RESOLUTION

1 A RESOLUTION concerning

2 The Local Impact Grant Funds Multiyear Plan

3 For the purpose of transmitting the Local Impact Grant Funds Multiyear Plan to the County
 4 Council for review and approval.

5 WHEREAS, pursuant to CB-88-2015, the County Council shall approve the Local Impact
 6 Grant Funds Multiyear Plan by resolution; and

7 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Annotated Code of Maryland, State Government Article,
 8 Section 9-1A-31, Prince George's County shall develop, in consultation with the local
 9 development council, a multiyear plan for the expenditure of the local impact grant funds for
 10 services and improvements; and

11 WHEREAS, pursuant to CB-88-2015, prior to submitting the multiyear plan to the local
 12 development council for review and comment, the County Executive shall transmit the multiyear
 13 plan to the County Council for review and comment; and

14 WHEREAS, the County Council shall have thirty (30) days to review, comment, and make
 15 recommendations on the multiyear plan prior to submitting the multiyear plan to the local
 16 development council; and

17 WHEREAS, the County Council reviewed, commented, and made recommendations on the
 18 multiyear plan on November 18, 2025; and

19 WHEREAS, the local development council reviewed, commented, and made
 20 recommendations on the multiyear plan on or around February 11, 2026, pursuant to Annotated
 21 Code of Maryland, State Government Article, Section 9-1A-31; and

1 WHEREAS, the Local Impact Grants Multiyear Spending Plan for FY 2026 – FY 2028 is
2 outlined in Attachment A, and is made a part hereof; and

3 WHEREAS, subsequent to the local development council’s review, comment and
4 recommendations on the multiyear plan, the County Executive shall transmit the multiyear plan
5 to the County Council for review and approval by resolution.

6 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's
7 County, Maryland, that the Local Impact Grant Funds Multiyear Plan FY 2026 – FY 2028, is
8 hereby APPROVED.

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the plan as described in “Attachment A” is hereby
10 APPROVED, pursuant to the Prince George’s County Code Section 10-309.02.

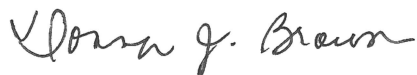
11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect upon the date of the
