- In response to escalating concerns over gun violence, particularly among youth, the Prince George's County Council established the Gun Violence Study Workgroup, through CR-075-2024, later amended by CR-011-2025.
- ▶ This initiative aims to conduct a comprehensive, year-long examination of the root causes, effects, and potential solutions to firearm-related violence in the county.
- ▶ The Workgroup met regularly throughout the year, convening monthly to discuss trends, share research, and hear from subject matter experts. Meetings were structured to encourage open dialogue, data-driven analysis, and solution-oriented discussions. Over the course of the study period, the Workgroup received presentations from a range of professionals, including:
