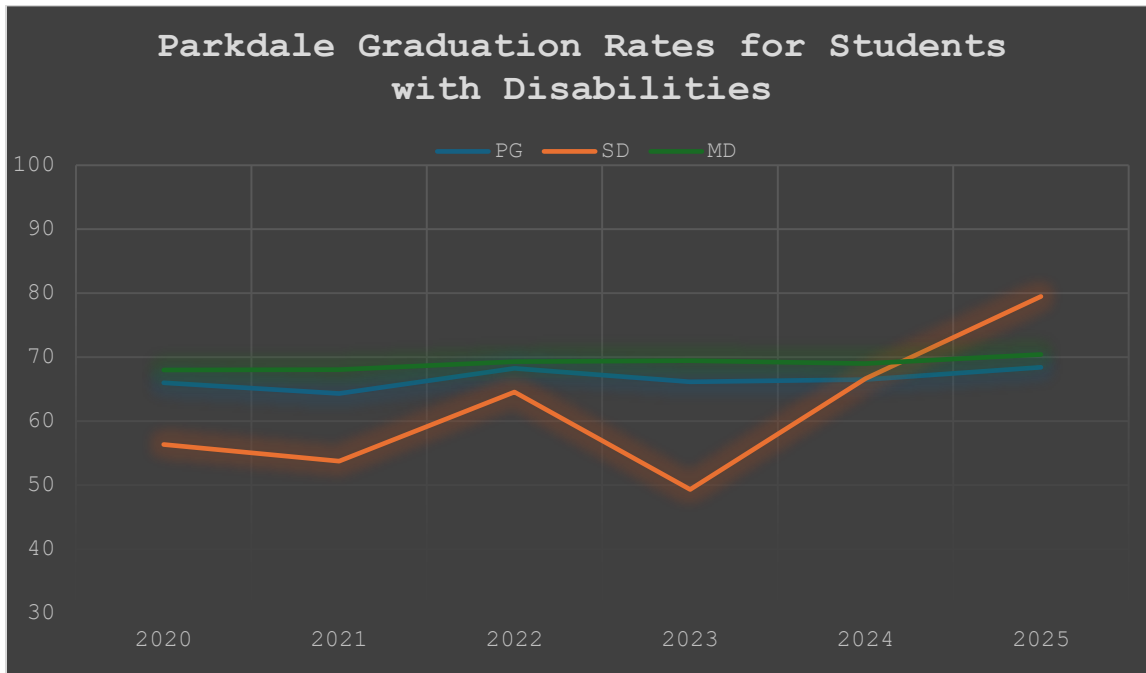

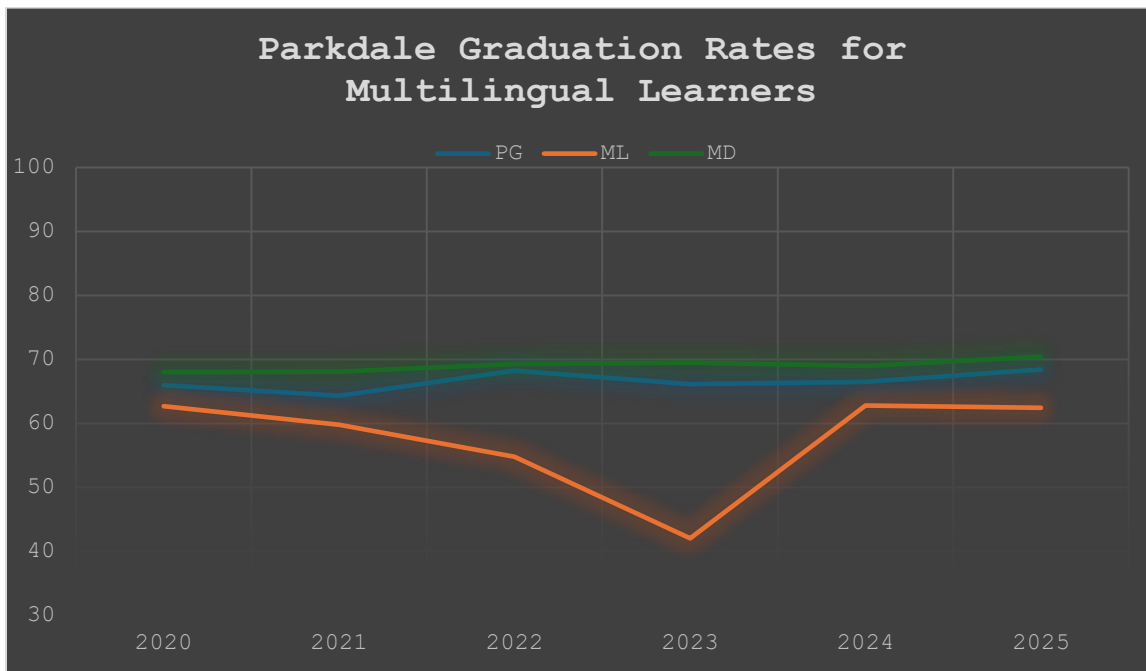

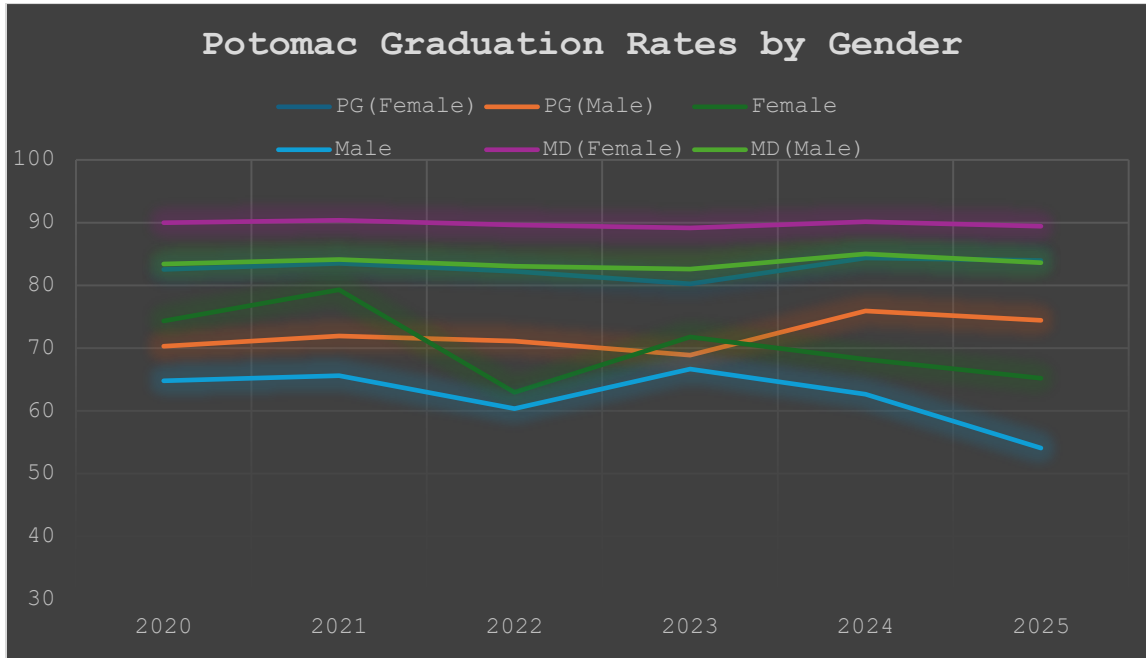

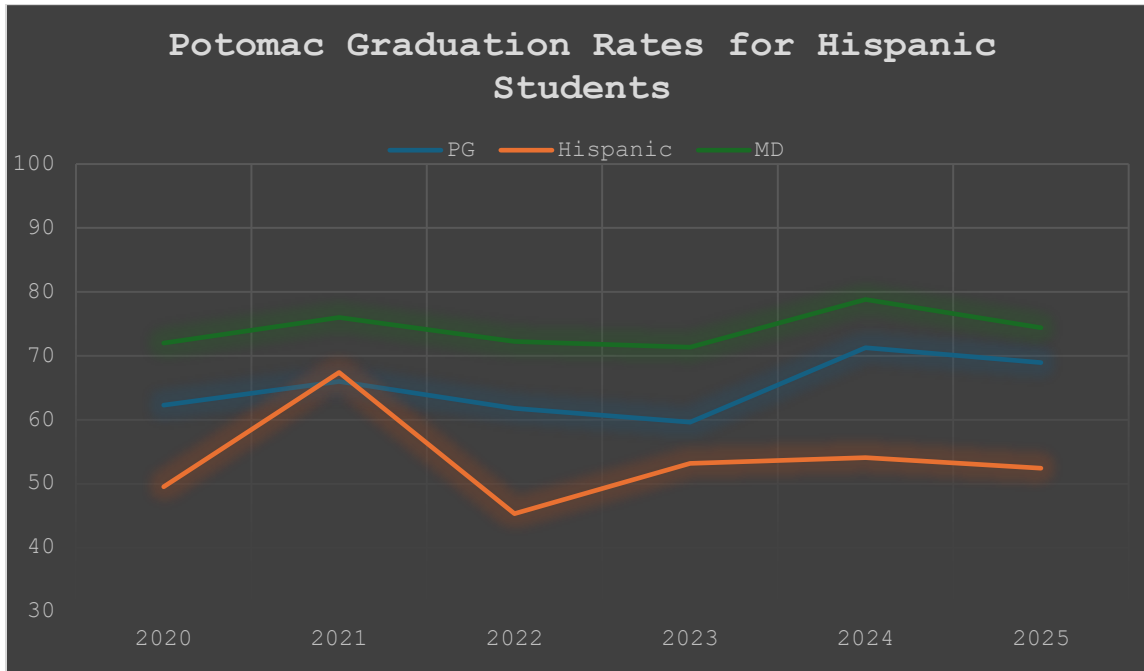
Over the last two years, the graduation rate at Potomac High School has been trending downwards. Graduation rates for both male and female students have dropped over the last six years by over 9%.



