THE PRELIMINARY MASTER PLAN AND PROPOSED SECTIONAL MAP AMENDMENT FOR SUBREGION 1 (PLANNING AREAS 60, 61, 62 AND 64)

Pursuant to the provisions of Article 28 of the Annotated Code of Maryland and the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the District Council, and the Prince George's County Planning Board of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, joint public hearing to receive testimony regarding the preliminary plan generally located within northern portion of Prince George's County and generally bounded by the border with Montgomery County to the west; Anne Arundel County, the Baltimore-Washington Parkway and MD 201 to the east; Powder Mill Road and the Capital Beltway to the south and southeast; and the City of Laurel and the Patuxent River to the north. The City of Laurel is not included in the master plan because it has its own planning and zoning authority. The public hearing is part of a process leading to the approval of a new master plan and sectional map amendment that will amend the 1990 Subregion 1 Master Plan and Sectional Map Amendment and the 2002 Prince George's County Approved General Plan.
