<u>CB-18-2013 – AN ACT CONCERNING DEPARTMENT OF PERMITTING, INSPECTIONS, AND ENFORCEMENT</u> for the purpose of amending several provisions of the County Code to transfer certain responsibilities and functions to the Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement. <u>INTRODUCED</u>

Council Member Davis as Chair of the Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee, provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the Committee to the Council. Council Bill 18 which amends several provisions of the County Code to transfer certain responsibilities and functions to the Department of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement was introduced by Council Members Franklin, Turner, Lehman and Davis.

<u>CB-67-2013 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING R-55 ZONE</u> for the purpose of amending the minimum net lot area in the R-55 Zone under certain circumstances. *INTRODUCED*; *EXPEDITED*

Council Bill 67 which amends the minimum net lot area in the R-55 Zone under certain circumstances was introduced by Council Member Turner, Franklin, Lehman, Davis, Harrison and Patterson and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development (PZED) Committee. The Clerk was directed to expedite scheduling of Council Bill 67.
