The Office of Management and Budget stated that the cost of incarceration is defined as the per diem reimbursement rate paid by the State of Maryland. The current rate is \$44. This would make the maximum annual cost reimbursement to the County approximately \$54,000. However, persons whose household income falls below the median household income for Prince George's County would only pay a proportioned share of the costs of incarceration. If, for example, we assume that the average household income of a weekend inmate is 70 percent of the County's median household income, the potential cost reimbursement to the County would decrease from \$54,900 to \$38,400. Persons sentenced under the Home Detention Program must pay a fee equal to one hour of their wages for each day they are in the program. Based on estimation by the Department of Corrections of a \$5 per hour average wage and 40 persons per day in the program, the County would expect an annual cost reimbursement of \$73,000 from this program.

Amendments were:

- (1) On page 2, line 18 after "less" add in any seven (7) day period
- (2) On page 2, line 18 delete (per week)

This legislation should therefore provide slightly more than \$100,000 in badly needed revenue for the County. With an implementation date after the first of the calendar year, FY92 revenues will be approximately \$50,000.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

The proposed legislation would require persons sentenced to be incarcerated for forty-eight hours or less per week to pay all or a portion of the cost of incarceration, depending upon the level of their household income. The legislation would also require any person confined in the Home Detention Program to pay a fee equal to the gross wage earned for one hour of employment for each day that person is confined in the Home Detention Program.
