RE: FY 2020 Second Financial Review

Dear County Executive Alsobrooks and Chair Turner:

This letter requests approval of an operating budget transfer between major expenditure categories for FY 2020. The transfer realigns categories within the Board of Education Approved Budget. Total revenue and expenditures remain at the revised level following the first financial review on March 27: \$2,180,608,560.

This second financial review, approved by the Board of Education on June 11, 2020, serves three purposes:

- The addition of \$30,031,745 in restricted funding to the FY 2020 Approved
 Operating Budget to support the new Elementary and Secondary School
 Emergency Relief (ESSER) grant under the Coronavirus Aid Relief and
 Economic Security (CARES) Act. This grant provides local school systems
 with restricted federal resources to support expenses relating to the
 COVID-19 pandemic.
- A categorical realignment of restricted funding within the Kirwan Concentration of Poverty grant to support instructional literacy materials as well as salary and fringe benefits for Community School Coordinators.
- 3. A categorical realignment of unrestricted funds to support the early payment of two 'lease purchase agreements. This is part of a comprehensive plan to reconcile the FY 2021 Operating Budget. Savings within the area of salary lapse, registration fees and non-local travel expenses support this realignment.

Subject: Fiscal Year 2020 Financial Review and Categorical Changes

Abstract and Highlights: Administration regularly monitors the financial condition of the school system throughout the fiscal year and recommends periodic adjustments to meet evolving needs of the District and ensure fiscal stability.

This Financial Review includes three sets of changes, as outlined below:

- 1. The addition of \$30,031,745 in restricted funding to the FY 2020 Approved Operating Budget to support the new Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) grant under the Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act. This grant provides local school systems with restricted federal resources to support expenses relating to the COVID-19 pandemic. A further outline of the proposed use of the funds will be separately presented by the Chief Executive Officer to the Board of Education on July 11, 2020.
- A categorical realignment of restricted funding within the Kirwan Concentration of Poverty grant to support instructional literacy materials as well as salary and fringe benefits for Community School Coordinators through June 2020.
- 3. A categorical realignment of unrestricted funds to support the early payment of two lease purchase agreements. This is part of a comprehensive plan to reconcile the FY 2021 Operating Budget scheduled for CEO presentation to the Board of Education on July 11, 2020. These lease purchase agreements originally supported the purchase of Buses, Textbooks and Technology in FY 2017 and FY 2018. Savings within the area of salary lapse, registration fees and non-local travel expenses support this realignment.

The Public School Laws of Maryland require Board of Education and County Council approval of transfers between major categories. The attached resolution approves the addition of restricted funding and the transfers between major categories. The resolution also authorizes the Chief Executive Officer to request County Council approval of the transfers. Board of Education approval of the resolution is recommended.
