BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 The Revised Public Safety Officer Real Property Tax Credit

3 For the purpose of revising the definition of public safety officers eligible for the real property
 4 tax credit.

5 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

6 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

7 Section 10-192.12,

8 The Prince George's County Code

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
 11 Maryland, that Section 10-192.12 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
 12 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

13 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

14 DIVISION 7. TAXES AND TAX CREDITS.

15 SUBDIVISION 5. PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICER PROPERTY TAX CREDIT.

16 Sec. 10-192.12. Public Safety Officer Real Property Tax Credit.

17 (a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated:

18 * * * * *

19 (2) Public safety officer means:

1 (A) a firefighter, an emergency medical technician, a correctional officer, a police
 2 officer, public safety dispatcher, or a deputy sheriff employed full-time by a public safety
 3 agency [in]of Prince George's County Government; or

4 (B) a volunteer firefighter or volunteer emergency medical technician for the
 5 Prince George's County Fire/EMS Department who is eligible under the length of service
 6 award program.

7 (C) a public safety officer employed full-time, predominantly, in Prince George's
 8 County by a bi-county agency, which includes Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning
 9 Commission (MNCPPC).

11 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
 12 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
 13 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
 14 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
 15 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
 16 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
 17 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
 18 or section.

19 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
 20 calendar days after it becomes law.