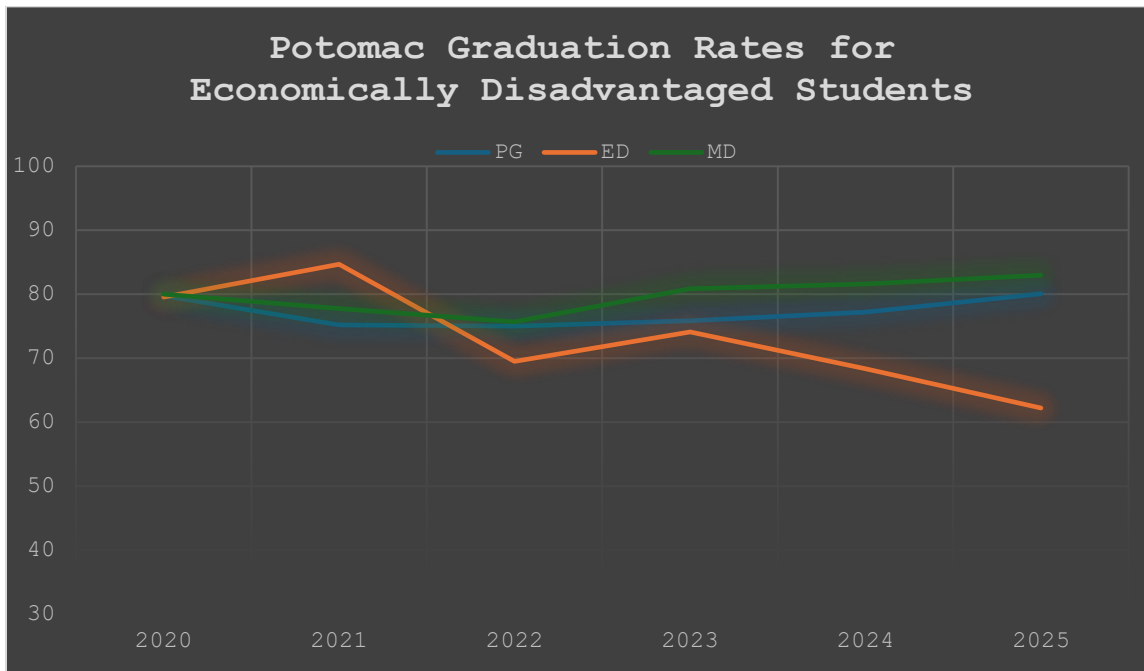

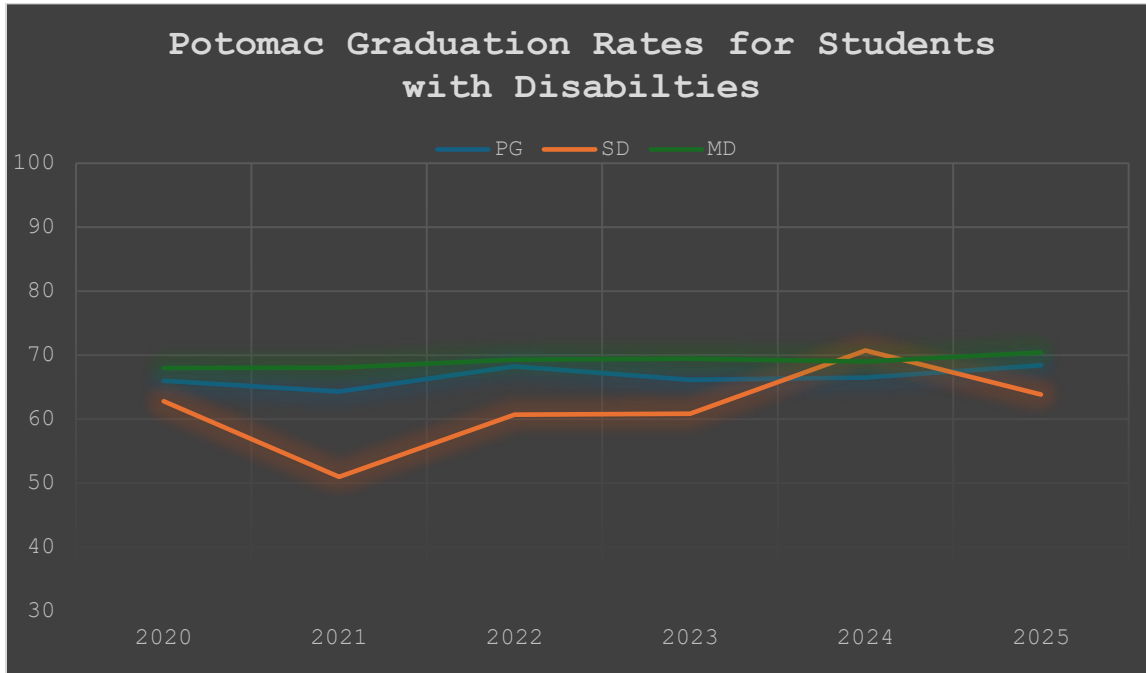

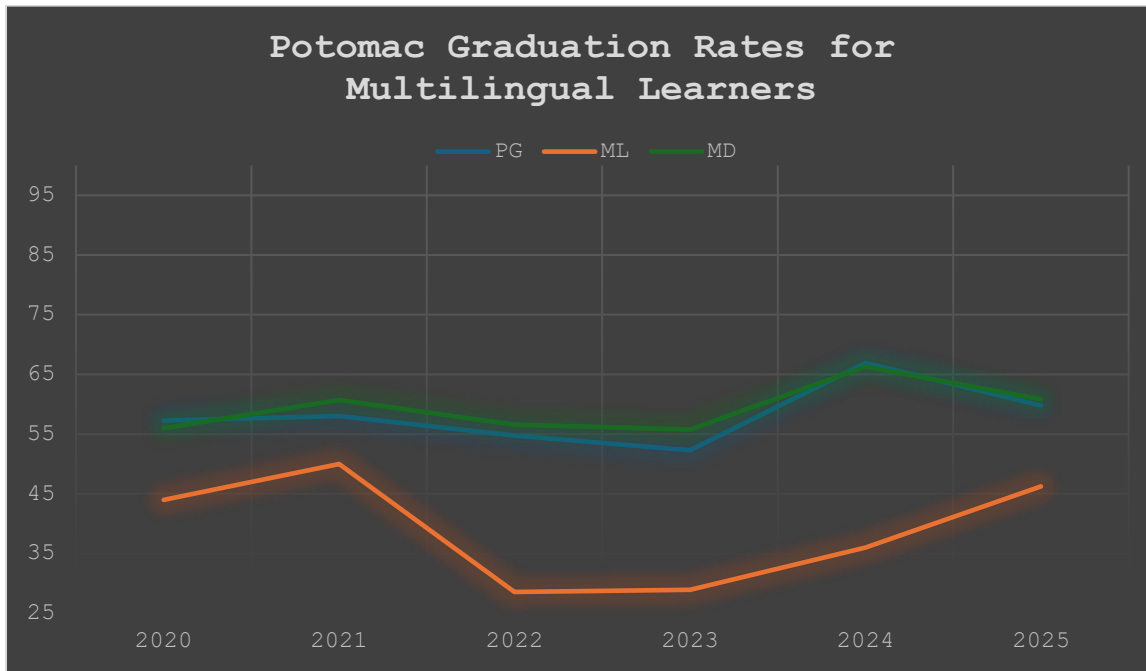

