BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

(Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

Mobile vendors are currently permitted to sell certain goods in the right-of-way of public roads, provided the vehicle from which the goods are sold is not within 100 yards of an intersection or access to a school or shopping center. This legislation makes a distinction between "gateway roads" and all other roads in the County. "Gateway roads" are arterial roads which carry high volumes of traffic at high speeds, and are gateways into the County centers of business and governmental activities. Sale of goods in the rights-of-way of "gateway roads" will be prohibited. "Gateway roads" are designated as such by resolution of the County Council.
