RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Designation of the Elmo Clark House, the Dashiell House, the Vernon Wright House, the Helen Dwight Reid House, and the Odell House as Prince George's County Historic Sites For the purpose approving the designation of the Elmo Clark House (68-074-02); the Dashiell House (68-010-91); The Vernon Wright House (68-010-92); the Helen Dwight Reid House (80-057); and the Odell House (83-048) as Historic Sites in Prince George's County.

WHEREAS, Section 29-120.01 of the Prince George's County Code authorizes a process by which owner(s) of County property that meet certain qualifying requirements may request designation as an historic site by application to the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Elmo Clark House, with a designated address of 3721 36th Street, Mount Rainier, was built in 1907 and is an example of a simplified, Queen Anne-style dwelling (Criterion (1)(A)(I)), and is a contributing property in the Mount Rainier NRHD (Criterion (1)(A) (IV)); and

WHEREAS, the Elmo Clark House is a representative example of a simplified Queen Anne-style dwelling, is part of a group of at least six (6) other similar structures in Mount Rainier (Criterion (2)(A)(I)), and is significant as a moderately intact early dwelling in a highly visible location (Criterion(2)(A)(V)); and

WHEREAS, the Elmo Clark House, along with its 6,250 square-foot Environmental Setting shown amongst the County land records as Lot 31, Block 8 within the subdivision known as "Rhode Island Avenue Addition to Mount Rainier," was determined to meet criteria 1.A.(I, IV)

and 2.A.(I, IV, V) within the requirements for designation as an Historic Site in the County; and WHEREAS, the Dashiell House, located at 4914 40th Place, Hyattsville, was constructed in 1920 and is an example of a modest, vernacular Craftsman-style bungalow commonly found in Prince George's County (Criterion (1)(A)(IV)), and is a contributing property in the Hyattsville NRHD, and is part of a highly visible streetscape (Criterion (2)(A)(V)); and

WHEREAS, the Dashiell House, along with its 0.169-acre Environmental Setting, shown among the County land records as Lot 36, Block 1 within the subdivision known as "Holladay Company's Addition to Hyattsville," was determined to meet criteria 1.A.(IV) and 2.A.(I) within the requirements for designation as an Historic Site in the County; and

WHEREAS, the Vernon Wright House, located at 6010 43rd Street, Hyattsville, was constructed in 1939 and is an example of a modest, Colonial Revival-style dwelling is significant as an example of a modest dwelling in an emerging automobile-focused neighborhood in Hyattsville, (Criterion (1)(A)(I)), and represents the pre-World War II expansion of the important community of Hyattsville (Criterion (1)(A)(IV)); and

WHEREAS, the Vernon Wright House is a representative example of an early twentieth-century Colonial Revival Style dwelling (Criterion (2)(A)(I)), and is a contributing resource in the 2004 Amended and Expanded Hyattsville NRHD ((Criterion (2)(A)(IV)); and

WHEREAS, the Vernon Wright House and its 6,017 square-foot Environmental Setting, shown among the County land records as Lot 27, Block B within the subdivision known as "Arundel," was determined to meet criteria 1.A.(I), IV), 2.A.(I), IV) within the requirements for designation as an Historic Site in the County; and

WHEREAS, Helen Dwight Reid House, located at 13507 Reid Circle, Fort Washington, was constructed in 1957 along Piscataway Creek, is significant as an early and unique Midcentury-Modern dwelling in the post-World War II development of Fort Washington Estates on the Potomac River in southwestern Prince George's County (Criterion (1)(A)(I)), and was used as a country residence for Dr. Helen Dwight Reid, an internationally prominent educator and government official (Criterion (1)(A)(III)); and

WHEREAS, the Helen Dwight Reid House was the first house built on what was then named Reid Circle in the developing subdivision of Fort Washington Estates (Criterion (1)(A)(IV)), and represents a locally unusual example of a Midcentury-Modern dwelling with a Frank Lloyd Wright-inspired architectural details (Criterion (2)(A)(I)) and is the work of

prominent Washington, DC-based architect Clark T. Harmon, AIA, the designer of a number of other mid-twentieth-century buildings in Prince George's County (Criterion (2)(A)(II)); and

