ZONING BILL

AN ORDINANCE concerning

Structures maintained by Homes Associations on Private Property For the purpose of requiring a special exception for the development of any property on which a Homes Association has maintained a structure.

BY adding:

Section 27-328.03, The Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland, being also SUBTITLE 27. ZONING. The Prince George's County Code (1995 Edition). SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,

Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 27-328.03 of the Zoning Ordinance of Prince George's County, Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, be and the same is hereby added:

SUBTITLE 27. ZONING. PART 4. SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS. DIVISION 2. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.

Sec. 27-328.03. Private property on which a Homes Association has maintained a <u>structure.</u>

All uses of land not owned by a Homes Association, but upon which there is a structure, with a replacement value of at least \$250,000 (Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars), which has been maintained by a Homes Association for a minimum of 10 years, shall require the approval of a Special Exception.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Ordinance shall take effect fortyfive (45) calendar days after its adoption.
