BILL

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Local Impact Grant Funding for Oxon Hill, Friendly and Potomac High Schools

3 For the purpose of requiring annual allocation of certain funds to support defense, cybersecurity,
4 health, legal, enforcement, music and arts education programs at Oxon Hill High School,
5 Friendly High School and Potomac High School.

6 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

7 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

8 Section 10-309.01,

9 The Prince George's County Code

10 (2015 Edition; 2018 Supplement).

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
12 Maryland, that Section 10-309.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
13 repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

14 SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

15 DIVISION 22. VIDEO LOTTERY FACILITY LOCAL BUSINESS, HIRING, AND
16 FUNDING REQUIREMENTS.

19 (c) Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, in consultation with the local development council, the
20 County shall annually allocate at least 25% of the Local Impact Grant, excluding funds reserved
21 by state law for Maryland Highway 210, up to an amount not to exceed \$2,200,000 (adjusted

1 annually for inflation), for vocational, technical and skilled trades programs at Crossland High
2 School to prepare county residents for successful careers in industry areas including but not
3 limited to construction, technology, and human services. Beginning in Fiscal Year 2020, the
4 allocation of at least 25% of the Local Impact Grant shall be distributed at Crossland High
5 School and include defense programs at Oxon Hill High School; cybersecurity and health
6 programs at Friendly High School; legal and enforcement programs at Potomac High School, as
7 well as programs involving music and arts education at all four high schools.

8 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the Chief Administrative Officer or other
9 designee of the County Executive shall provide an annual report to the County Council and
10 County Executive that details the activities, budget, and expenditures distributed to Crossland,
11 Oxon Hill, Friendly and Potomac High Schools in accordance with this Act on or before
12 December 31st of each year.

13 SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby
14 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,
15 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of
16 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining
17 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this
18 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such
19 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
20 or section.

21 SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)
22 calendar days after it becomes law.
