SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Sections 5-201, 5-203, 5-205 5-206, 5-207.04, 5-207.05, and 5-207.09 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same are hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

## SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES. DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICTORS.

#### Sec. 5-201. Definitions.

- (a) For purposes of this Division, the following words shall have the meanings respectively ascribed to them by this Section, except where the context clearly requires otherwise:
- (1) **Commercial establishment** shall include integrated shopping centers, shopping centers and shopping center parking lots.
- (2) **Director** means the Director of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement or the Director's duly authorized representative.
  - (3) **High-risk industry** means any industry involved in:
    - (A) heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC),
    - (B) roofing,
    - (C) solar installation,
    - (D) any industry the Director designates as a high-risk industry.
  - (4) **Senior** means any person aged sixty-five (65) or older
- (5) [3] **Solicitor of a commercial establishment** means any person who goes from place-to-place or door-to-door visiting any commercial establishment for the purpose of:
- (A) Selling or accepting subscriptions or orders for any goods, wares, merchandise, or services for the personal use, benefit, or pleasure of the owner or employees and not related to the business of the commercial establishment; or
  - (B) accepting or requesting donations for any charitable purpose.
- (6) [4] **Solicitor of a residential dwelling** means any person who goes from place-to-place, house-to-house, or door-to-door visiting any residential dwelling for the purpose of:
- (A) Selling or accepting subscriptions or orders for any goods, wares, merchandise, or services for the personal use, benefit or pleasure of the owner or residents; or
  - (B) Accepting or requesting donations for any charitable purpose.

1	(7) <b>The Division</b> means the Division of Aging and Disability under the Department of

4	DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICTORS.
5	Sec 5-203. Application; door-to-door solicitor's license.
6	(a) Application for a solicitor's license shall be made upon a form prescribed by the
7	Director.
8	(b) In addition to such other information as the Director may reasonably deem necessary for
9	purposes of the implementation, administration and enforcement of this Division, the application
10	shall state or be accompanied by the following:
11	(1) The name, local and permanent address, age, weight, height, color of hair and eyes,
12	and any other distinguishing physical characteristics of the applicant;
13	(2) The nature or purpose for which solicitations will be made and the nature of the
14	goods, wares, service, and/or merchandise offered for sale;
15	(3) The name and address of the applicant's employer and/or organization represented;
16	and if the organization is a "charitable organization," as defined by Title 6, Business Regulation
17	Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, a statement that the organization has complied with the
18	requirements of Title 6, Business Regulation Article, Annotated Code of Maryland;
19	(4) Two prints of a recent and clear photograph, $2" \times 2"$ in size, showing the head and
20	shoulders of the applicant;
21	(5) If a vehicle is to be used in connection with soliciting, a description of the same,
22	together with the license tag number and the State in which the vehicle is registered;
23	(6) A statement as to whether the applicant has ever been convicted of a felony or
24	misdemeanor, and; if so, the nature of the offense, when and where convicted, and the penalty or
25	punishment imposed therefor;
26	(7) The names of at least two (2) references, unrelated to the applicant, who will certify
27	as to the applicant's good character and business responsibility; and,
28	(8) The name and address of a person resident in the County designated by the
29	applicant as authorized to accept all lawful processes in any action or proceeding instituted, filed
30	or pending against the applicant with respect to the application of any provision of this Division.
31	(c) The applicant, at the discretion of the Director, shall be required to supply the

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- credentials of the business to be represented and evidence of the applicant's authorization to represent such business. Said credentials shall include evidence that said business has complied with all State and local laws applicable to or governing the operations and conduct of said business, including, but not limited to, the requirements of Article 23 of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- (d) The applicant, at the discretion of the Director, shall be required to furnish a copy of the receipt or contract to be used in the course of solicitation to assure compliance with Section 5-207.04 of this Division.
  - (e) Any applicant engaged in a high-risk industry will be subject to:
    - (1) A criminal background check
- (2) Mandatory consumer protection and elder fraud awareness training, administered by The Division or through a course approved by The Division.
- (f) [e] Every application shall be signed and certified that the information given thereon is true and correct. The signature shall be that of the applicant.

### SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES. DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS.

### Section 5-205. License: description; to be carried on person.

- (a) A license issued pursuant to this Division shall show the name and address of the solicitor, the name and address of the business to be represented, the date of issuance and expiration of the license, a quick response code (QR code) that verifies the licensee, and one (1) of the photographs submitted by the licensee shall be attached to the license.
- (b) Every licensee shall carry his license with him at all times while engaged in soliciting and shall display said license to the prospective buyer prior to making any solicitation. Every licensee shall permit any person, upon request, to personally inspect his license, including any police officer or County inspector of licenses who makes such request.
- (c) It shall be within the discretion of the Director to allow a person, partnership or corporation soliciting within the County to design its own badge to be worn by all its employees and agents located in the County; provided, that:
  - (1) All such badges are first submitted to and approved by the Director.
  - (2) One design is used for all such employees and agents.
  - (3) The badge contains such information as required by the Director, including, but not

limited to, the name of the licensee, the name of principal, expiration date, and a disclaimer stating that possession does not constitute endorsement by the County.

- (4) The said principal thereby immediately assumes responsibility to secure proper distribution of the license and its return upon expiration.
- (5) Any unauthorized use thereof, or fraud or misrepresentation perpetuated by the use thereof in any unauthorized manner, is actionable against the person undertaking such distribution.
- (d) No license shall be valid unless it bears the signature of the Director or his lawful designate and has his official seal affixed thereto.

# SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES. DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS.

### Section 5-206. License; bond required

- (a) As a condition precedent to the issuance of a license under this Division, every person required to be licensed under this Division shall deliver to the Director a receipt for a cash bond received from the County Director of Finance or a corporate bond executed by a surety company qualified to do business in the State of Maryland in the amount of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) or Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) if the licensee is engaged in a high-risk industry.
- (b) In lieu of the individual bond specified in subsection (a), above, the Director may accept a bond filed by a person, partnership, or corporation which shall cover one (1) or more employees or agents of such person, partnership, or corporation soliciting in the County, and which fulfills the requirements of Subsection (a), above.
- (c) That cash or corporate bond shall run to the County and shall be conditioned that the licensee shall:
- (1) Pay any judgment rendered against him by a court of competent jurisdiction as a result of services rendered or not rendered, or materials supplied in connection with the contract of solicitation; and,
- (2) Comply fully with all provisions of the laws and ordinances of the County and such statutes of the State regulating and concerning the business of soliciting and guaranteeing to any citizen of the County doing business with such solicitor that the property or goods purchased shall be delivered according to the representations of the solicitor.
  - (d) Any person who has been awarded a final judgment from any court of competent

jurisdiction as a result of services rendered by a person required to be licensed under this Division shall have a right of action against such bond for the recovery of money, damages, or both, in any court of competent jurisdiction. In the event that the judgment is not satisfied after the judgment holder has made reasonable efforts to execute on the judgment, the County, on behalf of the judgment holder, may make demand on the surety company for the maximum amount of the bond or the amount of the judgment obtained plus interest and costs, whichever is less.

- (e) Cash bonds shall be deposited with the County Director of Finance and he shall issue duplicate receipts therefor. Such cash bonds shall be maintained by the County Director of Finance in a special interest bearing account for three (3) years after the date of expiration of the license or the date of the expiration of any renewal period for which such bond was deposited by the licensee. If the County Director of Finance is notified in writing that a suit has been filed against any such licensee as a result of which a judgment may be payable out of such cash bond, the County Director of Finance shall retain such cash bond until such time as such suit has been reduced to judgment and the period for filing an appeal from such judgment has expired or the judgment debtor has waived in writing his right to take an appeal or until such time as such suit has otherwise been disposed of.
- (f) Every person required to be licensed under this Division who has deposited a cash bond with the County Director of Finance shall be entitled to a return of reasonable interest earned on such cash bond by the County in an amount not to exceed four percent (4%) simple interest per annum.
- (g) The failure of any person licensed under the provisions of this Division to maintain at all times the cash or corporate bond in the amount required by this Section shall constitute grounds for revocation of such person's license by the Director in accordance with the procedures set forth in Section 5-207.01 of this Division. In the case of both cash and corporate bonds, a total amount of not less than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the aggregate of all claims shall be sufficient to satisfy the bonding requirements of this Section, except that any person engaged in a high-risk industry shall maintain a total amount of not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the aggregate of all claims.

SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES. DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS.

