BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Drug Enforcement and Education Special Revenue Fund

3 For the purpose of providing that a certain portion of the monies in the Drug Enforcement and
4 Education Special Revenue Fund shall be appropriated to the Sheriff for certain purposes.

5 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

6 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

7 Section 10-261,

8 The Prince George's County Code

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
11 Maryland, that Section 10-261 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
12 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

13 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

14 DIVISION 10. ENTERPRISE AND OTHER SPECIAL PURPOSE FUNDS.

15 **Sec. 10-261. Drug Enforcement and Education Special Revenue Fund; establishment.**

17 (b) The purpose of this Fund shall be to finance costs associated with the administration of
18 drug enforcement and education activities of the Police Department, the Office of the Sheriff, the
19 Health Department, and the State's Attorney's Office.

20 * * * * *

(d) Fifteen percent (15%) of the monies in the Drug Enforcement and Education Special [Resource] Revenue Fund shall be reserved for appropriation to the Prince George's County State's Attorney's Office for its Special Narcotics Prosecution Office. Twenty percent (20%) of the monies shall be reserved for appropriation to the Prince George's County Health Department for drug prevention, education, and treatment programs. The remaining sixty-five percent (65%) shall be appropriated to the Prince George's County Police Department for law enforcement activities; provided, however, that sixty-five percent (65%) of the proceeds from property seized by the Office of the Sheriff shall be appropriated to the Office of the Sheriff for law enforcement activities.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
