Ms. Na'ilah J. Dawkins, a resident of Upper Marlboro, has over a decade experience in the human services field and is currently employed with the State of Maryland, Department of Human Services as a Family Services Caseworker II. She is on the Executive Committee of the Prince George's County Sierra Club and is the Conservation Chair.