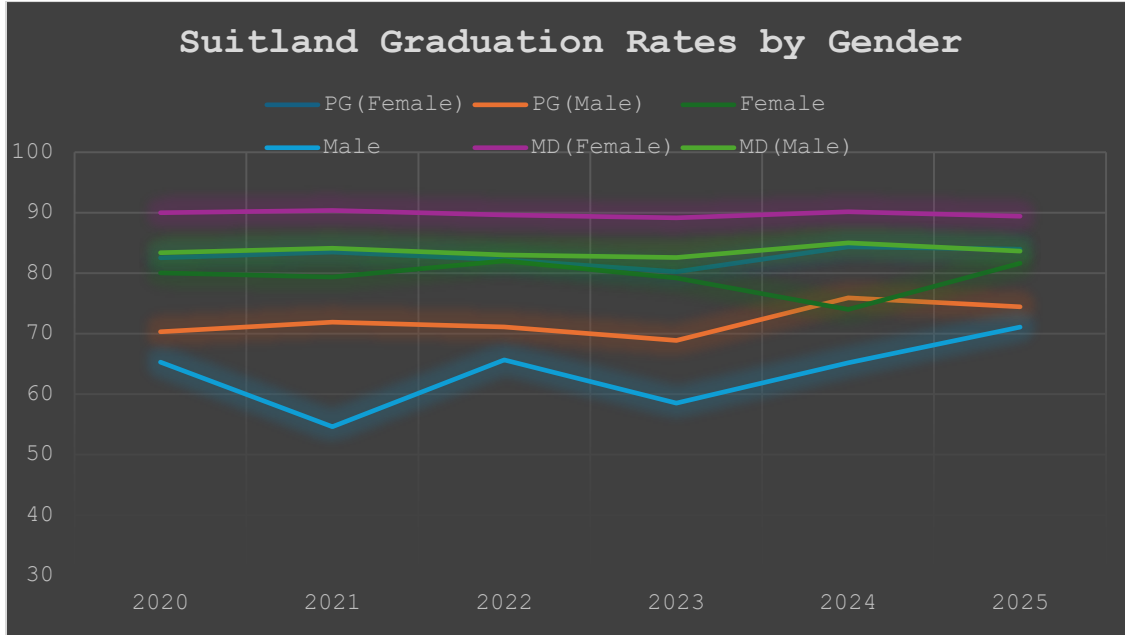

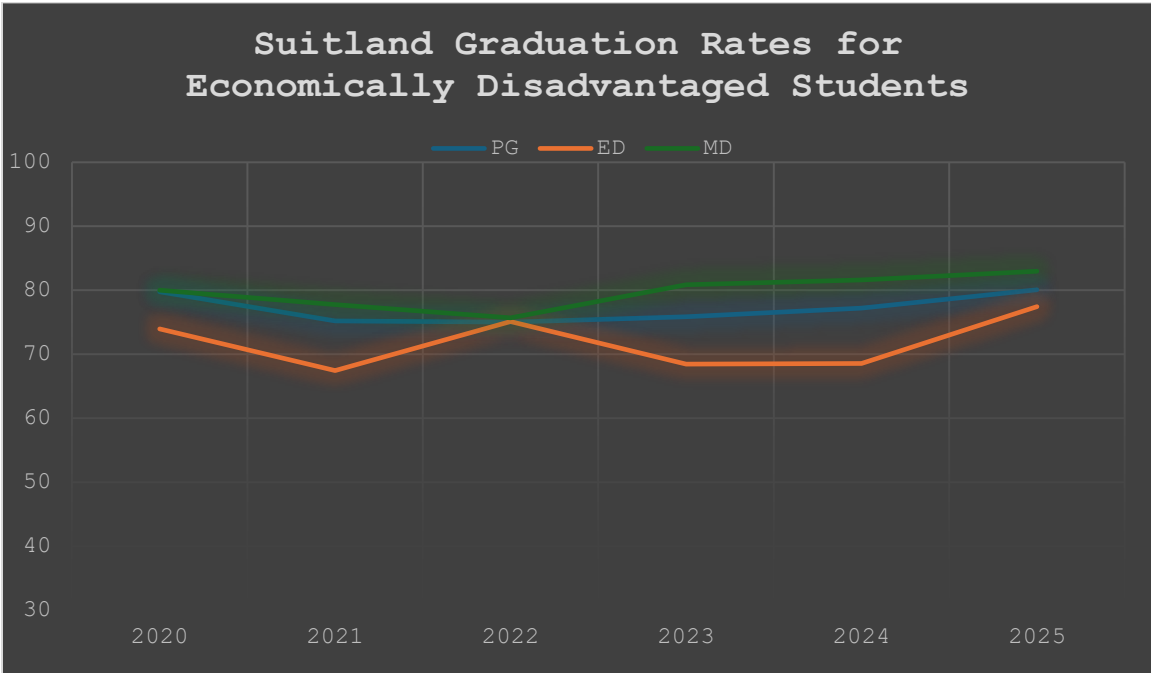

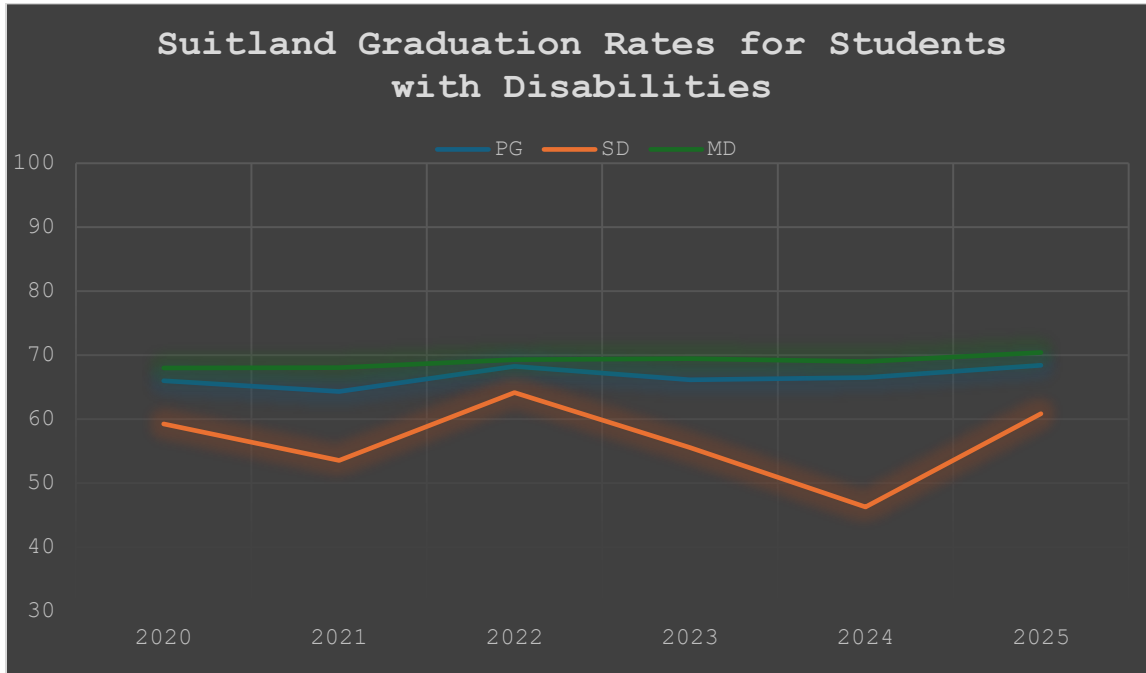

