	Maryland Offshore Wind Clean Energy Production	
For the purpose of expressing the support of the Prince George's County Council for the use		
offshore wind turbines off the coast of Maryland as a means to produce clean energy for the		
State.		
WHEREAS	S, the State of Maryland, under Governor Martin O'Malley, has taken an	
aggressive effort and plan to increase Maryland's renewable energy usage by use of alternative		
energy strategies, including solar, biomass and onshore and offshore wind technologies; and		
WHEREAS, the State's Maryland Energy Administration (MEA) in March 2010 adopted a		
goal in Maryland's Renewable Energy Portfolio which requires electricity suppliers to increase		
by 20% the purchase of electricity from renewable sources by 2022; and		
WHEREAS, MEA in September 2009 issued at Request for Expression of Interest and		
study to engage	business, industry and environmental stakeholders with expertise in the	
installation and development of offshore wind energy off of Maryland's coast; and		
WHEREAS	S, in June 2010 Governor O'Malley announced that the State of Maryland	
entered into Memorandum of Understanding with the U.S. Department of the Interior and twelve		
(12) states in partnership to form the Atlantic Offshore Wind Consortium, to coordinate		
regionally prominent issues surrounding the development of offshore wind along the Atlantic		
outer continental shelf; and		
WHEREAS, on November 10, 2010, the U.S. Department of the Interior's Bureau of Ocean		

Energy Management, Regulation and Enforcement was issuing a Request for Interest (RFI),

which accepted comments until January 10, 2011, in constructing wind turbines in federal

waters of the State of Maryland's Atlantic coast; and

WHEREAS, Governor O'Malley in his February 3, 2011 State of State Address expressed his support for *Maryland Offshore Wind Energy Act* to create more renewable energy in Maryland and support the creation of green manufacturing, assembly and servicing jobs on the shore and waters of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council is well aware of the ongoing operational and increasing demand for electrical service in the Maryland and the region and has under taken several legislative initiatives to support efforts to become environmentally efficient and to encourage our citizens to reduce the use of and demand for electrical service; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County is committed to making its communities more livable by protecting the environment, creating green jobs, and improving the health, safety and welfare of its residents by reducing pollution and increasing energy efficiency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Governor O'Malley is congratulated for this leadership in promoting offshore wind energy development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council encourages Governor O'Malley to continue to work with the Department of the Interior's Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Regulation and Enforcement and our federal partners.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council encourages the Maryland General Assembly to consider and pass legislation during the 2011 Session that requires the Public Service Commission to promote offshore wind energy development in the Federal waters off of the coast of Maryland through long-term power purchase contracts that would support such development.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that that copies of this Resolution be sent by the Clerk of the Council to Governor Martin O'Malley, Senate President Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., and Speaker of the House Michael E. Busch.