WHEREAS, the Helen Dwight Reid House, with its distinctive butterfly roof, large expanses of glass, and other Wright-inspired detailing represent high artistic values (Criterion (2)(A)(III)) and is prominently located at the end of the Reid Circle cul-de-sac in close proximity to the Potomac River (Criterion (2)(A)(V)); and

WHEREAS, the Helen Dwight Reid House, along with its 14,660 square-foot Environmental Setting, shown among the County land records upon Lot 27 and a one-half portion of Lot 28, Block E, within the subdivision known as "Fort Washington Estates," was determined to meet criteria 1.A.(I, III, IV) and 2.A.(I, II, III, V) within the requirements for designation as an Historic Site in the County, and

WHEREAS the Odell House, located at 14601 Bond's Retreat Road, Accokeek, was constructed in 1976, and is significant as intact example of site-specific construction for one of the large wooded lots of the Moyaone Reserve in southwestern Prince George's County (Criterion (1)(A)(I)); and

WHEREAS, the Odell House is the work of prominent local architect Charles F. Wagner, Jr., Criterion (1)(A)(III), and the Odell House is part of a group of 18 dwellings designed by Charles Wagner in Accokeek after World War II, Criterion (1)(A)(IV); and

WHEREAS, the Odell House embodies the distinctive characteristics of late Mid-Century-Modern residential design, Criterion (2)(A)(I); and

WHEREAS, the Odell House is a penultimate work of a prominent local architect who helped shape the early character of the Moyaone Reserve, Criterion (2)(A)(II), and represents many of the high artistic values of Mid-century Modernism, Criterion (2)(A) (III); and the Odell House is a notable feature on Bond's Retreat Road in the Moyaone Reserve, Criterion (2)(A)(V); and

WHEREAS, the Odell House and its 5.47920 acre Environmental Setting, shown among the County land records as Parcel 41, Bonds Retreat, was determined to meet criteria 1.A.(I, III, IV), and 2. A.(I, II, III,V) within the requirements for designation as an Historic Site in the County; and

WHEREAS, these above-stated properties are all representative examples of their types, periods of construction, and locations; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 29-120.01 of the Prince George's County Code, property owners Cristian and Elizabeth Kelly; Janine Wilson; Kayleigh Kulp; Katherine Koumoutseas; and Sara E. Lilly each filed petitions with the Historic Preservation Commission requesting designation of their respective properties as an Historic Site in Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, after proper posting and notice was given as required by law, the Prince George's County Historic Preservation Commission held public hearings on April 16, 2016, and July 19, 2016, on the subject applications; and

WHEREAS, the Historic Preservation Commission recommended that the Elmo Clark House (68-074-02) and its Environmental Setting of Lot 31, Block 8, Rhode Island Avenue Addition to Mount Rainier; the Dashiell House (68-010-91) and its Environmental Setting of Lot 36, Block 1, Holladay Company's Addition to Hyattsville; the Vernon Wright House (68-010-92) and its Environmental Setting of Lot 27, Block B, Arundel Subdivision; the Helen Dwight Reid House (80-057) and its Environmental Setting of Lot 29 and one-half of Lot 28, Block E, Fort Washington Estates; and the Odell House (83-048) and its Environmental Setting of Parcel 41, Bonds Retreat, qualify for historic site designation based on the historic site designation criteria described above; and

WHEREAS, on September 27, 2016, the Prince George's County Council, sitting as the District Council, along with the Prince George's County Planning Board of the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, conducted a joint public hearing as to the proposed designations herein to seek public comment regarding the proposed designations and significance of these properties; and

WHEREAS, the record of the hearing was left open until 5:00 p.m. on October 12, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend that Elmo Clark House (68-074-02); the Dashiell House (68-010-91); The Vernon Wright House (68-010-92); the Helen Dwight Reid House (80-057); and the Odell House (83-048) be designated as Historic Sites in Prince George's County on November 3, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Elmo Clark House (68-074-02),