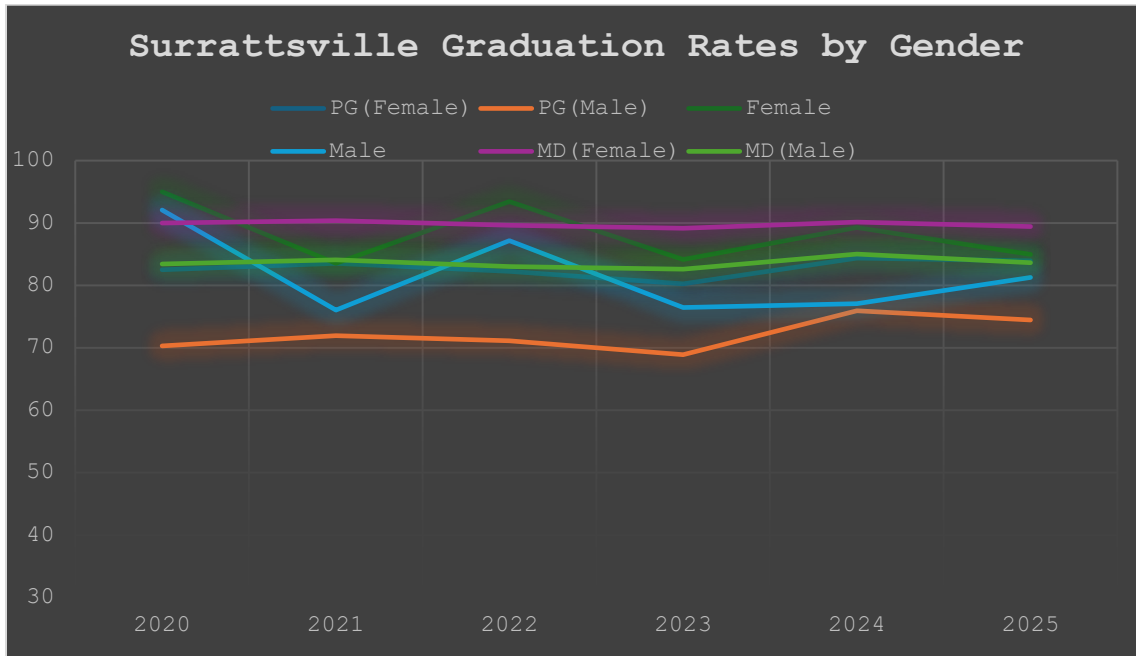

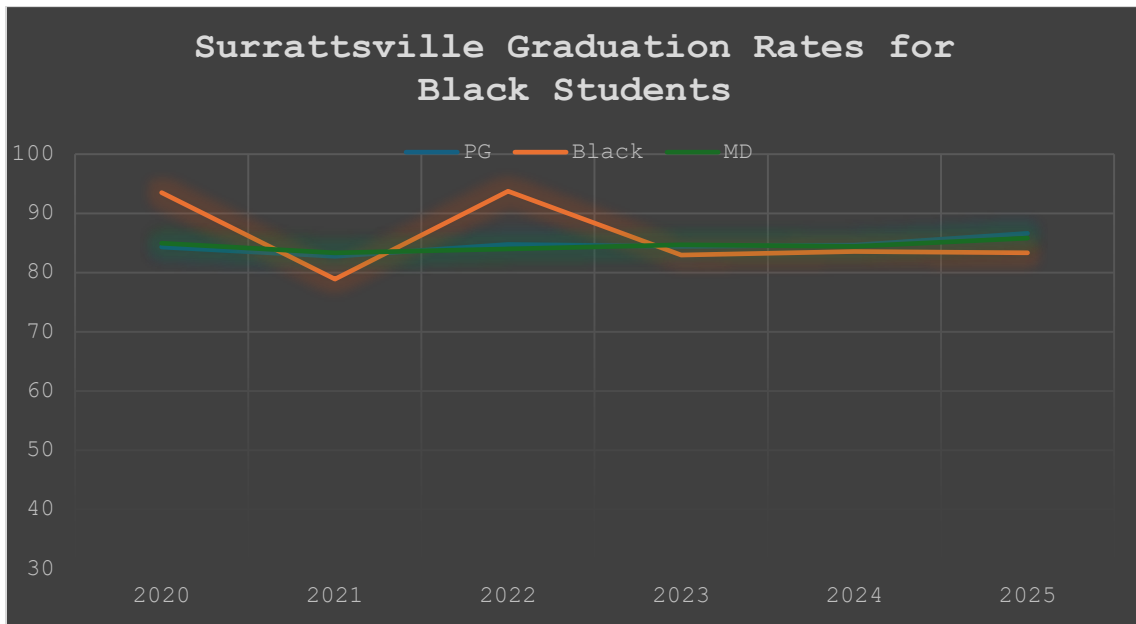


# Surrattsville High School

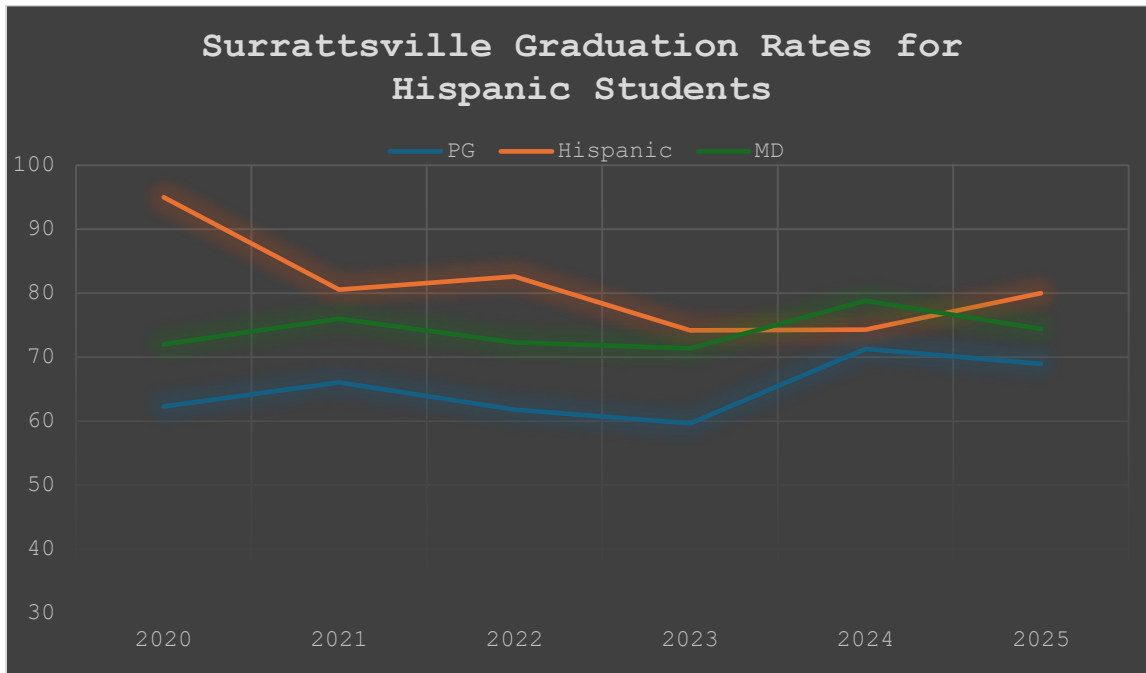

