



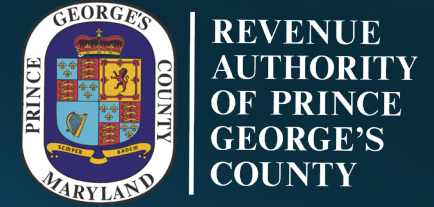

Executive Summary

Purpose

- Support the County's long-term vision to preserve its rich agricultural heritage, while providing much-needed food availability and educational opportunities for Prince George's County stakeholders.

Questions Answered

- What are the current gaps in the agriculture ecosystem and operational resources are needed in the agriculture sector?
- What will facilitate connectivity of farmers and producers to end users/ consumers?
- Is a consolidated agriculture center operationally and financially viable in Prince George's County?
 - If yes, where and what is the site profile?
 - If no, why and what resources can be implemented to support aggregation and distribution?

Project Background

Agriculture Landscape:	499 sq. miles, ~1MM residents, 60K acres farmland, 380 farms worth ~\$22.6M – 2022 Census
Economic Impacts:	2035 Plan preserves farmland, promotes urban ag for food security, health, and economic growth.
Policy & Legislation:	Prince George's County Strategic Program for Agricultural Development (2009) Urban Agriculture: A Tool for Creating Economic Development and Healthy Communities in Prince George's County, MD (2012) Healthy Food for All Prince Georgians: An Assessment of Access to Healthy Food in Prince George's County, Maryland (2015) Agriculture Conservation Plan: A Countywide Functional Master Plan (2017) Food Security Task Force Recommendations (2021)
External Factors:	Pandemic exposed food supply gaps, job losses, and worsened food insecurity for 240K+ residents in priority areas and current political climate.
Expressed need for AFSIC:	Proposed food hub to connect producers, programs, and residents with distribution and health education.
Capital Funds to support Feasibility Study:	Agriculture Resources Advisory Committee (2018)