1	Section 5-207.04. Solicitation: receipt or copy of contract required; cancellation.
2	(a) The licensee shall furnish the buyer with a fully completed receipt or copy of any
3	contract pertaining to any sale at the time of execution. It shall include a space for indicating the
4	date of the transaction, the name and address of the licensee, and in immediate proximity to the
5	space reserved in the contract for the signature of the buyer or on the front page of the contract, a
6	statement informing the buyer of his right to cancel the transaction at any time prior to midnight
7	of the third (3rd) business day after the date of the transaction. The notice of cancellation shall be
8	by writing or telegram at the licensee's place of business and shall be signed and dated by the
9	buyer.
10	(b) The licensee shall furnish the buyer with a senior consumer rights disclosure form that
11	shall be created by the Director. The Director shall make these forms available to all
12	licensees. The Director's senior consumer rights disclosure shall contain but not limited
13	to:
14	(1) The right for seniors to cancel within seven (7) business days.
15	(2) A hotline number to report fraud or undue pressure to the Director.
16	(3) A checklist of suggested safeguards for seniors.
17	(4) A signature line confirming receipt and understanding by the senior.
18	SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES.
19	DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS.
20	Section 5-207.05. Prohibited acts.
21	(a) No licensee shall:
22	(1) Remain in a private residence or commercial establishment or on the premises
23	thereof after the owner or occupant has requested the licensee to leave; or,
24	(2) Enter into or upon the premises of a private residence or commercial establishment
25	for soliciting, when the owner or occupant thereof has displayed a "No Soliciting" sign on such
26	premises; or,
27	(3) Enter upon residential premises for soliciting during nighttime. Nighttime is
28	defined in Section 1-102(a)(18) of this Code.
29	(4) Engage in soliciting on any property that has been opted into the no soliciting
30	registry as described in Section 5-207.10.
31	SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES.

1	DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS.
2	Section 5-207.09. Penalty for violations of act.
3	(a) Any person required to be licensed under this Division who acts in the capacity of a
4	door-to-door solicitor without first having obtained a license, or continues to act after a license
5	has been denied, suspended, or revoked, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
6	conviction, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or
7	incarceration up to six (6) months in jail, or both such fine and imprisonment.
8	(b) Any person in violation of Section 5-207.04 shall be subject to:
9	(1) One Thousand Dollars \$1,000 for a first offense
10	(2) Three Thousand Dollars \$3,000 for a second offense.
11	(3) Five Thousand Dollars \$5,000 for a third offense, revocation of license, and
12	imprisonment not to exceed six (6) months.
13	(c) Any person in violation of Section 5-207.05 except section 5-207.05(a)(4) shall be
14	subject to a fine of:
15	(1) One Thousand Dollars \$1,000 for a first offense
16	(2) Three Thousand Dollars \$3,000 for a second offense.
17	(3) Five Thousand Dollars \$5,000 for a third offense, revocation of license, and
18	imprisonment not to exceed six (6) months.
19	(d) Any person in violation of Section 5-207.05(a)(4) shall be subject to a fine of:
20	(1) Two Thousand Dollars \$2,000 for a first offense.
21	(2) Three Thousand Dollars \$3,000 for a second offense.
22	(3) Five Thousand Dollars \$5,000 for a third offense, revocation of license, and
23	imprisonment not to exceed six (6) months.
24	(e) Any person found to have deceived or defrauded a senior through door-to-door
25	solicitation shall be subject to a Five Thousand Dollar \$5,000 fine and imprisonment not to
26	exceed six (6) months.
27	(f) Any business with more than two violations of section 5-207.09(d) in a calendar year
28	shall be banned from soliciting within the County for five (5) years.
29	SECTION 2. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland,
30	that Sections 5-207.10 and 5-207.11 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same are
31	hereby added:

No Solicitation Registry The Division shall create and maintain a registry allowing senior County residents to elect to 4 5 prohibit all in-person solicitation. The No Solicitation Registry shall permit residents to register their property using a form created by The Division, which may be completed online or 6 7 submitted by mail. The Division shall also establish a dedicated hotline through which residents 8 may register their property. The Division shall make the registry accessible to all licensees, 9 listing the properties of residents who have opted out of in-person solicitation. 10 SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES. DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS. 11 12 Section 5-207.11 Solicitation Protection Rapid Response Force 13 (a) The Director shall establish a Solicitation Protection Rapid Response Force to 14 investigate reports of potential violations of Division 15. The Rapid Response Force shall respond within three (3) business days of receiving a report, conduct an on-site inspection, and 15 provide follow-up to the reporting County resident. The Director shall maintain records 16 17 documenting the response time for each report and the outcome of the investigation. 18 (b) The Division shall also direct the Solicitation Protection Rapid Response Force to 19 establish a public outreach initiative on consumer protections. The Division shall create the 20 guidelines and partner with senior-serving organizations for the public outreach initiative. 21 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 22 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of 23 24 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining 25 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this 26 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such 27 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 28 or section. 29 SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on July 1, 2026.