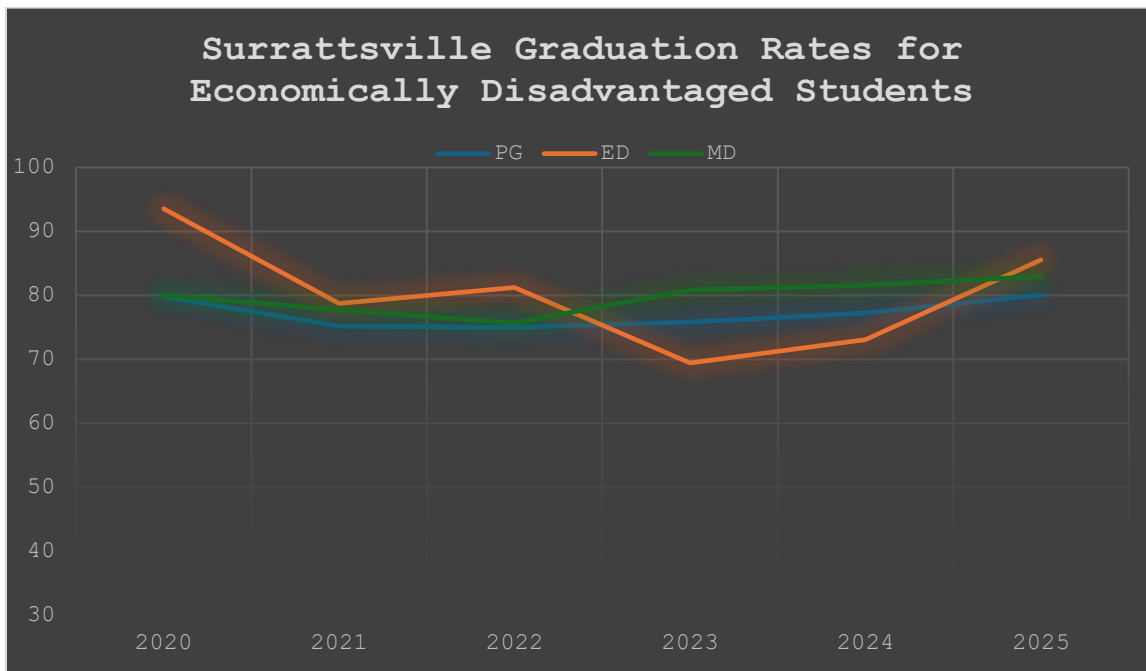
Since 2023, the graduation rate for African Americans has hovered around 83%.



