RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

U.S. Foreign-Trade Zone No. 63

For the purpose of approving application to the U.S. Foreign-Trade Zones Board for reorganization of U.S. Foreign-Trade Zone No. 63 and delegating the County's administrative role and functions to the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation.

WHEREAS, by an Act of Congress approved June 18, 1934, an Act "To provide for the establishment, operation, and maintenance of foreign-trade zones in ports of entry of the United States, to expedite and encourage foreign commerce, and for other purposes," as amended (19 U.S.C. 81a-81u) (the Act), the Foreign-Trade Zones Board (the Board) is authorized and empowered to grant to corporations the privilege of establishing, operating, and maintaining foreign-trade zones ("FTZ") in or adjacent to ports of entry under the jurisdiction of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Section 5-802(a) of the Economic Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, provides for the establishment of Foreign-Trade Zones in the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, Prince George's County, Maryland made application (filed May 27, 1980) in due and proper form requesting the establishment, operation and maintenance of a foreign-trade zone in Prince George's County; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Foreign-Trade Zones Board issued Board Order No. 167, published October 29, 1980 approving said application and making Prince George's County Grantee of U.S. Foreign-Trade Zone No. 63; and

WHEREAS, exports from U.S. Foreign-Trade Zones have doubled since 2009, jumping to a record \$69.9 billion in 2012; and

WHEREAS, over 370,000 persons are employed in Foreign Trade Zones by over 3,200 participating firms in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Foreign-Trade Zones are thus demonstrated to be a viable tool for economic development; and

WHEREAS, use of the Foreign-Trade Zone within Prince George's County will likewise expand and upgrade local job opportunities, provide for the continued expansion and growth of existing local industry, increase revenues to the County, and act as a catalyst in attracting and meeting the needs of prospective new industries and firms; and

WHEREAS, Foreign-Trade Zone No. 63 was established with the aim to attract private investment and encourage those types of development deemed most desirable for the County to improve its economy; and

WHEREAS, a new administration option, the Alternative Site Framework, is now available which makes it faster and simpler to join the program; and

WHEREAS, availability of the Alternative Site Framework in Prince George's County will provide an attractive investment climate to the growing number of international firms planning production and distribution facilities in the United States; and

WHEREAS, availability of the Alternative Site Framework in Prince George's County will enhance the County's efforts to induce manufacturing and distribution companies involving international trade to locate within the County and to retain existing businesses; and

WHEREAS, use of the Foreign-Trade Zones program by current and prospective firms would match the economic development goals of the County Council; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to delegate the County's administrative role and functions under its Grant of Authority to the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation (EDC) for the administration of the FTZ, including authorizing the EDC to sign and submit future requests related to the zone to the FTZ Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland that it hereby endorses and supports application for reorganization of U.S. Foreign-Trade Zone No. 63 under the Alternative Site Framework.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council hereby designates the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation as the County's agent in the execution of the County's responsibilities under the County's Grant of Authority for Foreign-Trade Zone No.

63 and authorizes the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation to execute documents, agreements, and applications, recover fees, and take any other action necessary to carry out the promotion and administration of U.S. Foreign-Trade Zone No. 63.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Economic Development Corporation shall report to the Council or County Executive, upon request, concerning the progress of the FTZ.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Executive or the County Executive's designee is hereby authorized to execute documents and take any action necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution.
