<u>CB-10-2008 - AN ACT CONCERNING PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY RECORDATION</u>
<u>TAX RATE</u> for the purpose of revising the recordation tax rate. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 10 was presented by the Chairman at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management (PSFM) Committee.

<u>CB-11-2008 – AN ACT CONCERNING ENERGY CONSERVATION REAL PROPERTY</u>

<u>TAX CREDIT</u> for the purpose of establishing a tax credit for real property for residential homeowners who utilize solar or geothermal energy conservation devices. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

# (c) <u>Introduction of Resolutions</u>

CR-22-2008 - A RESOLUTION CONCERNING PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY

INCOME TAX RATE for the purpose of increasing the County income tax rate to 3.20% of the State taxable income. - INTRODUCED

Council Resolution 22 increases the County income tax rate to 3.20% of the State taxable income. Council Resolution 22 was introduced by the Chairman at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management (PSFM) Committee.

#### THIS RESOLUTION REQUIRES A PUBLIC HEARING

#### CR-23-2008 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE OF SPECIAL

**OBLIGATION** for the purpose of providing that special obligation bonds may be issued from time to time under the provisions of this Resolution in the aggregate principal amount of Thirty-Five Million Dollars (\$35,000,000) in order for the County to finance or reimburse costs related to the construction of certain infrastructure improvements as more particularly described herein; making certain findings and determinations, among others, concerning the public benefit and purpose of such special obligation bonds; providing for the levy of a special tax in the form of a special hotel rental tax, the creation of a special fund and the allocation of such special tax with respect to the special taxing district to be paid over to such special fund; providing that such

special obligation bonds authorized to be issued hereby shall be payable from the special hotel rental tax collected and deposited in the special fund, as described below, and that the special obligation bonds shall not constitute a general obligation debt of the County or a pledge of the County's full faith and credit or taxing power other than the taxes representing the Special Hotel Rental Tax; specifying certain terms and conditions with respect to the issuance of the special obligation bonds; authorizing the County Executive of the County to specify, prescribe, determine, provide for and approve certain details, forms, documents or procedures in connection with such special obligation bonds issued hereunder and any other matters necessary or desirable in connection with the authorization, issuance, delivery and payment of such special obligation bonds; authorizing the County Executive to take certain actions, to execute documents and make certain commitments on behalf of the County in connection with the issuance and delivery of such special obligation bonds; authorizing the execution and delivery of such special obligation bonds and such other documents as may be necessary and desirable to effectuate the financing of the infrastructure improvements and the issuance and delivery of such special obligation bonds; generally providing for, and determining various matters in connection with, the issuance, delivery and payment of such special obligation bonds. **INTRODUCED** 

Council Resolution 23 concerns the Issuance of Special Obligation Bonds in aggregate principal amount of \$35,000,000 for the financing of certain infrastructure improvements relating to the National Harbor Development District and the National Harbor Special Taxing District.
