15	Sec. 2-495. The Prince George's County Youth Commission; established.	
16	The Prince George's County Youth Commission is established to provide the youth of	
17	Prince George's County with a vehicle to learn about government, participate in the process,	
18	represent and articulate the needs of youth in the County, and advise the [County Executive and	nd]
19	County Council on matters pertaining to the youth and teen population, especially as it relates	to
20	County programs.	
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Sec. 2-496. Duties and responsibilities of Commission. 1 2 (a) The Commission shall have the following duties and responsibilities: 3 (1) Foster increased youth involvement in the affairs of County government; Study problems and hold forums on issues, activities and concerns of County 4 (2)5 youth; (3) Comment upon legislation and policies that impact the youth; 6 7 (4) Present methods to resolve youth-related conflicts between youth, and between 8 youth and adults; 9 (5) Recommend the implementation of community programs to improve the lives of 10 youth; (6) Monitor programs and policies that affect youth to ensure that they are achieving 11 12 the intended results; 13 (7) Work with other youth organizations in the County to collaborate on shared issues 14 and interests: and (8) Submit to the [County Executive and] County Council, and make available to the 15 16 general public, an annual report of the activities of the Commission. 17 Sec. 2-497. Commission composition; term; officers. 18 (a) The Commission shall be composed of [thirty-five (35)] up to thirty-seven (37) youth 19 members [appointed by the County Executive and subject to confirmation by the County 20 Council]. Youth members shall be selected [as to represent] on recommendation of the principal 21 of each public and private high school in the County, and two (2) members may be children participating in the County's home school program under the supervision of the Prince George's 22 County Public Schools Department of Curriculum and Instruction. Each member shall be a [and 23 24 be] youth between the ages of fifteen (15) and eighteen (18) who [have] has a sincere interest in, 25 and motivation to work for, the community and have a background of community-based activity. 26 The Commission may also include the student member of the Prince George's County Board of Education as an ex officio member. 27 28 (b) The term of office for each member shall be [one (1) year] two years, with a maximum 29 term of four (4) years for each member. Any vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in

the manner of the original appointment. [Each member shall serve until a successor is confirmed.]

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(c) The Commission members shall elect annually from their own membership a chairperson and such other officers as it deems necessary.

Sec. 2-499. Adoption of rules and regulations.

The Commission shall promulgate its own rules and regulations, subject to the approval of the [County Executive] County Council, as may be necessary and appropriate to carry out the responsibilities of the Commission.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