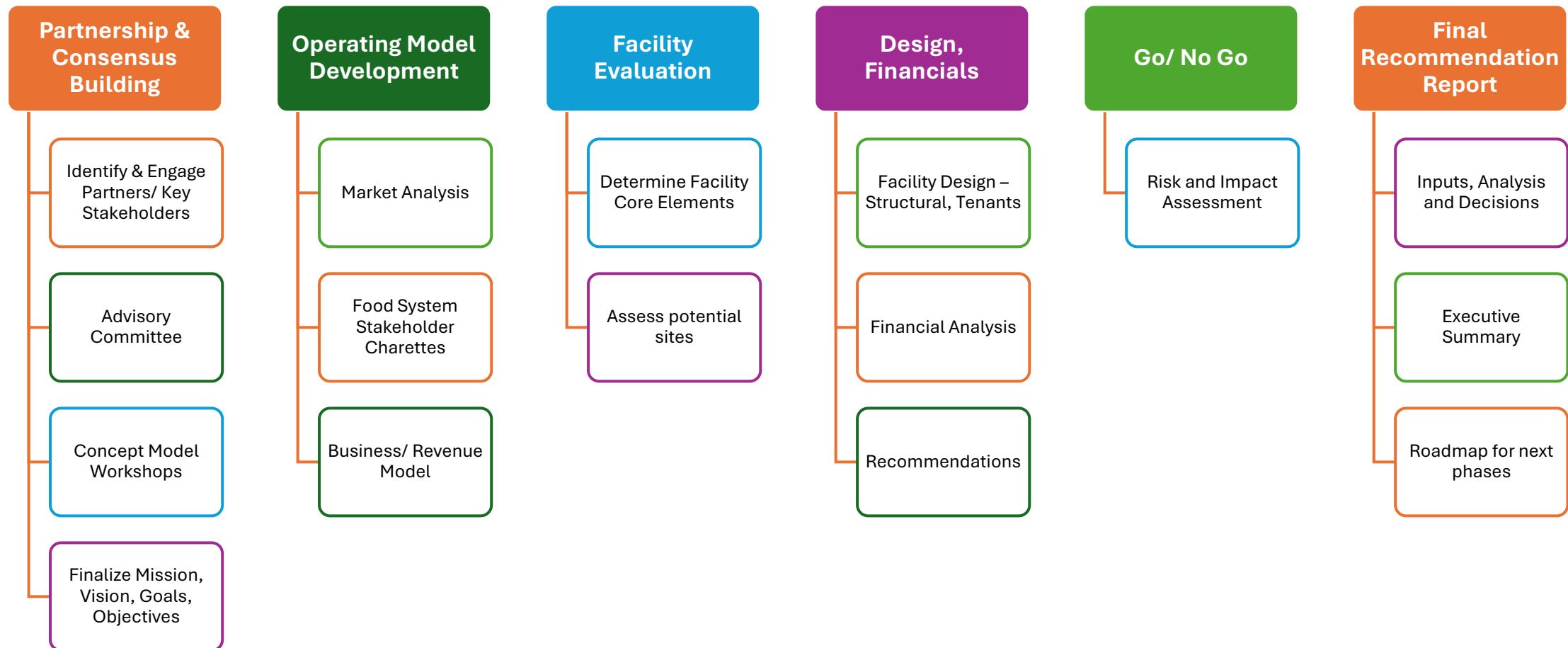

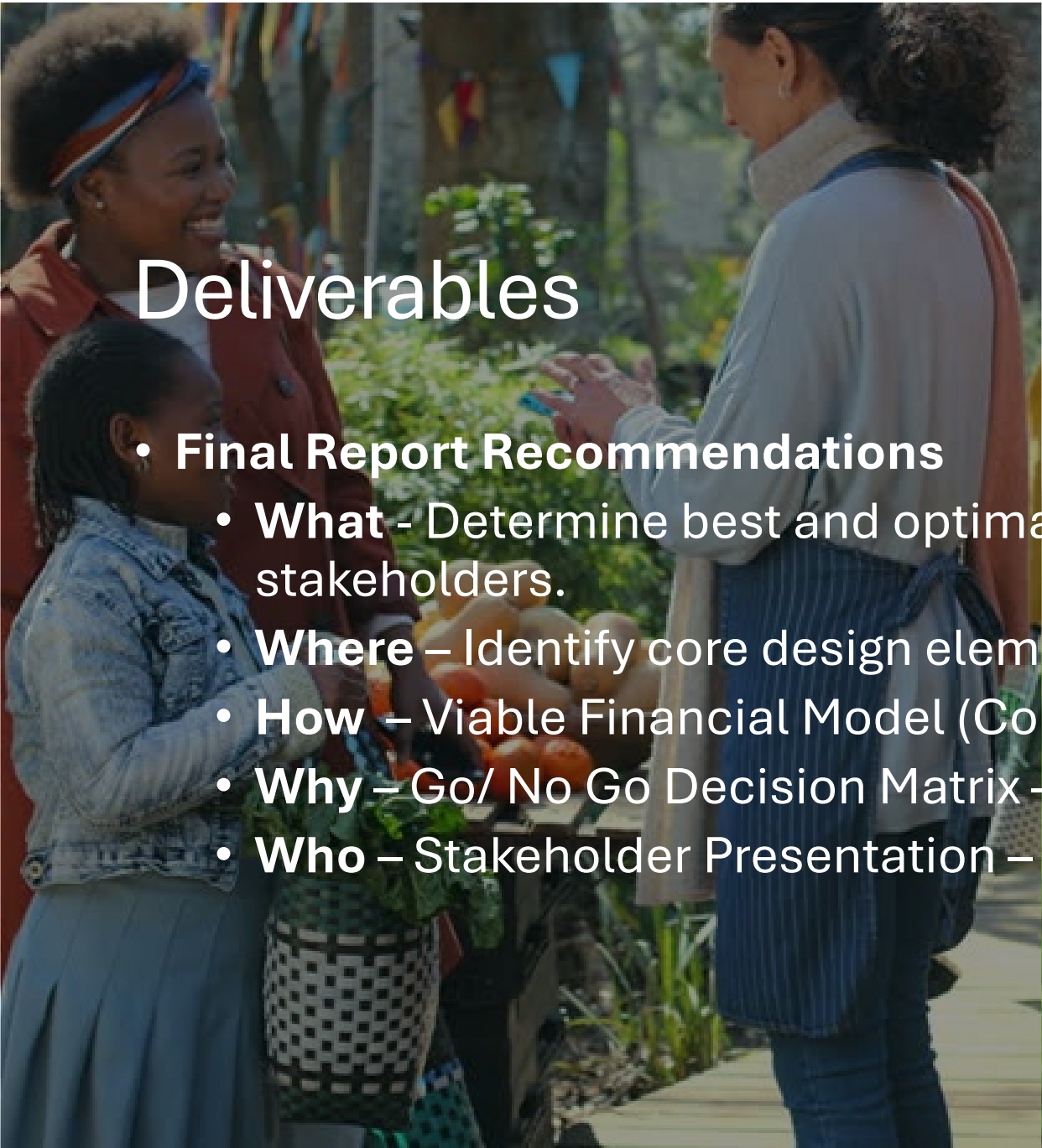
Study Methodology



