LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The Committee considered a Proposed Draft 2 of CB-99-1990. This draft defines "fast food restaurant temporary signs", and exempts these signs from the requirement for a sign permit when certain standards are met. The standards that must be met are: a maximum of one sign per each street frontage is permitted, and the signs shall be removed as soon as torn or damaged, and not later than sixty days after erection.

The City of Bowie, Crestview Area Citizens' Association, and M-NCPPC

oppose the legislation.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

Fast food restaurants are currently not permitted to display outdoor temporary advertising signs. This legislation exempts these signs from all provisions of the sign regulations in the Zoning Ordinance.
