Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 33 (DR-3). Council Bill 33 was introduced by Council Members Dernoga and Dean on 7/23/2008 and was favorably reported out of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development (PZED) on 6/18/2008 with amendments. Michael S. Nagy, Esq., spoke on behalf of numerous rural tier property owners. All persons wishing to speak having done so, the public hearing was declared held. Council Member Dernoga moved amendment number 1; seconded by Council Member Exum. The motion carried by voice vote. Council Member Dernoga moved enactment of Council Bill 33 (DR-4) as amended; seconded by Council Member Olson. The motion carried 9-0.

<u>CB-44-2008 – AN ACT CONCERNING ELECTRICAL CODE</u> for the purpose of amending the Electrical Code to remove provisions requiring the color coding of the armor or metal shell of type AC, HFC and MC electrical cables when installed in buildings of Type I and II construction. - *PUBLIC HEARING HELD; ENACTED* 

Pursuant to proper notice, the public hearing convened on Council Bill 44. Council Bill 44 was introduced by Council Members Dean and Dernoga on 7/15/2008 and was favorably reported out of Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee on 7/10/2008. Ken Moore, Bill Murphy, David Huska, Bruce Johnston and Barry Blumberg spoke in support of Council Bill 44. Council Member Bland moved enactment of Council Bill 44; seconded by Council Member Olson. The motion carried 9-0.