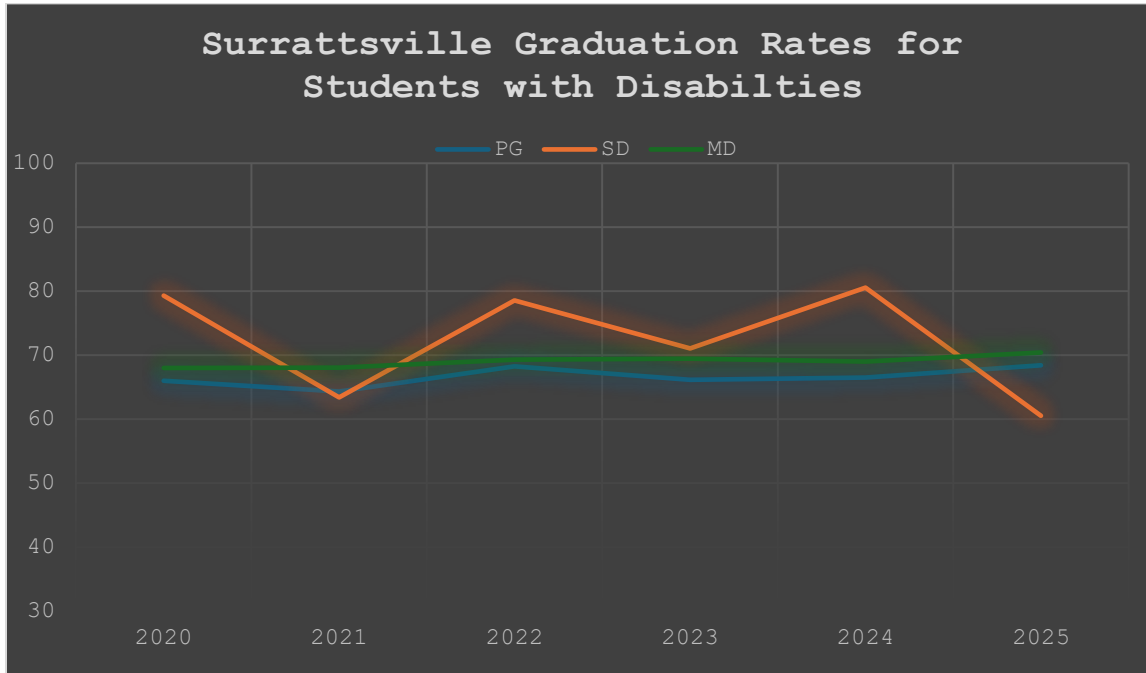

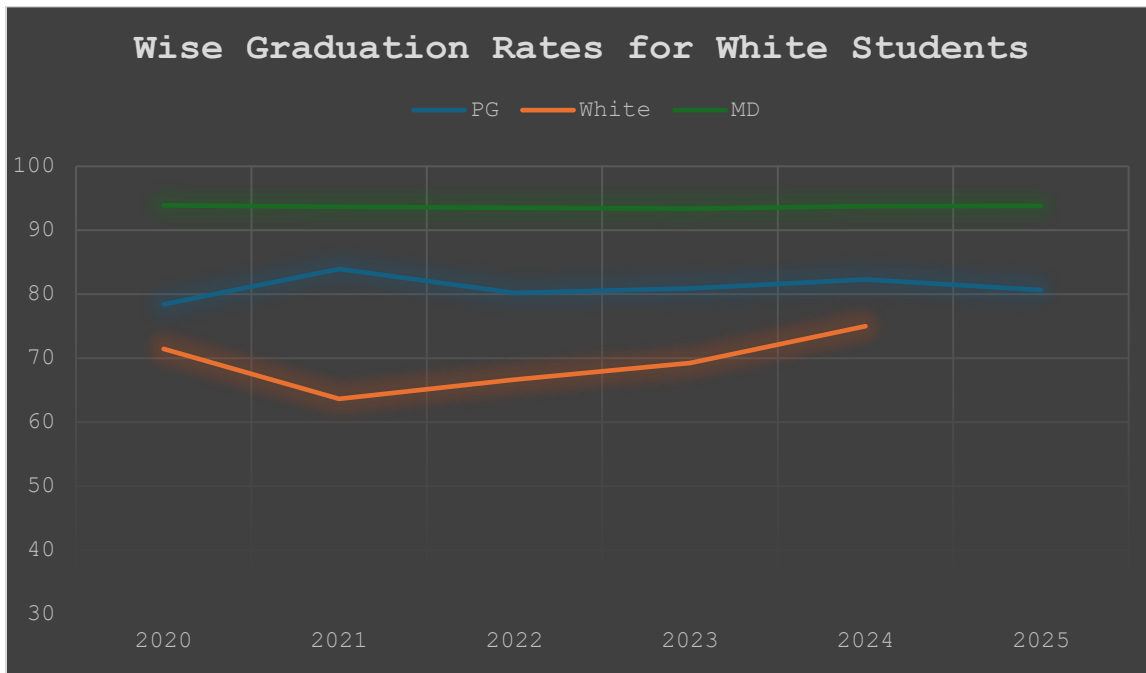
African Americans at Wise High School have graduated at an average rate of 85.2% over the past six years.



