## LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Housing and Economic Development
Committee Report

Committee Vote: Favorable, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Fletcher,

Bell, MacKinnon and Wineland)

Mr. Kahle provided the committee background information on the proposal, noting that the currently active rubblefill occupies 100 acres of the 179 acre tract. Special Exception 3849 (November 1988) extended the life of the rubblefill an additional 11 years and permitted expansion onto the adjoining 79 acres, which had been used for sand and gravel mining. Inclusion of the expanded area in the Ten Year Solid Waste Management Plan would allow the property owner to seek approval of necessary State and County permits.

Lawrence Taub, attorney for the property owner, introduced Brent Dilts and John Brentlinger of Brandywine Enterprises and offered to answer

any questions. He also asked that the Council take final action on the resolution immediately following the public hearing.

Council Member Wineland expressed his opinion that the company's operations were conducted in an exemplary manner and asked that final action on this resolution occur at the time of the hearing.

This resolution will amend the FY1986-1995 Comprehensive Ten Year Solid Waste Management Plan, pursuant to the provisions of Section 9-515 of the Health Environmental Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland and COMAR Regulation 10.17.08 of the Maryland State Department of the Environment governing the planning of solid waste management facilities, to permit the expansion of the Brandywine Rubblefill.
