(a) The towing compa	any shall cause to be presented to the property owner or property
owner's agent a tow slip, ap	proved by the Chief of Police as to form and content, which shall
consist of one (1) original an	d three (3) copies. The towing company shall cause said tow slip to
be completed by filling in al	l pertinent data. Before towing or removing the subject vehicle, the
towing company shall cause	the property owner or property owner's agent to sign said tow slip in

the place provided. The towing company shall then cause a copy of the towing slip to be securely affixed to the subject vehicle.

- (b) The tow slip shall provide, as a minimum, spaces for filling in pertinent data as make and model of the vehicle, vehicle identification number, date and time of towing, license plate number, location towed from, name of complaining party, and name of towing company.
- (c) If the property owner has a written contract with the towing company, the property owner or property owner's agent shall not be required to either sign a complaint or tow slip prior to the towing or removal of an unauthorized vehicle from his property in the following instances:
 - (1) If the towing occurs during the hours of 10:00 P.M. and 7:00 A.M.; or
- (2) If the vehicle is directly blocking a clearly marked fire lane, a handicapped parking space or access to the property or a building on the property.

1 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) 2 calendar days after it becomes law. Adopted this 19th day of November, 2001.