Timeline



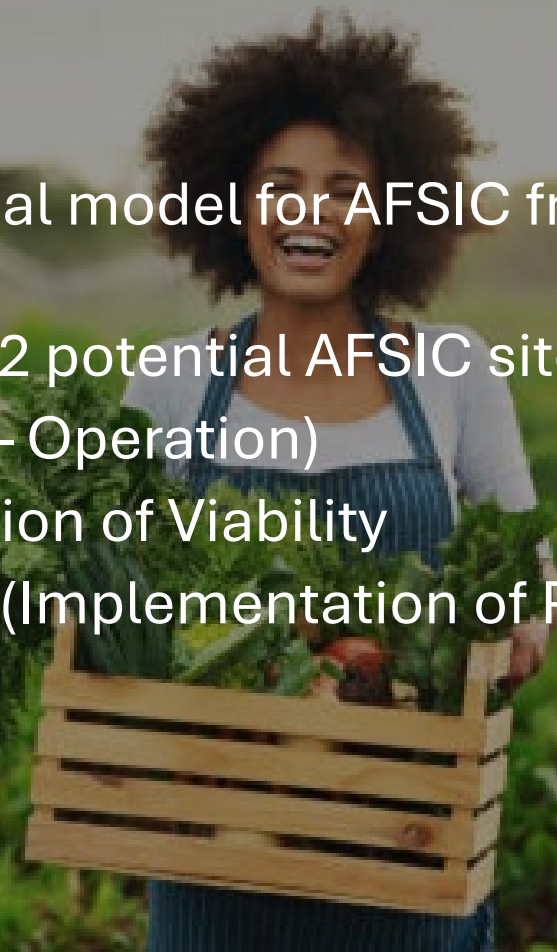

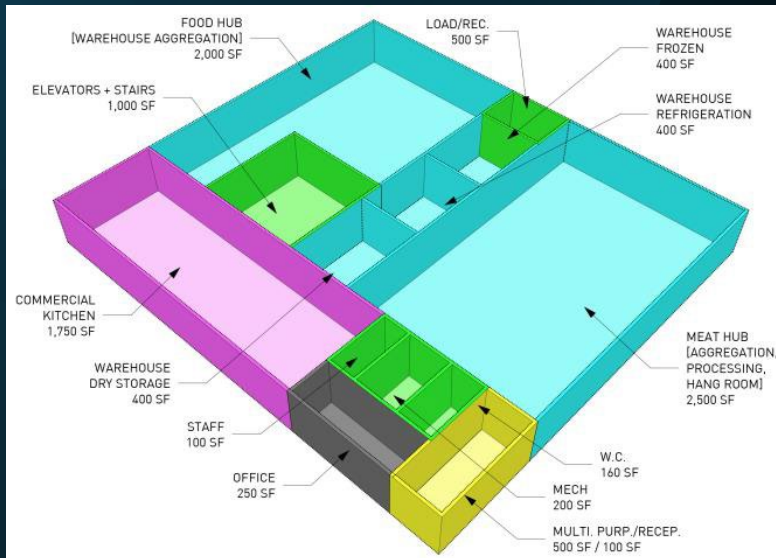
Deliverables
