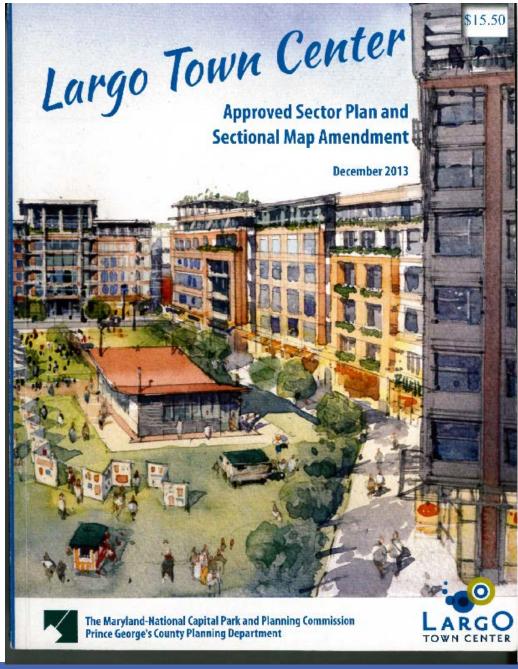

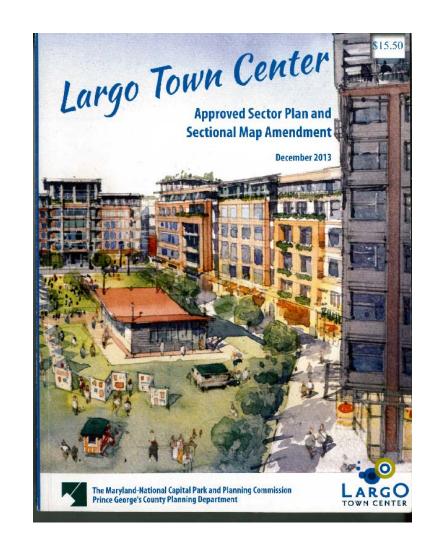

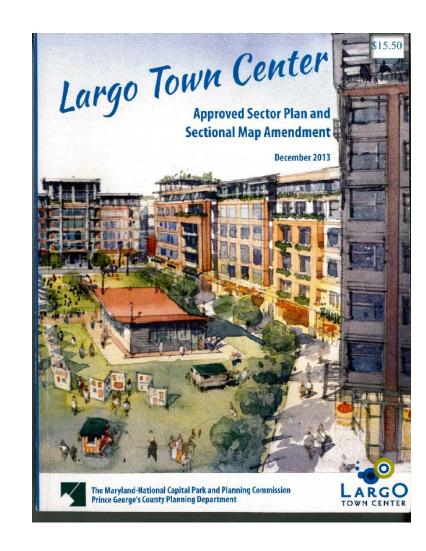
- ☐ Approved in December 2013
- ☐ Sets the vision for transit-oriented development (TOD)
- ☐ Envisions area as Prince George's County's premiere mixeduse "downtown"
- ☐ Anchored by a major institutional use A Regional Medical Center
- Encourages environmentally sensitive and security conscious design practices
- ☐ Applies Development District Overlay Zone (DDOZ) that sets development standards





Prior Minor Amendments:

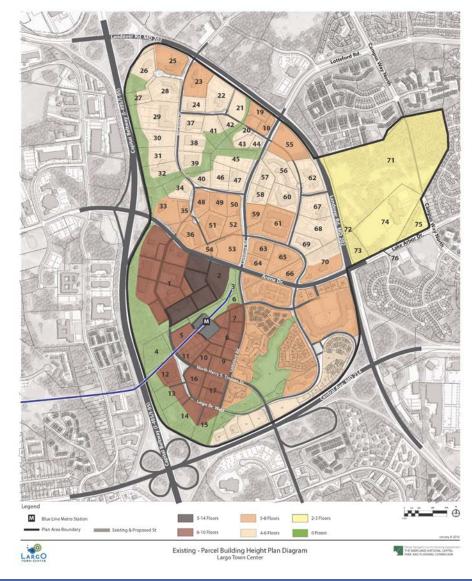
- ☐ CR-046-2016 approved amendments to the Largo Town Center Sector Plan and SMA to:
 - Clarify discrepancy between the plan text and a map containing minimum building height standards
 - Delete inconsistent nonconforming use provision
 - Clarify and refine standards for free-standing and monumental signs

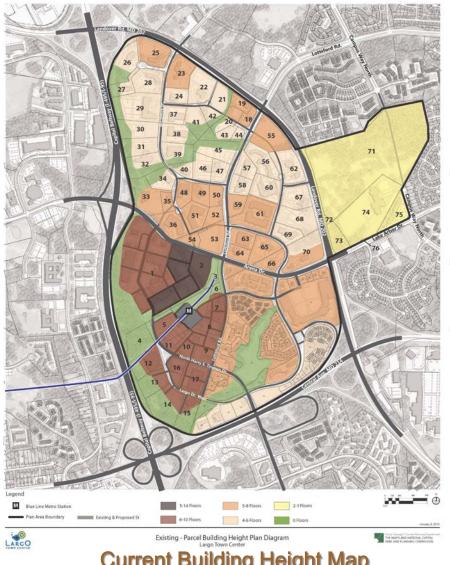




Proposed Amendment:

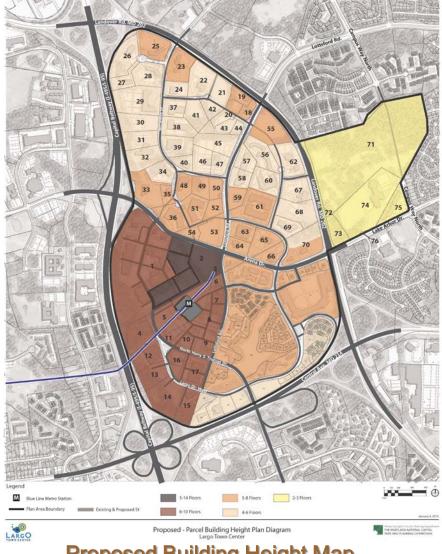
- □ Satisfies all the requirements for minor amendment per Section 27-242 of the Zoning Ordinance
- ☐ CR-094-2016 approves the initiation of a minor amendment to the development district standards regulating building height
- □ Replace 0-Floors building height restriction with the height provision of abutting properties
 - Update maps and modify tables as appropriate to reflect changes if approved
- ☐ The 0-Floors (a non build) standard applied to properties containing important environmental features, but portions included developable land





Implications:

- Removes vagueness and ambiguity of the area of developable land affected
- No impact on environmental preservation
- Allows development process to identify and establish the required environmental envelope through the Natural Resources Inventory (NRI) and other appropriate processes
