BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Bid and Contract Security

3 For the purpose of amending a provision of Subtitle 10A to address the challenges experienced
 4 in the marketplace to implement the current County bonding requirements; to ensure the County
 5 and its subcontracting community has adequate security for its protection in construction
 6 projects.

9 SUBTITLE 10A. PURCHASING

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
 14 Maryland, that Section 10A-132 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
 15 repealed and reenacted with the following amendment:

16 SUBTITLE 10A. PURCHASING.

17 DIVISION 4. BID AND CONTRACT SECURITY.

18 Sec. 10A-132. Bonds; generally.

(a) Subject to Subsection (b), below, unless otherwise required by State or Federal law or regulation or as a condition to State or Federal assistance, no bid, performance, or payment bonds may be required by the Purchasing Agent to be posted if the contract price does not exceed One-Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000).

* * * * *

(d) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (b), the Purchasing Agent shall be authorized to waive or modify said requirements if the Purchasing Agent determines such waiver or modification is in the best interest of the County.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
