This resolution amends the adopted FY 2026 Budget for the Prince George's County portion of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (M-NCPPC). The FY 2026 Operating and Capital Budgets for M-NCPPC were adopted on May 29, 2025, by way of CB-055-2025. Title 18 of the Land Use Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, authorizes the County Council to amend the adopted M-NCPPC budget by way of resolution following a public hearing. The proposed amendments are made to address capital needs in the Southern portion of the County.

The resolution amends the current year budgets for the Park Fund and Capital Improvement Program (CIP). Within the Park Fund, the undesignated fund balance is reduced by \$20 million to increase the PAYGO Transfer to the Capital Projects Fund. This Capital Projects transfer will be allocated within the CIP to the Temple Hills Community Center (Project 4.99.0331). The Land Use Article requires CIP amendments to be submitted to the Commission for comment at least 30 days prior to adoption.

CB-65-2023 (DR-2), CR-70-2023, and CB-85-2024 constitute the legislative package regarding the requirement of the use of specified universal design standards, with the exception of exemptions and waivers granted, to apply to all new single-family attached, single-family detached, two-family, two-over-two's, three-family, and multifamily residential dwelling units constructed in Prince George's County on and after January 1, 2026. This is companion legislation to the zoning bill that removes the Universal Design Green Standard's Table from the Zoning Ordinance. This bill removes two definitions and makes technical amendments to the current universal design law regarding certain clearance requirements for identified universal design elements.

This temporary pause is established in response to the County's Qualified Data Center Task Force, which was formed to receive broad-based input on benefits and effects of constructing and operating data centers in the County and provide recommendations for comprehensive legislation. The Qualified Data Center Task Force is scheduled to submit its recommendations by November 30, 2025. In light of anticipated Code changes regarding the zoning and building of data centers,

this resolution pauses the acceptance, review and approval of building and grading permits for proposed data centers as well as preliminary plans of subdivision which propose qualified data centers among its proposed uses for the earlier of 180 days or the effective date of subsequently enacted data center legislation.