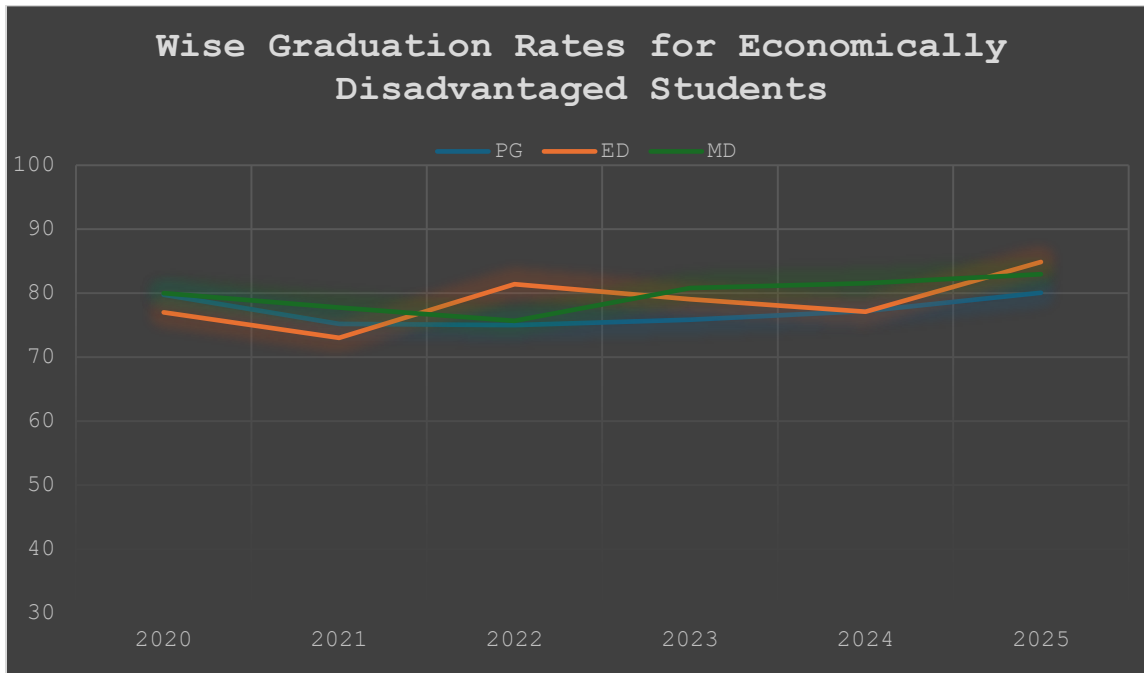

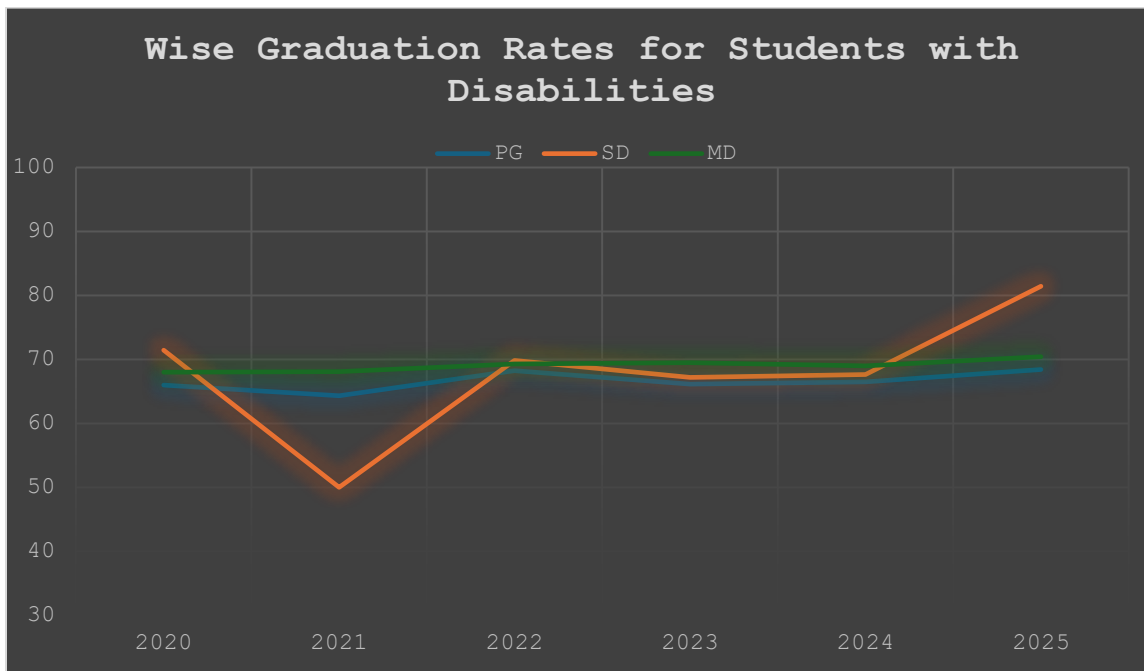

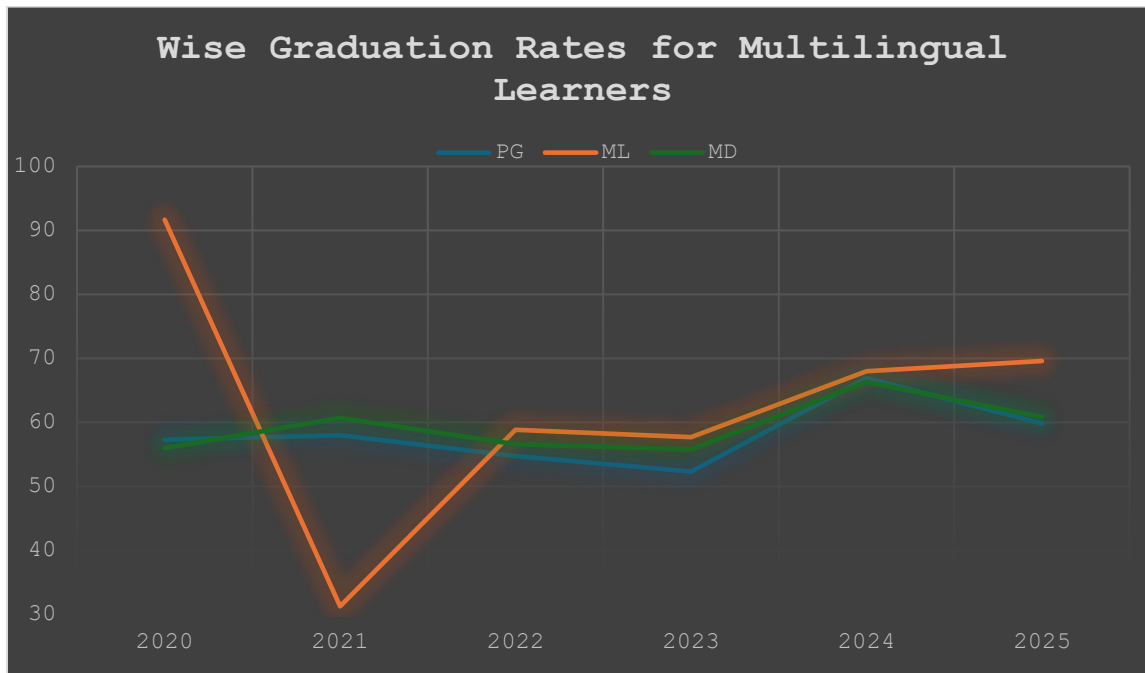

## Conclusion

Graduation rates across the county generally remained stagnant from 2020 to 2023, with several schools that saw a specific demographic that either had a strong increase, decrease, or wide variance throughout. However, from 2023 to 2024, the county graduation rate grew by about 6% in both females and males, a trend that can largely be attributed to the spike in graduation rates of Hispanic students and multilingual learners. From 2024 to 2025 the average graduation rate across the county dipped slightly, and this can be largely attributed to those same demographics, which saw a drop-off statewide. Economically disadvantaged students experienced the largest amount of growth from 2024 to 2025, rising above 80% for the county for the first time since prior to COVID-19.
