with the requirem	ents of Section 27-125.01 of the Zoning Ordinance to all adjoining property
owners, including	g owners whose properties lie directly across a street, alley, or stream and to

prior parties of record to any of the following	application types: Zoning Map Amendment,		
Special Exception, Conceptual Site Plan, Det	ailed Site Plan, Comprehensive Design Plan,		
Specific Design Plan, Comprehensive Sketch Plan, Final Development Plan, or Preliminary Plan			
of Subdivision. Notice to prior parties of reco	ord shall be required if the applicable case was		
approved within ten (10) years of the filing of	f the preliminary plan of subdivision. This notice		
shall inform the person of record in the previous	ous application(s) of the procedure for becoming a		
person of record in the pending application as	nd the necessity for becoming a person of record in		
the pending application in order to maintain s	standing to participate. The failure of the previous		
person of record to receive notice shall not in	validate the approval of the preliminary plan of		
subdivision. At the same time and in the same	ne manner, the applicant shall send an informational		
mailing to every municipality located within one mile of the applicant's property and to all civic			
associations registered with the Commission for the area which includes the property.			
SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER EN	ACTED that this Act shall take effect thirty (30)		
calendar days after it becomes law.
