AN ACT concerning				
Prince Geo	orge's County Prevailing Wage for Public School Construction			
For the purpose of providing that public school construction in the County be subject to the State				
Prevailing Wage law under certain circumstances.				
WHEREAS, Section 1009 of the Charter of Prince George's County, Maryland requires that				
the County Council provide by law for a system of establishing prevailing hours and wages for				
all contractors and subcontractors performing work for the County government; and				
WHEREAS, the County has enacted laws to borrow money and incur indebtedness upon its				
full faith and credit to finance the construction of public school buildings in the County;				
WHEREAS, the State of Maryland has enacted laws to fund a portion of the costs of				
constructing public school buildings in the County and to provide that prevailing wage rates be				
paid to employees performing work on a public school construction project under certain				
circumstances; and				
WHEREAS, it is	the public policy of the County and the State that locally prevailing wages			
shall be paid to employees performing work on public works projects to provide for wage				
stabilization and to protect local contractors and workers from unfair and predatory competition				
from outside contractor	rs which, by using cheap, imported migratory labor, obtain important			

are to be constructed; and
WHEREAS, Section 17-201 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated
Code of Maryland provides that the governing body of a political subdivision of the State may

public works contracts by underbidding contractors located in the community where the projects

provide by ordinance that the political subdivision is covered by the provisions of Title 17, Subtitle 2 and gives notice of such ordinance to the Commission of Labor and Industry; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the County to provide for the coverage of the State Prevailing Wage law for public school construction projects located within the County that are constructed, in whole or in part, with County and State funds under certain circumstances.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Prince George's County, Maryland (the"County") that, pursuant to the provisions of Section 17-201 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the construction, including the reconstruction, extension, acquisition, improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation, repair or modernization, of elementary and secondary public school buildings in the County shall be subject to the provisions of Title 17, Subtitle 2, of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended, replaced, or recodified from time to time under certain circumstances.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall apply to all contracts for the construction, including the reconstruction, extension, acquisition, improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation, repair or modernization, of an elementary or secondary school building where the cost of such construction is in excess of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) and where at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the cost of construction is paid using funds provided by the County.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that a copy of this Act shall be provided to the Maryland Commissioner of Labor and Industry in accordance with Section 17-201(i).

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that prior to the advertisement for bids for the construction, including the reconstruction, extension, acquisition, improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation, repair or modernization, of a covered elementary or secondary school building, the Board of Education of Prince George's County shall obtain from the Maryland Commissioner of Labor and Industry a copy of the schedule of prevailing wages and shall require, as a condition precedent to the award of a bid, that such wages be paid to employees performing work for the contractor.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
