BILL

AN ACT concerning

Board of Appeals

FOR the purpose of clarifying the times in which the Board of Appeals must meet, deleting the requirement that meetings be recorded by a reporter, and providing a cross-reference to Subtitle 4. Stormwater Management.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION.

Sections 2-117(b),
2-120, and
2-123,

The Prince George's County Code
(1987 Edition, 1990 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Sections 2-117(b), 2-120, and 2-123

of the Prince George's County Code be and the same are hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

SUBTITLE 2. ADMINISTRATION.

DIVISION 4. BOARD OF APPEALS.

Sec. 2-117. Board of Administrative Appeals.

(b) County law which specifically grants the Board authority to hear appeals includes (but need not be limited to) the following:

SUBTITLE 3. ANIMALS.

DIVISION 2. LICENSES AND STANDARDS.

(ANIMAL HOLDING FACILITY LICENSES).

SUBTITLE 4. BUILDING.

DIVISION 1. BUILDING CODE.

DIVISION 2. CONSTRUCTION OR CHANGES IN FLOODPLAIN AREA.

DIVISION 3. GRADING, DRAINAGE AND EROSION CONTROL.

DIVISION 4. STORMWATER MANAGEMENT.

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Sec. 2-120. Meetings.

The Board of Appeals shall meet [at least twice monthly and such additional] at such times as necessary. The Chairman shall determine the time and place of all meetings.

Sec. 2-123. Records of hearings.

Adequate records shall be maintained of all hearings before the Board of Appeals. [In cases for which the attorney for the Board of

Appeals determines a transcript may be required,] All hearings shall be recorded [by a reporter].

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
