RESOLUTION

1 A RESOLUTION concerning

2 The Prince George’s County Police Department Continuing Education Pilot Program
3 For the purpose of encouraging the University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State
4 University, and Prince George’s Community College to work together to offer a program for
5 Prince George’s County Police Department to receive tuition and credit benefits at their
6 respective institutions.

7 WHEREAS, while the University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and
8 Prince George’s Community College each has its own campus police department, it does utilize
9 the services of the Prince George’s County Police Department as an adjunct force on each of
10 their respective campuses; and

11 WHEREAS, this support by the Prince George’s County Police Department results in a
12 significant force multiplier which benefits the campus police departments of University of
13 Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and Prince George’s Community College; and

14 WHEREAS, students living off campus outside of the jurisdiction of the campus police
15 force, still receive the services of the Prince George’s County Police Department; and

16 WHEREAS, tuition and credit benefits offered by the University of Maryland College Park,
17 Bowie State University, and Prince George’s Community College under a pilot program would
18 greatly serve to assist Prince George’s County in recruiting and retention of qualified police
19 officers; and


20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's
21 County, Maryland, that the County Council hereby supports a pilot program whereby the

1 University of Maryland College Park, Bowie State University, and Prince George’s Community
2 College will offer to Prince George’s County Police Officers tuition and credit benefits at their
3 respective institutions.

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that under this pilot program, the respective institutions
5 would be encouraged to provide a designated area for Prince George’s County Police Officers to
6 receive the tuition and credit benefit information as well as possible enrollment services.
