SECTION	1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,			
Maryland, that S	ections 2-552, 2-553, 2-554, 2-555 and 2-556 of the Prince George's County

Sec. 2-552. Prin	ce George's County Animal Welfare Advisory Committee.			
The Prince	George's County Animal Welfare Advisory Committee is hereby created to			
promote and enh	ance the welfare of animals and serve as a link between the animal welfare			
community and	local government.			

1	Sec. 2-553. Powers and Duties of Committee.			
2	(a) The Committee shall have the power and duty to:			
3	(1) Serve as the central point of information for the animal welfare community			
4	regarding governmental, non-profit and private programs affecting animal welfare.			
5	(2) Advise the County Executive and County Council on issues and recommendations			
6	for animal rescue; animal fostering; control of the animal population; animal bite prevention;			
7	zoonotic disease transmission; and education the public on safely coexisting with wildlife.			
8	(3) Advise the County Executive and County Council on best practices for animal			
9	shelters and for recruiting volunteers for the County animal shelter.			
10	(4) Advise the County Executive and County Council regarding the effect of animal			
11	welfare operations on existing laws, policies, rules and regulations aimed at improving the			
12	treatment and care of animals.			
13	(5) Advise the County Executive and County Council regarding the effect of animal			
14	welfare operations on potential laws, policies, rules and regulations aimed at improving the			
15	treatment and care of animals.			
16	(6) Work to establish better communication and understanding between the animal			
17	welfare community, the County government and the community at large.			
18	(7) Advise the County government on the implementation of state and local			
19	initiatives pertaining to, but not limited to, sheltering, keeping, adoption, fostering, rescue,			
20	volunteerism, partnership, nonprofits, and charitable giving.			
21	(8) Promote public awareness and education regarding responsible pet ownership and			
22	animal welfare issues.			
23	(9) Collaborate with local organizations and stakeholders to enhance animal welfare			
24	programs.			
25	(10) Report annually to the County Executive and County Council on the status of			
26	animal welfare in the County.			
27	Sec. 2-554. Committee Composition; Term; Officers.			
28	(a) The Committee shall be composed of nine members (9) nominated by the County			
29	Executive and confirmed by the County Council. The nine members shall represent each of the			
30	<u>following:</u>			
31	(1) One member serving as a volunteer from the Prince George's County Animal			

1	Services Facility and Adoption Center;		
2	(2) One member being a licensed veterinarian with pet and wildlife experience;		
3	(3) One member of the Prince George's County Society of the Prevention of Cruelty		
4	Against Animals (SPCA);		
5	(4) One member from a non-profit providing animal fostering services in the		
6	County;		
7	(5) One member representing an organization providing services for feral cats;		
8	(6) One member of an animal rescue organization working within the County;		
9	(7) One member representing the recruiting, training and retaining of volunteers;		
10	(8) One member experienced in animal or pet behavior; and		
11	(9) One public member who lives or works in the County.		
12	(b) The term of office for each member shall be three years; however, the terms of the		
13	initial appointments shall be staggered with three members appointed to three-year terms, three		
14	members appointed to two-year terms, and three members appointed to one-year terms.		
15	(c) After an appointment to fill a vacancy before a term expires, the successor serves the		
16	rest of the unexpired term.		
17	(d) The Committee members must elect annually a Chair and Vice Chair from among its		
18	voting members. Staff support shall be provided by the County Council.		
19	Sec. 2-555. Meetings.		
20	The Committee shall meet in public session on call of the Chair. The Committee must meet		
21	as often as necessary to perform and exercise its duties, but not less than 6 times each year. The		
22	public meetings may be held in person or virtually.		
23	Sec. 2-556. Committee's Advice and Annual Report.		
24	The Committee shall advise the County Executive and County Council on issues of interest		
25	to the animal welfare populace, both on the Committee's own initiative and upon the request of		
26	either branch of County government. Further, by July 1 each year, the Committee must submit to		
27	the County Executive and the County Council an annual report on its functions, activities,		
28	accomplishments, plans and objectives. The report should also include any recommendations of		
29	requests it deems appropriate to further the public purpose of the Committee.		
30	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby		
31	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph		

1	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of the	nis Act	is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of				
2	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining						
3	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this						
4	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such						
5	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,						
6	or section.						
7	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)						
8	calendar days after it becomes law.
