SECTION 1	BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,	
Maryland, that Section 10-299.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby

3	Sec. 10-299.01. Critical Workforce Homebuying Assistance Program.
4	(a) Program established. There is within the Housing Investment Trust Fund a Critical
5	Workforce Homebuying Assistance Program to ensure that County workers critical to the
6	education and safety of County residents are able to purchase homes in the communities that
7	they serve.
8	(b) Eligibility. A participant in the Program must:
9	(1) be employed as:
10	(A) a teacher employed full-time by Prince George's County Public Schools;
11	(B) a nurse employed full-time in a medical office or hospital located in Prince
12	George's County; or
13	(C) a firefighter, emergency medical technician, correctional officer, police officer,
14	public safety dispatcher, or deputy sheriff employed full-time by a public safety agency of Prince
15	George's County Government; and
16	(2) have a household income not exceeding 120 percent of the median income for the
17	Washington-Arlington-Alexandria, DC-VA-MD-WV Metropolitan Statistical Area.
18	(c) Assistance. Assistance under the Program shall consist of zero percent or interest-
19	deferred loans, subject to the following conditions:
20	(1) Maximum loan amount shall not exceed \$50,000, or 25% of the purchase price,
21	whichever is less;
22	(2) Homes must be located in Prince George's County;
23	(3) Homes must be the applicant's primary residence and only property in Prince
24	George's County to remain eligible for the Program;
25	(4) Loans will be secured by a second mortgage on the property;
26	(5) Loans may be paid off or payments made toward principal with no penalty; and
27	(6) Any other conditions set forth in regulations adopted paragraph (d)(3) of this
28	section.
29	(d) Administration. The Program shall be administered by the Director of the Department
30	of Housing and Community Development, or their designee.
31	(1) An applicant for assistance under the Program shall apply on an application form

2	designee.
3	(2) The Director or their designee shall review applications for assistance submitted
4	pursuant to this subsection and provide assistance to eligible applicants subject to the availability
5	of Program funds.
6	(3) The Director of the Department of Housing and Community Development may
7	adopt such regulations as may be necessary for the administration of the Program.
8	(e) Funding. The County Council may provide additional funding for the Program to be
9	used in accordance with parameters established by the County Council.
10	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's
11	County, Maryland, that Section 10-295 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is
12	hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

15	Sec. 10-295. Purposes and uses.
16	(a) In general. The purposes of the Fund are to:
17	* * * * * * *
18	(3) provide for housing counseling, rental, down payment, [and] closing cost, and other
19	<u>financial</u> assistance for:
20	(A) eligible persons to retain or purchase vacant, abandoned, and foreclosed
21	properties; and
22	(B) critical public service workers to ensure that these workers are able to live in
23	the communities that they serve;

25	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
26	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
27	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
28	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
29	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
30	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
31	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
