Dear Secretary Grumbles:

Prince George's County is pleased to submit its Financial Assurance Plan (FAP) covering fiscal years FY 2021 and 2022 as required by Senate Bill 863 (2015) and as adopted by Council Resolution 045-2021.

The County continues to implement its FAP to meet its impervious surface restoration requirements using two programs: 1) the Clean Water Partnership with Corvias Solutions, Inc.; and 2) Prince George's County's Department of the Environment Capital Improvement Program.

Senate Bill 863 required the County to demonstrate that it has the funds to meet 100% of the projected costs of impervious surface restoration for the next two fiscal years (fiscal years 2021 and 2022). Over the next two years, the County estimates that it will treat 2,599 impervious acres at a total implementation cost of around \$148M, a number that is based on preliminary design and engineering estimates. The County's Financial Assurance Plan meets the State's requirements.
